








A newly revised freshman Anthropology class was introduced by the Social Studies Department this year. The class depended less on textbooks, and enabled more direct class participation. The course encompassed all facets of civilization, man's behavior and culture. A window to the culture of a country is its tongue. 





A demonstrative gas laser was an important addition to the Science Department's facilities. It was used in the teaching and understanding of the principles of light behavior. The science curriculum has provided maximum tailoring to the needs and abilities of the individual student. Courses ranged in difficulty from Introductory Physical Science, new this year, to college level chemistry. Several students also profited from an advanced seminar program of independent research.



Computer programming innovated


Classes on all levels of mathematics, Refresher Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, and College Calculus, profited from an increased use of overhead projectors and supplementary textbooks. An annual highlight in the Math Department is the National Math Contest, sponsored by the Mathematical Association of America, which tests skills and ingenuity in problem solving. In a new seminar course, interested students pursued independent study of the computer language, Fortran. Then, they tested their knowledge of programming and problem solving on an advanced design computer terminal, newly-installed at Niles West.




















The growth of the Industrial Arts Department continued this year with the addition of a plastic molding machine, and new textbook series in Metals and Auto Mechanics. With an increased emphasis on plastics and woods, students were kept abreast of new industrial trends. A unique program was the mock-factory, where products were manufactured from raw material to completion. In the diverse program, which also includes Woods, Industrial Drawing, and Electronics, students utilized their class experience to develop both vocational and avocational skills.












Russian, French cultures explored in language clubs
















































