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## AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARADES AND PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Village of Skokie provide for the safe and orderly movement of traffic and people so as to protect the residents of the Village of Skokie from disruption of essential services, such as fire protection, program participation, and the orderly pursuit activities. of their

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees are of the opinion that the following regulations are necessary to provide for such purposes in order to promote the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Skokie:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Skokie, Cook County, Illinois:

Section 1: That Chapter 27 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Skokie be amended by the addition thereto of Article XIII Parades and Public Assemblies, as follows:

Article XIII. PARADES AND PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES

Sec. 27-50. Title. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Parade and Public Assemblies Ordinance of the Village of Skokie."

Section 27-51. Permit Required. No parade, public assembly or similar activity, where the number of participants expected may reasonably be assumed to exceed fifty (50) or more persons, and/or vehicles is permitted on any street or area of the Village unless a permit allowing such activity has been obtained from the Village Manager, or upon referral, to the President and Board of Trustees; provided, however, that this Ordinance shall not apply to students going to and from school classes, or participating in educational activities under the immediate direction and supervision of school authorities or a governmental agency acting within the scope of its functions, nor shall a permit be required for normal or scheduled activities of the Village.

Sec. 27-52. Application. Any person, partnership, voluntary association, corporation or other organization seeking to obtain a parade or public assembly permit shall file an application with the Village Manager not more than ninety (90) days and not less than thirty days (30) before the date for which the parade, public assembly or similar activity is proposed.

Sec. 27-53. Contents. The application for a parade or public assembly permit shall contain the following information:

- The name, address and phone number of the person signing the application.
- b) If the parade, public assembly, or similar activity is proposed to be conducted for, on behalf of, or by an organization, the name, address, and phone number of the authorized and responsible leaders of the organization conducting the parade or public assembly, and the name, address and telephone number of the headquarters of the organization.
- c) The date of the proposed parade or public assembly and the hours that it will commence and terminate.
- d) The location of the assembly area and the time when the activity will begin to assemble.
- e) The route to be travelled, starting point and the termination point.
- f) The approximate number of persons, animals and vehicles to participate in the parade, public assembly, or similar activity.
- g) A statement as to whether the parade or public assembly will occupy all or only a portion of the width of the streets proposed to be traversed.
- h) The interval of space to be maintained between units of such parade, public assembly or similar activity.
- i) If the parade, public assembly or similar activity is designed to be held by and on behalf of, or for any person, partnership, voluntary association, corporation or other organization other than the applicant, the applicant for such permit shall file with the Yillage of Skokie a communication in writing from such person or from an authorized and responsible leader of such organization authorizing the applicant to apply for the permit on behalf of such person or organization.
- j) Any additional information which the Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees shall find reasonably necessary to a fair determination as to whether a permit should be issued.

Sec. 27-54. Insurance Required. No permit shall be issued to any applicant until such applicant procures Public Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) and Property Damage Insurance of not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Prior to the issuance of the permit, certificates of such insurance must be submitted to the Village Manager for verification that the company issuing such insurance is authorized to do business and write policies of insurance in the

Sec. 27-55. Late Applicants. The Village Manager or President
and Board of Trustees, when good and compelling cause is shown
therefor, may consider an application hereunder which is filed less than
thirty (30) days before the date such parade, public assembly or
similar activity is proposed to be conducted.

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42 43 Sec. 27-56. Standards for Issuance. The Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees shall issue a permit as provided for hereunder when, from a consideration of the application and from such other information as may otherwise be obtained, it is found that:

- a) The conduct of the parade will not substantially interfere with the safe and orderly movement of traffic in the area contiguous to the route.
- b) The activity will not create an imminent danger of a substantial breach of the peace, riot, or similar disorder.
- c) The conduct of the parade, public assembly, or similar activity will not portray criminality, depravity or lack of virtue in, or incite violence, hatred, abuse or hostility toward a person or group of persons by reason of reference to religious, racial, ethnic, national or regional affiliation.
- d) There are available at the time of the parade, public assembly, or similar activity a sufficient number of peace officers to police and protect lawful participants in the activity and maintain adequate police protection in the rest of the Village of Skokie.
- e) The concentration of persons, animals and vehicles at the assembly points of the parade, public assembly, or similar activity will not unduly interfere with the proper fire and police protection of, or ambulance service to areas contiguous to such assembly areas.
- f) The activity will not interfere with scheduled Village functions or the normal pursuit of activities of the residents of the Village of Skokie.
- g) The conduct of such parade, public assembly, or similar activity will not interfere with the movement of fire fighting equipment enroute to a fire.
- h) The parade is scheduled to move from its point or origin to its point of termination expeditiously and without unreasonable delays enroute.
- i) The parade, public assembly, or similar activity is not being conducted for an unlawful purpose or for the sole purpose of advertising any product, goods or event and is not designed to be held purely for private profit.

j) The applicant has complied fully with the insurance requirements set out in Section 5 of this Ordinance.

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Sec. 27-57. Time for Approval or Denial. Following the receipt of an application or re-application, the Village Manager shall either within ten (10) working days, either issue such permit or deny same. In the event the Village Manager denies the application or reapplication, the matter shall be referred to the President and Board of Trustees at a meeting scheduled not more than twenty-one (21) days after the denial of the permit application or at any special meeting of the President and Board of Trustees called for such purpose not more than twenty-one (21) days after the filing of the permit application. In the event the President and Board of Trustees concurs in the Village Manager's denial, the reasons therefor shall be stated and published in the minutes, and the Village Manager shall mail to the applicant within twenty-three (23) days after the date upon which the denial was made a notice of the action of the President and Board of Trustees stating the reasons for the denial of the permit. The action of the President and Board of Trustees shall be subject to judicial review in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Review Act, Sections 264 and subsequent sections of Chapter 110 of the Illinois Revised Statutes of 1975.

Sec. 27-58. Alternative Permit. The Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees in denying a permit application shall be empowered to authorize the conduct of a parade, public assembly, or similar activity on a date, at a time, at a location or over a route different from that named by the applicant. An applicant desiring to accept an alternate permit shall within two (2) days after notice of the action by the Village Manager and Board of Trustees file a written notice of acceptance with the Village Manager. An alternate permit shall conform to the requirements of and shall have the effect of a parade or public assembly permit.

Sec. 27-59. Notice to Officials. Immediately upon the issuance of a parade or public assembly permit, the Village Manager shall send a copy thereof to the following:

- a) The Police Chief of the Village of Skokie.
- b) The Fire Chief of the Village of Skokie.
- c) The Corporation Counsel of the Village of Skokie.

Sec. 27-60. Contents of Permit. Each parade or public assembly permit shall state the following information:

a) Starting time.

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- b) Minimum speed.
- c) Maximum speed.
- d) Maximum interval of space to be maintained between the units of the parade or public assembly.
- e) The portions of the streets to be traversed that may be occupied by the parade or public assembly.
- f) The maximum length of the parade or public assembly in miles or fractions thereof.
- g) Such other information as the Village Manager and Board of Trustees shall find necessary to insure the enforce ment of this Ordinance.

Sec. 27-61. Duties of Permittee. A permittee hereunder shall comply with all permit directions and conditions and with all applicable laws and ordinances. One of the authorized and responsible leaders of the organization conducting the parade, public assembly, or similar activity, shall carry the parade or public assembly permit upon his person during the conduct of the parade.

Sec. 27-62. Public Conduct During Parades, Public Assemblies or Similar Activities:

- a) Interference. No person shall unreasonably hamper, obstruct, impede or interfere with any parade, public assembly or similar activity, or with any person, vehicle or animal participating or used in such activity.
- b) Driving Through Parades, Public Assemblies, or Similar Activities. No driver of any vehicle shall drive between the vehicles or persons comprising a parade, public assembly, or similar activity when such vehicles or persons are in motion and are conspicuously designated as a parade,

public assembly, or similar activity; provided, however, that Fire and Police vehicles and ambulances may interrupt a parade, public assembly, or similar activity in an emergency situation.

c) Parking on Parade or Public Assembly Route. The Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees shall have the authority to prohibit or restrict the parking of yehicles along a highway or part thereof constituting a part of the route of a parade, public assembly, or similar activity. The Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees shall order the posting of signs to such effect and it shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave unattended any vehicle in violation thereof. No person shall be liable for parking on a street unposted in violation of this Ordinance.

Sec. 27-63. Revocation of Permit. The Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees shall have the authority to revoke a parade or public assembly permit issued hereunder if, at any time, facts are brought to the attention of the Village Manager or President and Board of Trustees which show that the parade, public assembly, or similar activity does not, or will not, comply with the standards for issuance as herein set forth.

Sec. 27-64. Waiver of Provisions. The President and Board of Trustees may, with the consent of all members of the Board present at any meeting thereof, waive any provision of this ordinance.

Sec. 27-65. Penalties. Any person who knowingly interferes with any person or organization lawfully conducting a parade or public assembly, or any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

Sec. 27-66. Separability. If any provision contained in this Ordinance is found to be invalid, such provision shall be deemed to be separable and shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

Sec. 27-67. Ordinance Repealed. All ordinances or provisions of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any of the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent that they conflict with this Ordinance or any provision of this Ordinance.
