

Glenn A. Arndt

Born October 30, 1922. Nilehi graduate, 1940. Entered Army Air Force, 1942; became bom-bardier. Killed at Lille, France, on April 29, 1944.

Richard J. Barber

Born December 16, 1925. En-Born December 10, 1925. Entered Nilehi, 1941; joined Army Air Corps in 1944; became radio mechanic. Killed as plane crashed into his barracks at Sioux Falls, South Dakota, December 8, 1944.

John L. Birong

Born July 19, 1922. Nilehi graduate, 1940. Entered Navy Air Corps, 1943. Killed when bomber crashed with him and three other fliers at Lake City, Florida, December 8, 1944.

Nicholas Glod

Born May 10, 1919. Attended Niles. Served country as Army Air Force test pilot in North Africa and Italy, Killed in air-craft collision over Italy. craft collision over Italy, May 30, 1944.

Darrell F. Hoffman

Born October 24, 1924, Nilehi graduate, 1943. Entered Army Air Corps, 1943; became bom-bardier and navigator. Killed in bomb load explosion over Formosa, May 18, 1945.

Walter C. Lauth

Born December 18, 1921. Nilehi graduate, 1940. Entered Army Infantry service, 1942; later commissioned at Officers Candidate School, Fort Ben-ning. Killed in action at Luzon, February 28, 1945.

Walter B. Rau

Born March 21, 1921. Nilehi graduate, 1938. Entered Army Air Force; became bombardier. Killed in crash on take-off in Italy, August 15, 1944.

Richard C. Wasley

Born October 3, 1923. Nilehi graduate, 1941. Entered Marine Corps, 1942; became fighter pilot. Killed on mission off Okinawa, March 24, 1945.

































Eugene Bailey

Born February 11, 1926. Entered Nilehi, 1941; left in 1944 to join Army Air Corps; became tail gunner. Killed over Japan August 27, 1945.

Ralph M. Becker

Born August 10, 1922. Nilehi graduate, 1940. Entered Army Air Corps, 1942: became pilot. Killed dropping supplies over Rhine, March 24, 1945.

Glenn Brock

Born July 25, 1924. Enrolled Nilehi, 1940; joined Army Air Corps, 1943; became electrician. Died of scarlet fever at Fort George Wright, Washington, December 14, 1943.

John P. Hegarty

Born June 22, 1921. Nilehi graduate, 1940. Entered Army Infantry service, 1940. Killed by machine gun fire in Luzon, Philippine Islands, March 18,

Epke Taylor Ives

Born March 13, 1920. Nilehi graduate, 1938. Entered Army Air Corps, 1941; became pilot and flight officer. Killed over Luzon, January 27, 1945.

Elmer J. Mueller

Born March 16, 1920. Entered Nilehi, 1937; went into United States Cavalry, 1942. Killed in crash of vehicle he was driving, January 20, 1943.

Alvin J. Ruesch

Born October 3, 1921. Nilehi graduate, 1939. Entered Army Infantry service, 1942. Killed while engaged in street fighting in Germany, April 17, 1945.

Norman J. Weis

Born March 16, 1919. Nilehi graduate, 1937. Entered Army Air Corps, 1942; became drop-master. Killed over Bastogne, Belgium, December 23, 1944.


We do this on behalf of the 1946 graduating class, the general student body, and the faculty. Thanks for all you have done to make Nilehi a school to which we are proud to belong.







September 25, 1945, marks the day of Jerry Whalen's sudden death. Jerry had an exceptional personality. His smiling face and merry eyes will long be remembered.


"Tiger," as he was called by his classmates, was a typical American boy who liked sports. He was a member of the Junior class and of the Junior Varsity football team at the time of his death.







We can feel sure in saying that the 1945-46 team was the beginning of a new and better era for Nilehi swimming teams.




