


During the many years Miss Harbert taught at Nilehi, she was loved and admired by both students and fellow teachers.

As the school year was drawing to a close, Prom time neared, and we were able to enjoy "the perfect dance" we'd been planning for so long.






IN MEMORIAM ARLENE MERZ






SOPHOMORE CABINET









Wednesday, November 25 — At the opening basketball game against Leyden, we all went wild. "Go you, Nilehi. Fight! Fight!"


Friday, November 27 — What's there to say about Thanksgiving Vacation except . . . Ooh, those turkeys!



Tuesday, April 20 — Life has dealt another cruel blow! We returned to school today.






