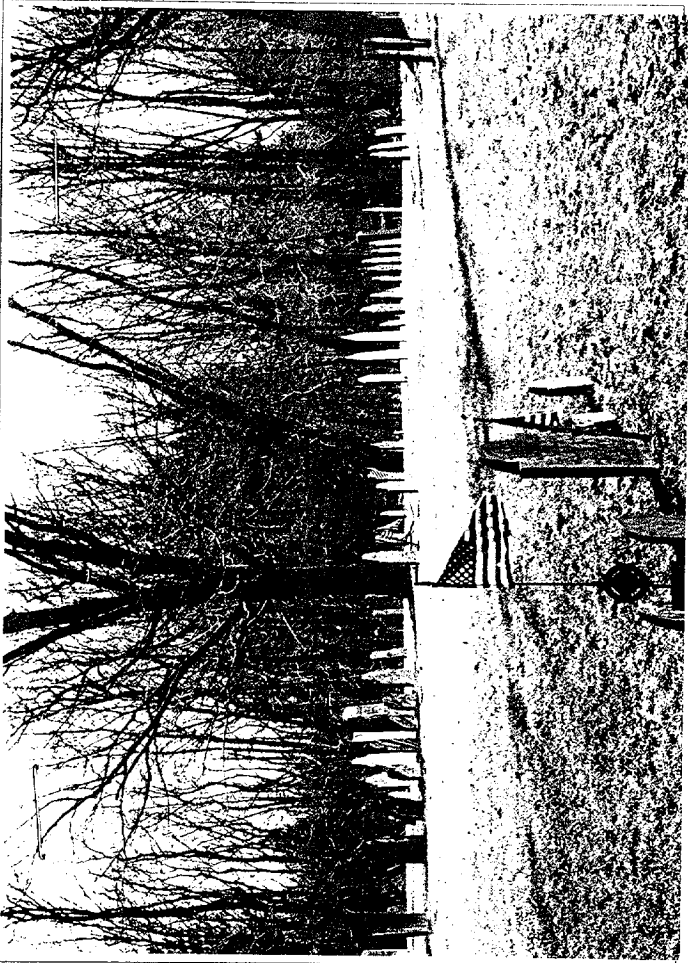

First Parish Cemetery is located at the southwest corner of the intersection at Dexter Lane and New Bedford Road in Rochester Center. The cemetery is set back slightly from Dexter Lane and New Bedford Road and occupies approximately 8 acres just southeast of the Town Green (MHC 815). The east side of the grounds are bordered by a hedge of arborvitae which sit above a wall of granite blocks while native arborvitae, white pine, and lilac runs along the north end. The east and west sides are bordered by native white spruce that vary from 60 to 80 feet in height. The Captain John Dexter House at 50 Dexter Lane (MHC 7, 1860) is located directly south of the cemetery grounds and bounded by mature sugar maples. The main entrance consists of a simple, Gothic, 19th-century iron gate supported by granite posts on the south side of New Bedford Road and overgrown by arborvitae trees. The Dexter Lane entrance, on the eastern side of the cemetery, has a Gothic, 19th-century iron gate supported by granite gate posts. An 1875 granite crypt, approximately 20 feet wide, is located along the east edge. Another entrance is situated at the south end with open terrain bordered with arborvitae to the north and white spruce to the south. Access within the cemetery consists of compacted dirt surfaces surrounding and intersecting the central half of the grounds. The terrain of the cemetery is relatively flat, with just a few slight slopes in the northeastern corner. Vegetation consists generally of grass cover, assorted weeds, white spruce, white pine, arborvitae, and various yew and juniper bushes which serve as head stone plantings.

With approximately 1,400 stones throughout its grounds, First Parish Cemetery is the oldest and one of the largest burial grounds in Rochester. Many notable people in Rochester's history have been laid to rest here, the majority of which are located in the central portion of the cemetery, including the oldest stone that dates from 1715 and a tall monument of light gray polished and etched granite standing 9 ft. to 10 ft. in height and belonging to the Ellis family. The approach to the monument is surrounded by various obelisks and concentrated limestone and marble headstones from the 19th century with one obelisk of limestone to the south belonging to the Church family. Two 19th-century plots stand to the southwest of these obelisks surrounded by ornate, 19th-century iron fencing and gates inscribed with the Haskell and Leonard family names. In the northern section of the grounds the majority of headstones date from the 18th century and are slate with arched tops with motifs consisting of winged cherubs, winged death skulls, and urn and willows. The southern section is active and contains some unusual and elaborate urn-topped stones from the late 19th century to present-day polished marble stones, along with bronze plate markers.

The focus of the cemetery is the centrally-located obelisk inscribed on all four sides with members of the George Ellis family, as follows:

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (continued)

Rochester Center has served as the civic center of the town since the late 17th century, when its first meetinghouse (not extant) was built. The area was established as the town center in 1697 by the first constables of Rochester, who chose a wooded lot north of the present-day First Congregational Church (MHC 3, 1837) and set it apart for the town. Originally named "the Ministry" woods, the area initially included a burying ground and training field. Several months after it was laid out, a location for the meeting house was chosen. The construction of the first Rochester Meeting House in 1699 led to the development of several local highways which helped to solidify and establish the town center in the 18th century. Town life centered around Rochester Center with the development of the town green and the erection of such buildings as First Congregational Church (MHC 3, 1837), Academy School (MHC 2, 1838), and Town Hall. During the 20th century other civic building erected there were the Plumb Corner Mall and Plumb Memorial Library.

The First Parish Cemetery was established ca. 1701 as the earliest cemetery in Rochester and known simply as the "Rochester Center Cemetery" throughout the 17th and 18th centuries. Many prominent figures in Rochester's history have been laid to rest at this burial ground, including Lieutenant-Colonel Ebenezer White and many members of the Burgess, Haskell, and Foster families. The focus of the cemetery is the centrally-located obelisk that marks the resting place of four members of the Ellis family. The Ellis family was one of the earliest families to settle in Rochester when they made their home in Sippican during the late 17th century and later in Mattapoisett in the 18th century (Committee of the Town of Mattapoisett 1907:53).

Lieut.-Col. Ebenezer White, of Rochester, was commissioned as Lieut.-Col. of the Fourth Regiment Plymouth County Militia in the first year of the Revolutionary War. In the First Parish Cemetery stands, bearing the following inscription:

"Memento Mori, Sacred to the memory of Colonel Ebenezer White, who died March, 1804, aged eighty. He was 19 times chosen to represent the Town of Rochester in General Court; in 14 of which elections he was unanimously chosen. As a tribute of respect for his faithful services, the town erected this monument to his memory."

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The French and Indian War Soldier buried at First Parish Cemetery is Lieut. John Winslow

The First Parish Cemetery remains an active burial ground and is representative of the earliest settlement efforts that took place at Rochester Center at the beginning of the 18th century and is privately owned by Rochester Center Cemetery, Inc.

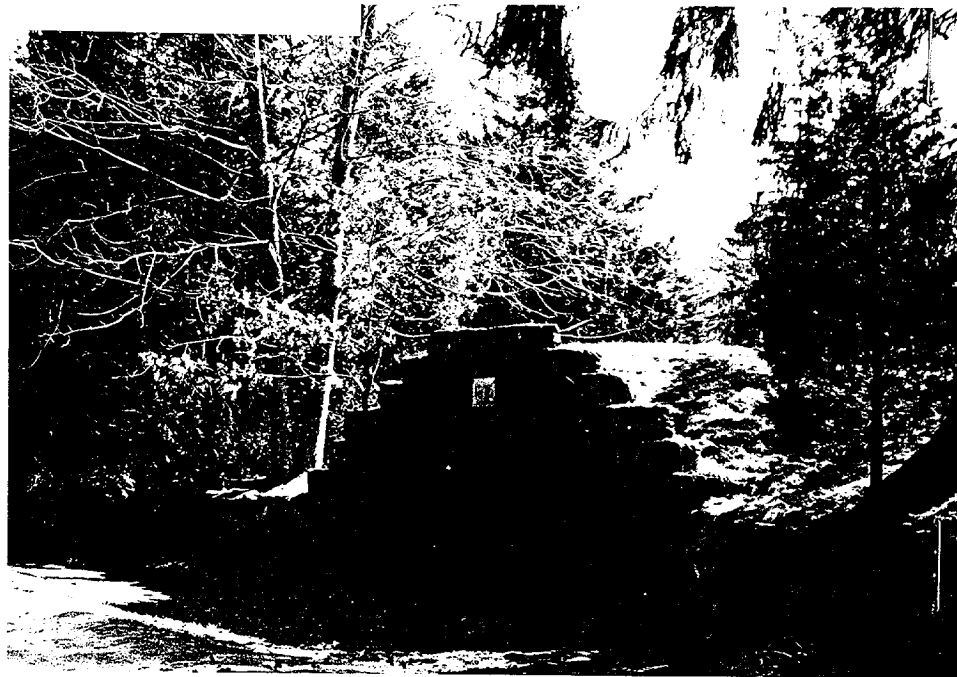

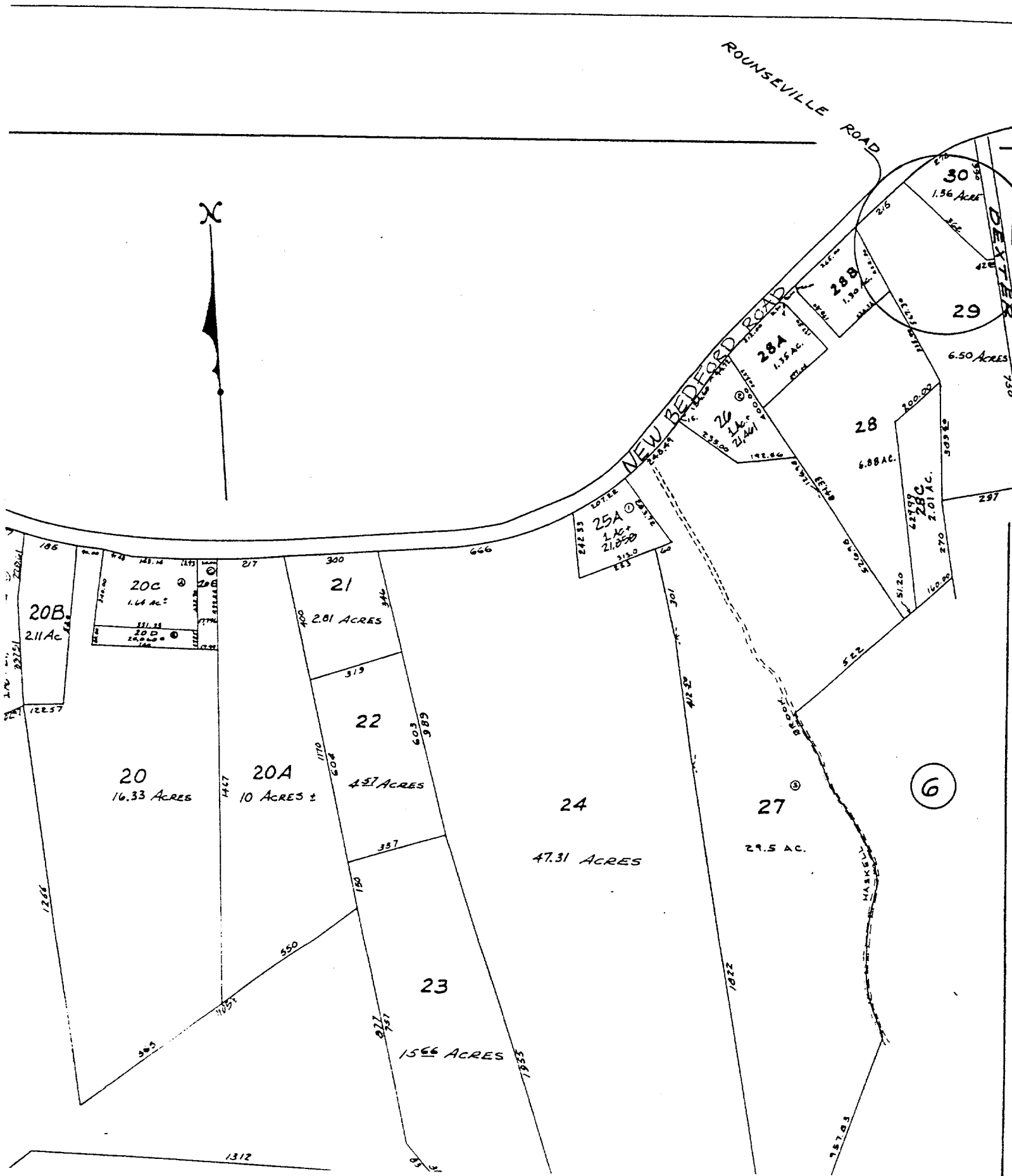

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VISUAL/DESIGN ASSESSMENT *(continued)*

Located on the west side of Walnut Plain Road and set back 15 feet from the road, Union Cemetery occupies approximately 1.38 acres in Rochester. A residential development is located to the east while the grounds are surrounded on the north, south, and west by trees. New homes are barely visible through these trees on either side. A low, wood post-and-rail fence runs along the east side while a low, stone perimeter wall borders the grounds on the north, south, and west, resulting in a rectangular shape. Two openings in the fence are wide enough for vehicles to pass, though only the south end has a dirt and grass lane which runs to the rear of the cemetery with no visible turn around. Small pines and brush are growing along the back and side walls and only several graves have plantings. The stones are arranged in rows that run parallel with the wood fence. The majority of the stones are flat-and round-arch. The oldest stones are located along the west side of the grounds while newer stones lie in the east and south end of the burial ground. Low mounds that mark plots, several with few or no stones, are visible throughout the cemetery.

There are 10 obelisks of various shapes and sizes with materials consisting of marble, pink granite, red and black marble, and granite. The families they represent include some of the older names in Rochester, though not necessarily the earliest members of these families. Many early families such as the Cowen, Burgess, Clark, Doty, Bumpus, Stevens & Bishop families are buried here. Lots are bounded by large granite cornerstones or curbstones set in the ground. One lot, not marked by an obelisk, has a fence constructed of stone pillars and rusted pipe rails, some of which lie along the stone wall hidden by brush.

Headstones are primarily gray granite, but pink granite and marble are also present. Lichen obscures some names and dates and weather and time have made others illegible. Marble stones are streaked and discolored and a number of stones are missing. Newer stones have decorative carvings depicting things such as a rooster, cranberry scoop, berry sprigs, a steam shovel, as well as a fence rail with flowers and butterflies. Older stones are relatively unadorned with motifs such as a weeping willow, angel, hands with the index finger pointed skyward, flowers, open bible, a lamb at rest, and one Virgin Mary. The stone of Joseph Look (1776-1857), is engraved with Masonic symbols with an arch and three tall candles on the face of the stone and an eye in the curve of the arch. Around the outside of the arch a crossed square and compass, the sun, a crescent moon, and stars and two crossed keys have been engraved. The stone of Lucretia B. Robinson has flowers cut in high relief, approximately one inch in depth, and entwined down both sides of the stone while the front is adorned with grape leaves, grape clusters and acorns.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

A map of 1854 shows Union Cemetery, also known as the Rochester Burial Ground, affiliated with the Union Methodist Church (not extant) and located north of its present site at the fork formed by Alley Road and Walnut Plain Road. This intersection was changed slightly around 1995 and 1996. The *Mattapoisett and Old Rochester* book states that a Union meetinghouse was built in this area in 1825 with Elder Pliny reading the sermon. This building burned and another, which stood as late as the 1950s, was built on the same site. The society was reorganized several times, and for some years functioned as a Methodist Church and later as a Congregational Church. The cemetery was in existence in 1810, predating the church by 15 years. As with the change in church affiliation, Union Cemetery does not seem to be of any one denomination. All early records have been lost, so an accurate history of the cemetery and its beginning is unknown.

Also notable is the stone of Civil War private Freeman H. Stevens, a sawyer from Fairhaven who died at age 18 of disease on November 18, 1864 in Readville, Georgia just 3 months after enlisting. Joseph F. Ryder, 28, a local farmer, in Co. 133 Mass. Volunteers died a sergeant on May 5, 1864 in Dallas, Georgia. Joseph W. Tinkham, born December 3, 1864 at age 28 is also laid to rest here along with several other veterans. Joseph Bishop, who died in 1854, and Micah Stevens who died in 1831 at age 48 are believed to be veterans of the War of 1812. The Reverend Archipus Leonard, who died January 18, 1834 at age 75, is thought to be one of three men from the area who served in the Revolutionary War. The parents of artist Albert Pinkham Ryder are also buried here. More recently, Thomas Gayoski, a lifelong resident and chicken farmer, was laid to rest here. For 33 years he was Animal Control/Dog Officer and was a building inspector and volunteer fireman as well. A Grange member for over 50 years, he served in many offices and held Easter Egg Hunts near his home for 45 years. Mr. Gayoski was also known for the fine corn he grew and sold at his farm stand. A town square is named in his honor to the east of the Cowen's Corner Area (MHC Area J). Union Cemetery was turned over to the town in 1954 after approval at the annual town meeting.

Located on a slight hill, and barely visible from High Street, Hillside Cemetery covers approximately 0.8 acres in Douglas Corner at East Rochester. The grounds are surrounded by a wood picket fence supported by stone and cement posts set at regular intervals, probably remnants of an earlier fence. There is no gate, only an opening for vehicles to pass. An oval roadway runs close to the east side and down through the center of the cemetery leaving a burial area in the center as well as to the west. About a dozen newer stones line the northwest side of the area near the entrance. There is one grave with no headstone on the east side, between the fence and drive. This side is narrow with only a single row of stones. The remaining stones are in horizontal rows on the west side of the cemetery. The cemetery is accessible by a narrow, dirt roadway marked at the entrance by a modern, wood sign given in memory of Kristen Leigh Ladd (1978-1996).

The majority of stones are marble or granite. Fieldstone is also used for several of the monuments. Older stones are dark and discolored, some illegible, and some covered by lichen and moss. Two broken stones are visible. The lawn is well-kept and surrounding vegetation includes several shrubs, flowers, and one evergreen tree at the south end. Most stones are modest in ornamentation with flat-cut tops. Those from the 19th century include one marble stone carved with a draped cloth and bible motif. The epitaph reads "Her star went down in beauty." Other motifs include floral and leaf patterns and hands pointing skyward. A plain obelisk at the west end of the lot is that of Thomas Pierce and his wife Nancy Freeman Pierce. Among the newer stones, one large (5x4 ft.) gray granite stone is engraved with water, a fishing boat 'PATRIOTS', a buoy, and clouds. The newest stone, dating from 1996, is a flat, pink granite stone with an angel kneeling in prayer and a statue of an angel nearby. Also among the newer stones is a dark brown cross with a white cross painted inside and a heart shaped stone. In a report from 1908 the following was said of the cemetery: "It is in first-class condition, fence well kept and painted, no weeds or trash. All gravestones, even the old fieldstone markers are in first-class shape. The cemetery is a credit to the community." The cemetery is in fair to good condition and appears well-kept.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

This cemetery, in the part of East Rochester once known as Pierceville, was originally known as the Pierceville First Cemetery. In 1908, the cemetery is described as being "at Pierceville Proper - up back of Tremont (now part of Wareham) towards Rochester Center - in an out of the way place, in a field back from the road." Currently known as Hillside, the cemetery was turned over to the town by votes at town meetings. In 1957 the State Legislature was petitioned to authorize the town to take over the cemetery. A vote at a special town meeting in 1962 allowed Rochester to take title.

Most of the stones date from the 1840s through 1880s. It is primarily a family cemetery, including many members of the Pierce family, many of whom held important military and social positions in Rochester's history throughout the 18th and 19th centuries. At least 45 Pierce family members by birth or marriage have been interred there, the earliest stone being that of one-year old Jeremiah Pierce (1823-1824). Though a cemetery exists next to the neighborhood church (East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857)), this area remained a main resting place for those living in the immediate area throughout the 1800s. Among those buried at Hillside Cemetery is Reverend George Pierce (1804-1875) a carpenter and part-time preacher. Known as "King George", he was among the founders of the East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857) and made "First Leader" in 1856. Founded as the East Rochester Methodist Church, it later became a Congregational Church in 1887 when many members in disagreement left to form the Advent Christian Church.

Another member of the Pierce family buried here, was Walter A. Pierce (1912-1989) who served for many years as Rochester Chief of Police. There are also several Civil War Veterans, including Joshua Davis Pierce, Phillip R.W. Pierce, and Martin Freeman as well as one Veteran of the Vietnam War, Mr. Seed. The area is now known as Douglas Corner in honor of W.M. Douglass who resided at this corner on High Street in the late 19th century (1879 map).

Located on the east side of Braley Hill Road, extending to North Avenue, Old Parish Cemetery covers approximately .58 acres just south of North Rochester. Set back about 15 feet from the road, the cemetery is situated to the west of Oak Woods and has no roadways or openings for vehicles to pass. The grounds are surrounded by a stone perimeter wall and bordered by woods to the north and east. A tall, wooden gate stands at the main entrance on the west side of the cemetery with a sign that reads "Old Parish Cemetery 1700" on its west side and "1979" on its east side. The earliest stones, most of which are slate with a low-relief winged cherub motif, possibly cut by the same stonecutter, appear to be concentrated at the south end of the cemetery. Many of the stones near the west side of the grounds are broken, several of which have been reset in concrete by a local resident. The remaining stones are granite or slate, flat- or round-arch with little or no ornamentation, and many are covered by grass, lichen, and moss. The earliest stone is that of Ebenezer Lewis (1700-1758) while the latest dates from 1857. The most prominent stone is the large slate stone of Reverend Thomas Swift (d. 1790), the first Minister of North Rochester. Among the family names that appear are West, Clark, Hathaway, Swift, White, Coombs, Lewis, Bennett, and Briggs. The terrain of the cemetery is flat and vegetation within the grounds consists of several large pines, brush, and undergrowth. The cemetery, one of the oldest and most unique to Rochester, is in poor condition and in need of regular maintenance.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (*continued*)

Braley Hill Road was named for the Braley family, many members of which were farmers, who resided along this road and Featherbed Lane in the 19th and 20th centuries.

This cemetery, in the north part of Rochester, is one of three cemeteries in the general area. Ashley Cemetery (MHC 809) is located on North Avenue just inside the Rochester/Freetown town line and the cemetery located directly behind the residence at 135 Featherbed Lane stands southeast of Old Parish Cemetery. The Old Parish Cemetery does not appear on the 1795 or 1830 maps of Rochester, its first appearance being on an 1856 map shown surrounded by the residences of the Braley, Bennett, Briggs, Clark, Hammond, Leach, Taylor, and Ashley families (1795 map; Hammond 1830; Walling 1856). The cemetery is the property of Rochester's Third Parish, or North Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 24, 1841).

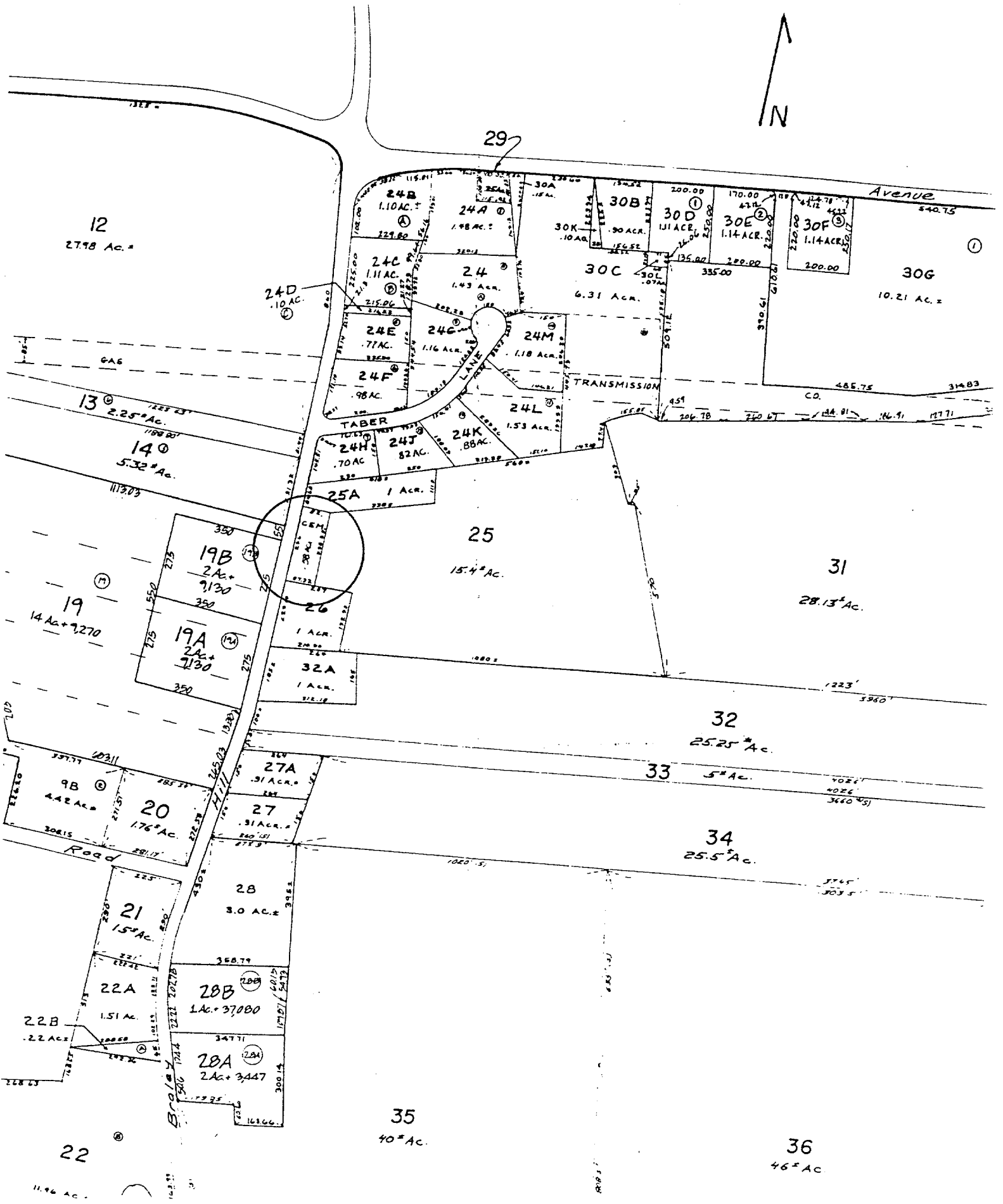

Located on the north side of North Avenue and situated 25 feet from the road, the North Rochester Cemetery covers approximately 1.86 acres. The south side of the cemetery is outlined by granite posts set at regular intervals connected by metal rails. A decorative, cast iron fence with lattice work and balusters stands approximately 3-feet high at the main entrance, flanked by two granite posts. The terrain of the cemetery is relatively flat with woods bordering the grounds to the north, east, and west. The stones are mainly granite and marble with floral or urn and willow motifs. Most have flat- and round-arch forms, but there are also seven obelisks on the grounds. The majority of the stones date from the mid-to late 19th century. The earliest stone is that of Abigail Bisbee (1744-1810), wife of Hopetill Bisbee, one of the most prominent families in Rochester history. Also buried here is Vera Bisbee (d. 1979), prominent citizen. Among the other family names at North Rochester Cemetery are Clark, Bennett, Underhill, Hooper, Braley, Briggs, Crapo, Fuller, Gerrish, Maxim, Cowen, Bishop, and Besse.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

By the late 18th and early 19th century, North Rochester had developed to include its own church, store, fulling mill, sawmill, and iron foundry. Early residents included members of the Bisbee, Bennett, Clark, Combs, Crapo, Morton, Perkins, Pierce, Sears, Winslow, and Wood families. Separated from the town center until the construction of the Snipatuit Causeway in 1879, North Rochester, like Mattapoissett and Marion, was a distinct community within the larger town (Underhill 1997:2).

North Avenue has served as North Rochester's major thoroughfare since the 17th century. Running east to west it connects the northern part of town with Rochester Center as well as with the neighboring towns of Freetown, Lakeville, and Middleboro.

This cemetery, in North Rochester, was formerly known as Lakeville Cemetery, a name probably derived from the adjacent town (Thatcher 1995:230). The North Rochester Cemetery appears on an 1856 map of Rochester surrounded by residences with family names such as Bennett, Gerrish, Hooper, Maxim, Perkins, Nickerson, and Briggs. One of the several notable residents of Rochester buried at North Rochester Cemetery is Charles Maurice Maxim, who lived nearby at the Charles Maurice Maxim House at 544 North Avenue (MHC 135, ca. 1868) in the Bisbee Corner Area (MHC Area H). Charles, who served in the Civil War, owned an extensive amount of property and was among the most successful farmers in the area (RHS files). Several other graves mark the final resting place of many residents who lived within the adjacent Bisbee Corner Area (MHC Area H) and the North Rochester Area (MHC Area D).

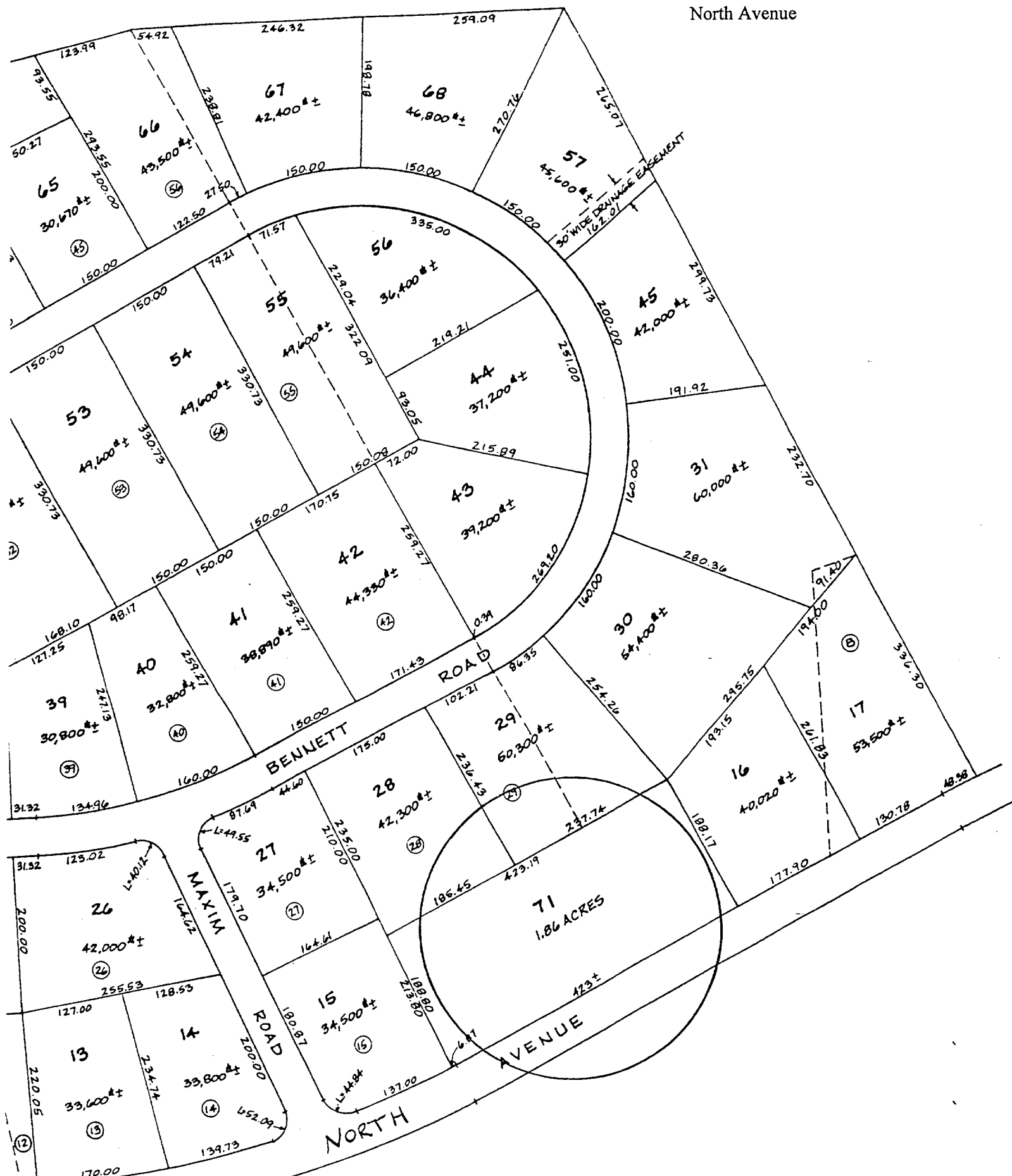

Sherman Cemetery is located in a rural area and bordered by a low, stone wall along its east side. The entrance is accessed by an opening in the stone wall and marked by 2 wood posts and a sign. An iron water pump sits just inside the north side of the entrance. The north and south sides are bordered by a new, vinyl, post and rail fence while the west side is bordered by tall, mature trees. The southwestern corner (the original section of the cemetery) contains the older stones, most of which are marble and in need of cleaning and repair. Approximately 10 stones are broken or leaning over and are in need of maintenance. The western area contains newer stones and has room for expansion.

The stones are mainly 3 to 4 feet in height and materials consist of marble and granite. Eight polished granite, large, family obelisks, standing approximately 6 feet tall, are scattered throughout the cemetery. The elaborate Bumpus family stone is the focal point within the grounds and appears to be cast rather than carved. Landscape elements include a flowering dogwood and 3 evergreens that stand in the center of the grounds as well as shrubs that are scattered throughout.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

The original section of Sherman Cemetery was 1.4 acres and located at the eastern end of the present-day lot. An adjacent 1.5 acre lot to the west, that doubled its size, was given to the cemetery by Winslow's Mill/Hartley's Mill (MHC HA-1). The Sherman Cemetery was turned over to the town of Rochester at the 1954 Annual Town Meeting (Article 16 per Acts of the Legislature, Chapter 671-1954).

The cemetery's major period of use was from 1850 through the early 1900s. The ancestors of old Rochester families are buried here. Besides the Sherman family, for whom the cemetery was named, other family names include Rounseville, Hartley, Snell, Dexter, Cushman, Howland, Bumpus, West, Bolles, Ryder, Jenney, Randall, Crapo, McComb, Bassett, Reed, Tripp, Bettencourt, Weigel, Vaughn, Douglas, and Mary.

The oldest stone is that of George Douglas, who died March 10, 1843 at age 80. A stone dedicated to the memory of Charles Bryant, First Territorial Governor of Alaska, stands within the grounds although he is buried elsewhere. There are 39 veterans as of 1997, including the following Civil War veterans:

George H. Randall (1842-1939), Selectman, Fire Warden, Road Surveyor, and Grange member
William T. Bryant (1830-1863), died in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. His son, William, served as Provincial Governor of Alaska
Benjamin Gammons, Cobbler and shop owner
Otis P. Snell, born 1832 in Nantucket. Ancestor of Annie L. Hartley and wife of James Hartley
William H. Pierce, Navy
Elisha M. Bumpus (1835-1900), Navy, Asst. Eng. USS Taylor

CAPTAIN CHARLES BRYANT-FIRST GOVERNOR OF ALASKA
by Charles Mendall 1967

Few people today remember one of Mattapoisett's most distinguished citizens, Captain Charles R. Bryant, the first Governor of Alaska, which is this year celebrating the centennial of its purchase from Russia by the United States in 1867. Captain Bryant also played an important part in the decision to buy Alaska, then spent ten years administering the territory, and upon his return retired to Mattapoisett where he lived the last 25 years of his life in what is now the Mattapoisett Inn on Water Street.

Captain Bryant was born on a farm in Rochester in 1820, one of a family of seven. The farm boy early became acquainted with Mattapoisett by picking fruit in the summer months and carrying it to Mattapoisett-- on foot most of the time--to Harlow and LeBaron's general store (building now housing Dr. Stanley J. Mysliwy's office) to be sold to the shipcarpenters in the shipyards along the waterfront. Before long he was employed by the store as general errandboy. In this way he became familiar with all the hustle and bustle of a busy seaport and with the constant arrivals and departures of whalers and the constant tales of whaling.

At the age of 20 he shipped on a New Bedford whaler, the Montezuma. In the next 18 years he made six voyages, covering the Pacific Ocean, as he used to say, from latitude 60 degrees south to latitude 72 degrees north-- from Antarctic to the Arctic. His second voyage, on the ship Champion, took him to the Northwest Pacific Coast, as did his four subsequent voyages. It was on these voyages that he acquired that intimate knowledge of the Alaska Coast and Aleutian Islands that later made him a logical choice as the government's first administrator of the new territory.

On this second voyage, on the Champion, the ship's master was killed by the breaking of a tackle-fall, and young Bryant was promoted to boat steerer, or harpooner. At any rate, on his next voyage he shipped as third mate on the ship Abraham Barker, and on the following voyage as second mate of the ship Gideon Howland.

His two final voyages he sailed as Captain, first of the Gideon Howland and second of the Ship, America. On this voyage Captain Bryant carried a steam whale boat to be tried as an experiment, but for some reason it was never used. (Perhaps nobody knew how to run it)

Sometime between voyages Captain Bryant found time to marry Miss Hannah Eldredge of New Bedford. When he returned on the America in May of 1861, he retired from the sea and bought a farm and built a house in East Fairhaven where he and his wife went to live. In 1867 and 1868 he was elected to the state legislature. It is interesting to speculate whether Captain Bryant considered his active life over and was looking forward to many peaceful years of retirement on his farm. If so, he was in for a big surprise.

Down in Washington, Secretary of State Seward and the powerful Senator Sumner had achieved passage through Congress of a bill to purchase Alaska from Russia for \$7,000,000. Evidently Captain Bryant had, with other whalers, been called to Washington, to give testimony before the bill was passed, for later Senator Sumner stated publicly that "next to myself, you owe it to Captain Bryant that we were successful in purchasing so valuable a territory."

After the purchase, this vast new territory of Alaska was placed under the administration of the Treasury department, and an administrator had to be found. Treasury Secretary McCulloch, acting on the recommendation of Senator Sumner, appointed Captain Bryant as Special Treasury Agent to govern Alaska.

When Captain Bryant arrived in Sitka in September, 1868, the task of governing Alaska at that time all that was known about Alaska

was that each year millions of seals migrated to the Pribilof Islands in the Bering Sea, just north of the Aleutians, to have their young. For years Russia had allowed her fur traders to have their way with this great source of wealth. Consequently, the traders had moved natives in from the Aleutians, housed them in holes in the ground banked up by driftwood and sod, left them quantities of a sour liquor called "crass", and forced them to kill seals. As the New Bedford Standard put it: "All the natives had ever known under Russian rule was that once a year a ship came out of the mists, stopped a few days to unload supplies and take on board skins, and then sailed away into the distance".

When Captain Bryant sailed to the Pribilofs, he found complete anarchy. Taking advantage of the absence of any law or order, raiders had taken over and were slaughtering seals at a rate leading to extermination. The arrival of the U.S.S. Wyanda put an end to this problem and allowed Captain Bryant to survey it, draw up a comprehensive plan of action, and return to Washington in 1869 to file his report with the treasury department. Incidentally, by this time the first transcontinental railroad had been completed, so the traveler to and from the Pacific no longer had to spend three or four months at sea nor to double Cape Horn.

In Washington, Captain Bryant's report met with complete approval, Alaska was made a reservation under the authority of the secretary of the treasury, and Secretary Boutwell placed Captain Bryant in complete charge of the whole territory. He was even allowed to choose his own assistants, so great was their confidence in him.

He returned to Alaska in 1870, and for seven years was the sole authority of the United States to establish law and order in that area.

He put his plan into action. The islands were leased to a company which paid for a license to kill seals under restrictions and limits set by the government, i. e., Captain Bryant. This brought revenue to the treasury and also stopped the break in the reproductive life of the seals, not only saving the species, but ensuring a continuous industry.

While supervising these operations, Captain Bryant was also improving the living conditions of the Aleuts. Houses were built for them, a civilized community organized, and a regular contact between the islands and mainland established. Captain Bryant also wrote an article on the life of the seal and sea lions which was published in The History of North American Pinnipeds by Professor J.A. Allen of Harvard.

For the latter years of his stay in Alaska, Captain Bryant's wife and niece (he had no children) journeyed up to live with him. How they endured the winters we can't imagine. The captain reported that the last winter they were there was the coldest for 60 years and the temperature in February AVERAGED four degrees above zero.

Later, while he was living in Mattapoisett, Captain Bryant told hundreds of stories of his years in Alaska. Only one has survived, and that only because it was printed in the New Bedford Standard. It seems a merchant had brought to Captain Bryant a bright and promising boy from Attu, the westernmost of the Aleutian Islands (known to us today as a battleground with the Japanese in World War II). The boy used to call him Grandfather, and each day brought his lessons to him. The Standard quotes:

"The Aleuts have very little beard inly when quite old. I asked him how old he thought I was. He looked me steadily in the face as if mentally calculating for a minute, then spoke up quickly, saying "Three hundred and sixty years." I asked him to explain. he says his grandfather is sixty

After serving nearly eight years under three presidents and seven different secretaries of the treasury, Captain Bryant resigned (the new secretary holding completely differing opinions), and with his wife and niece returned to Fairhaven on July 30, 1877. Soon thereafter he moved to Mattapoisett, bought the old Meigs tavern, (present Mattapoisett Inn) and lived there with his wife and niece for the next 25 years.

He was a familiar figure about town; older people recall seeing him hoeing in his garden where the public library now stands, or in cold weather wearing a long, heavy, black cape. It is doubtful whether anyone ever criticized this piece of apparel. Obviously a man who had spent seven or eight winters in Alaska knew what to wear to keep warm. It is also recalled that once in a great while a Russian lady called on him, someone whose husband he had known well in those far-off days in those far-off islands.

One of the persistent stories about Captain Bryant concerns his supposed memoirs and their mysterious disappearance. According to one version he spent months dictating them; then just before he died, the person who took the dictation quarrelled with him and made off with the whole voluminous manuscript. The other version has it that Captain Bryant wrote his memoirs, but that right after his death a relative absconded with them. Lem Dexter, who used to tell the first version, was positive the memoirs existed. But they have never turned up. If they should, they would prove a major find in American History.

Although he held only one office, Captain Bryant was active in town and civic affairs. That one office was membership on the School Committee, and it was in this capacity that he made his well-known remark in Town Meeting. The time was the late 1880's when the little one room schoolhouses in the more remote sections of the town, due to declining enrolments, were being closed down. The school committee had voted to close the Tinkhamtown school, and in Town Meeting someone criticized the action. Captain Bryant arose and defended the committee by not only citing the figures showing fewer and fewer pupils, but by saying that he had personally consulted with each family in the school district, and had come to the conclusion that there would not be any more children in that area.

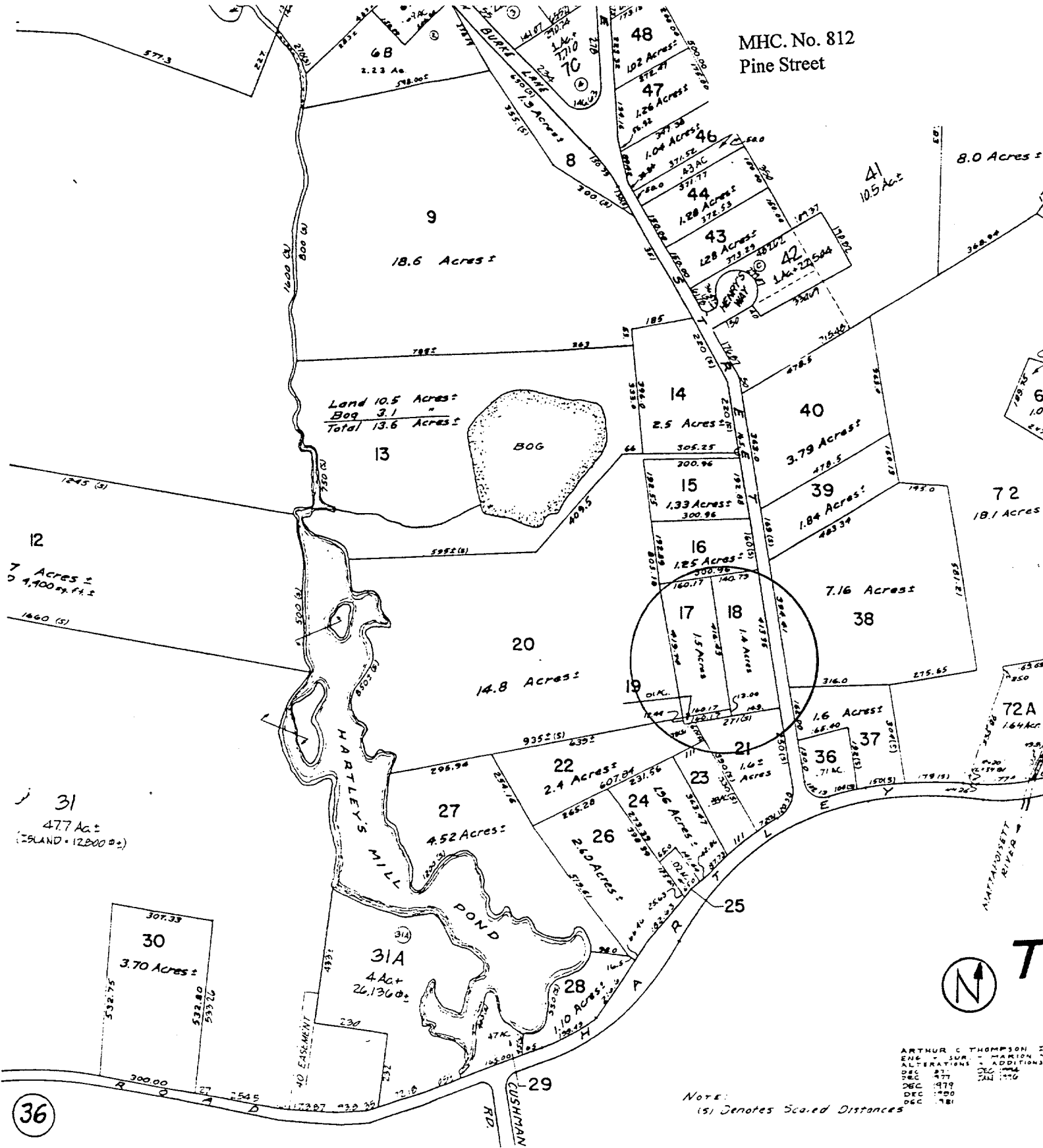
It is pleasant to think of this outstanding and remarkable and kindly man who had sailed the Atlantic and Pacific, who had spent years of his life off and on the stormy coasts, who had known whalers and cabinet members and eskimos and senators and captains and crews and lawless raiders and violent killers--always on or near the sea--it is pleasant to think of him looking out each morning over the waterfront where as a boy he had sold apples in the shipyards, and gazing out beyond over the harbor to the waters of the bay.

He died on July 2, 1903, aged 83.

VISUAL/DESIGN ASSESSMENT *(continued)*

Ashley Cemetery is located on the south side of North Avenue, at the Freetown border, and covers 0.13 acres in North Rochester. The grounds are enclosed within a stone wall, originally 3-4 ft. high, that now stands approximately 2 ft. high with poison ivy growing on parts of it. There is a narrow opening at the west end of the wall marked by two wooden posts. A carved, scroll-top, wood sign supported by rusted metal posts sits several feet back from the road. The landscape is relatively flat with a row of young evergreens along the south end.

The stones lie in horizontal rows perpendicular to the road. Materials consist of slate and marble and motifs include mainly urn & willow with similar border designs and flat and arched tops, indicating the same stonecutter may have cut many of the stones. The letters are cut deeply and distinctly with the letters "I" and "D" executed with particular flourish. Many stones are discolored, covered by lichen, or weathered to make them barely legible. Several stones are broken and many lean over toward the ground. Many stones have foot stones.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

By the late 18th and early 19th century, North Rochester had developed to include its own church, store, fulling mill, sawmill, and iron foundry. Early residents include members of the Bisbee, Bennett, Clark, Combs, Crapo, Morton, Perkins, Pierce, Sears, Winslow, and Wood families. North Rochester, like Mattapoisett and Marion, was a distinct community within the larger town. This fact is due in part to the distance which had to be traveled to the town center prior to the construction of the Snipatuit Causeway which was built in 1879 (Underhill 1997:2).

Until the construction of the Snipatuit Causeway in 1879, North Avenue had served as North Rochester's major thoroughfare since the seventeenth century. Running east to west it connects the northern part of town with Rochester Center as well as with the neighboring towns of Freetown, Lakeville, and Middleboro.

Ashley Cemetery served as a private cemetery with its earliest stone dating from 1788 while the newest stone dates from the 1860s. One of the newest stones is that of Alonzo Peirce, Co. B, 1st Mass. Calvary, who served in the Civil War. His date of death is unknown as is the reason why he is buried here. There are 23 members of the Ashley family buried here, the earliest being Anna Ashley (1745-1788), wife of Percival Ashley (d. 1822) who fought in the Revolutionary War. Among other Ashleys buried here are John Sherman Ashley (1791-1826), James Ashley (1824-1846), and his wife Hannah Ashley (1811-1836), as well 9 children who were age 13 or younger. In 1816, eight people, whose death was caused by the epidemic of spotted fever that took the lives of some 61 Rochester residents, were buried here. Among those at Ashley Cemetery who perished from the fever were Mary Ashley (1796-1840), her son Abraham (1803-1816), and her daughter Betsey (1811-1816) as well as 2 sons of Bishop and Lydia Ashley, Thomas (1808-1816) and Bishop (1809-1816). Ashley Cemetery became town property sometime after the 1954 annual town meeting. Today, there are many Ashleys living throughout Rochester along Sarah Sherman Road, Burgess Avenue, Union Church Terrace, County Road, and Old Tuck Bog Road (List of Residents 1997:1).

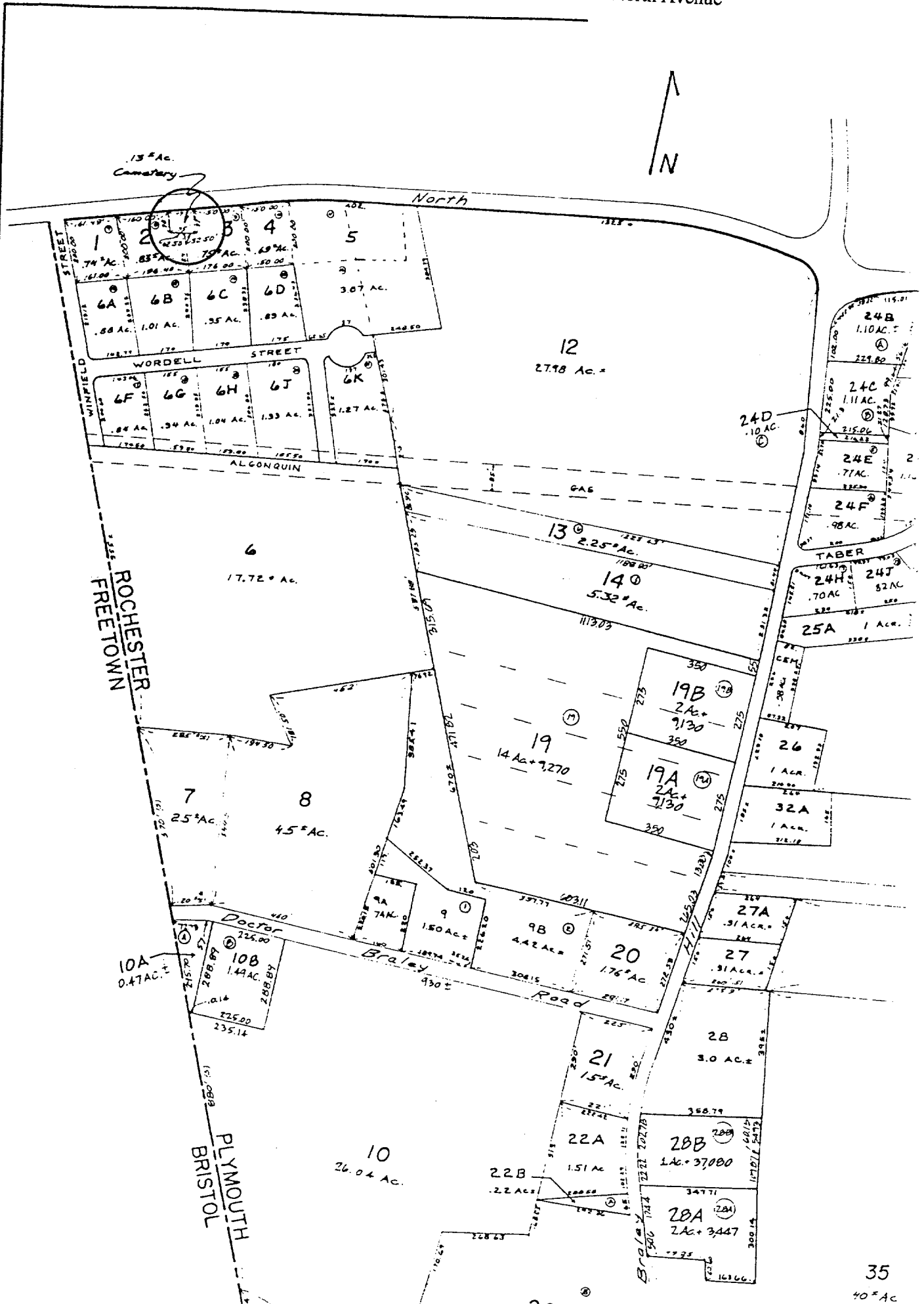

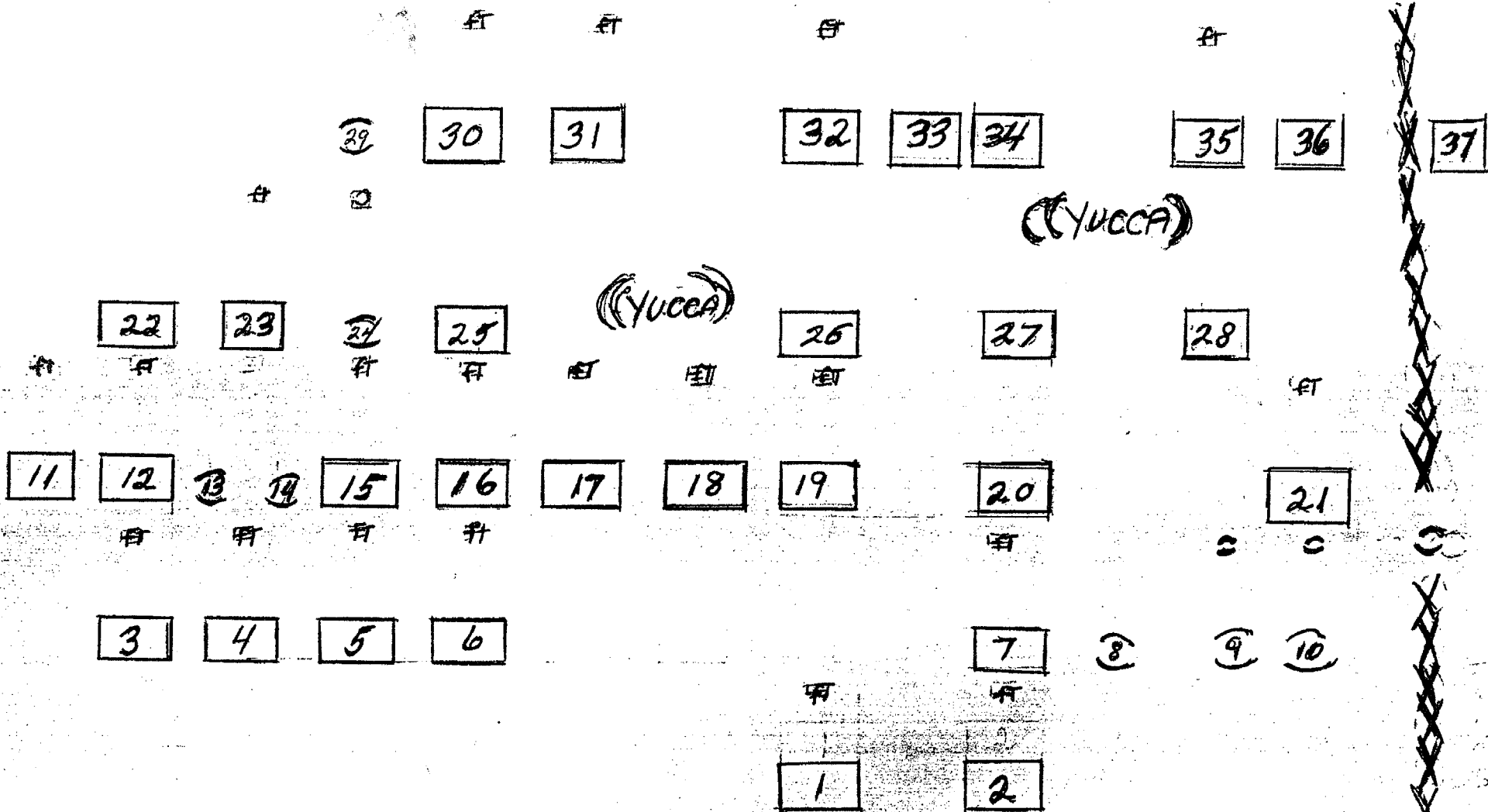

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VISUAL/DESIGN ASSESSMENT *(continued)*

Woodside Cemetery is located on the west side of County Road in East Rochester. This 1 acre, L-shaped lot on level ground is bordered by a rail fence along County Road and the East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857) at the southeastern corner. The grounds are surrounded by iron rails with concrete posts and the entrance is marked by two large stone posts, one of which has fallen over. The north and west sides are bordered by woods with the trees on the western edge encroaching on the stones located there. Two groups of trees are also damaging graves at the eastern end. One path or driveway leads from the stone post entrance behind the East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857) to the rear and another driveway follows the northern fence.

Many of the older stones are of marble and slate and are weathered and illegible and in need of repair. Approximately 25 stones are broken, with their pieces scattered nearby. Most of the stones are very simple marble markers. There are 10 larger stones, 2 are marble with granite bases. The largest is the Morse family monument that stands approximately 15 feet tall with marble facing and sits inside a 20 ft. by 50 ft. rectangle bordered with granite curbing. Another Morse family monument with a marble ball on top of a 6 ft. granite base is located to the right of the entrance.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE *(continued)*

East Rochester developed at a later date than Rochester Center. The 1704 map shows no development in the entire East Rochester Area and its immediate surroundings. By the mid-19th century, several houses had been constructed along County Road and to the west, north of High Street. County Road was originally known as Division Street since it served as the dividing line between Rochester and Wareham to the east and later known as Briggs Lane. (The road was re-named County during the 1920s (Foss 1926).) The Cape Cod Railroad was in place by mid-century, cutting across the northeast corner of town. Early families in the area included the Gurneys, Leonards, Morses, Mortons, and Raymonds. The Pierces settled in the nearby Douglas Corner Area (MHC Area K), originally known as Pierceville. Industrial development in East Rochester was limited to a single saw mill to the northwest of the East Rochester Area (Walling 1856).

Development increased in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when numerous houses along County Street were constructed, two mills were in operation, and the East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857) was built. Many of the same families continued to reside in East Rochester, with the addition of members of the Davis and Pierce families along County Road, and the Jeffersons and Nickersons at Pierceville (1879 map). Many of these same names can be found on the stones at the Hillside (MHC 807) and Woodside cemeteries (MHC 805). Development continued throughout the early-to-mid-20th century, creating a dense cluster of houses along County Road. Many of these late-19th- and early-20th-century houses remain on County Road to the present day.

Woodside Cemetery's major period of use was from 1830 until 1890. During that period, it was known as Pierceville or Briggs Lane Cemetery. The cemetery was in use before the construction of the adjacent East Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 48, 1857) in 1857. Many of the church members are buried here.

Family names include Morse, Briggs, Gurney, Gallt, Bumpus, and Maxim. The oldest stone, located in the southwest corner, is that of Benjamin Gurney (1743-1828), a Revolutionary War soldier who lived nearby and died on July 4th. Another old

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section is located at the northeast corner and contains the stones of the Harvey Briggs family, including the second oldest grave in the cemetery, that of Ann J. Briggs (d. 1830). The first two rows near County Road currently include only one stone each. It is unclear whether there are other graves in these two rows or if they are unused.

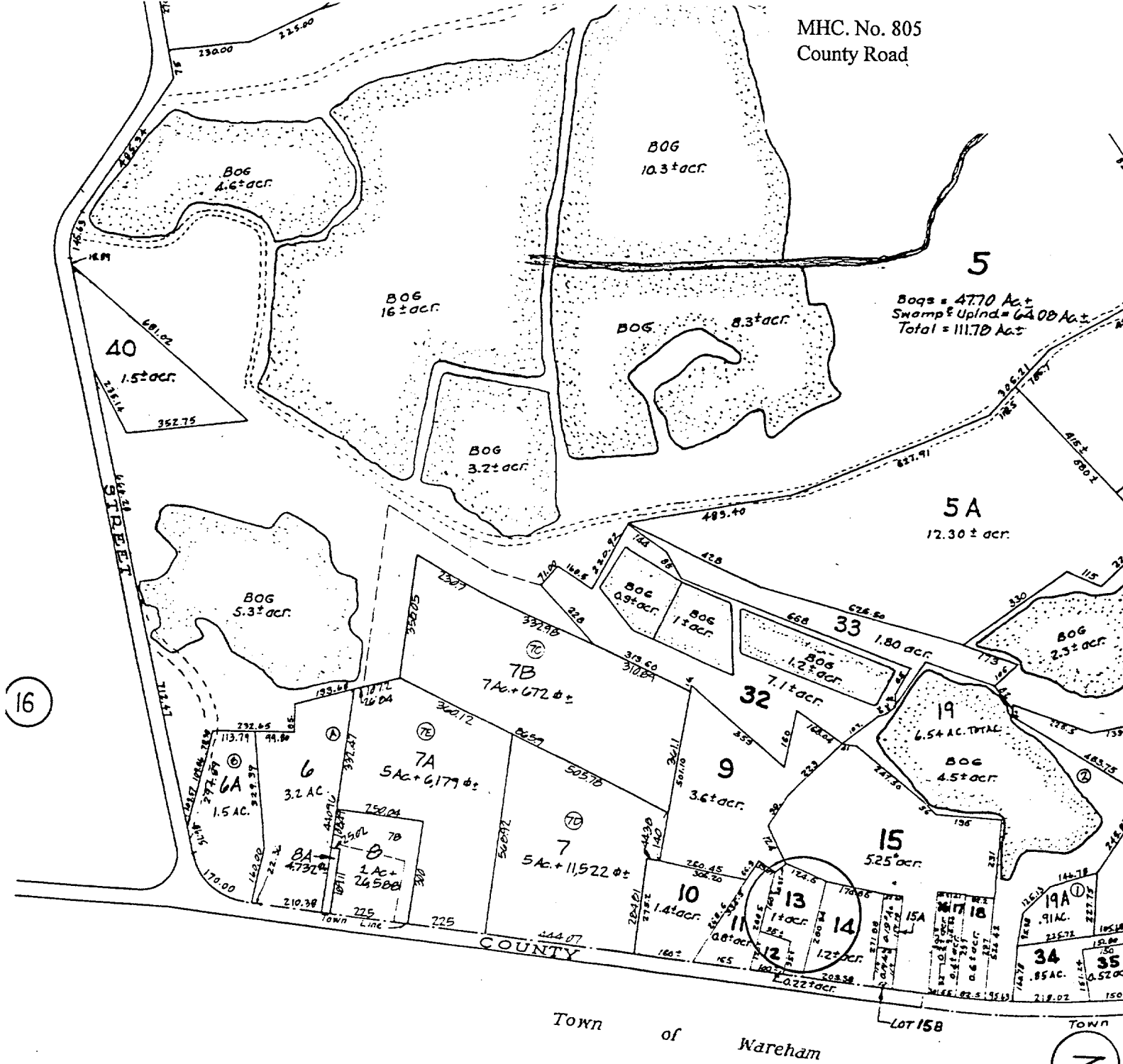

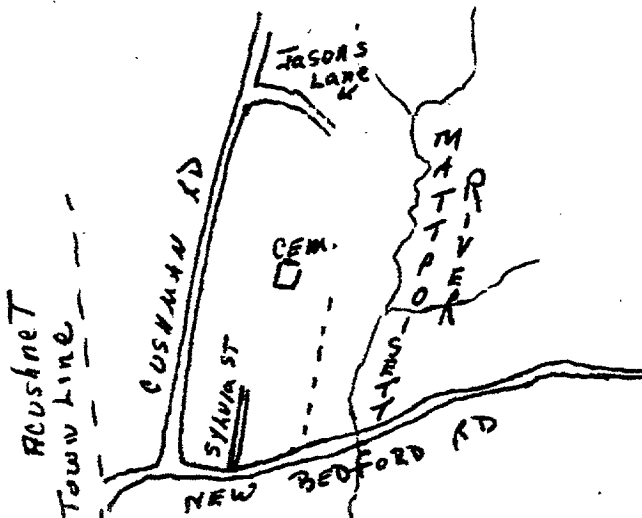

This small plot with the single slate stone sets in a deeply wooded area, surrounded by a fieldstone wall without an opening, making it necessary to climb over the wall to read the stone. It is about 1/3 of a mile off New Bedford Road, behind a large orchard and adjacent to an open field. Wall is approx. 2½' high, many stones are loose and some have fallen off. Plot is overgrown with brush, poison ivy, etc. The stone has large deep crack cutting diagonally across it. The slate is chipping, still barely legible but engravings are shallow and may be illegible in a few years. A Death's Head is engraved on top of stone. Under this are two words...M—m— Mortis, below them:

Explain religious affiliations, major period of use, and evaluate historical association of this burial ground with the community.

Little is known of this family. No death record listed for Sarah or Jeremiah. An old historian's account says the stone was erected by inmates of the town's last poor-farm, probably so since it is on that site. His account contained two errors that we know of, giving the information as being on two stones, and Sarah's name as "Jessamide," so no verification has been found.

Just by chance, a record was found of a marriage, Sarah Howse & Earl Clap in 1761. Realizing this could be the daughter of Sarah & Jeremiah, we searched further in the First Congregational Church records, finding a Baptismal record for the daughter on April 8, 1770, reading "Sarah. wife of Earl Clap near 30 yrs of age." More importantly, the next entry on June 3, 1770, contained the record of five Clap children's baptism AND the baptism for SARAH HOWSE, " a Widow of near 70 years of age, Mother of Sarah Clap." This information not only confirms her Protestant affiliation, but indicates some community involvement. Her son-in-law was active in church affairs, was Captain in Army at Battle of Bunker Hill and rose to rank of Major. (Earl Clap)

We have not been able to learn where Jeremiah was killed, nor by what Indians. The date of 1747 would seem to be too late for the Indian Wars in this area.

Shortly after completing this report a lengthy article about this single grave was discovered in the files of the Rochester Historical Society. This article, published January 15, 1961 in the Standard Times of New Bedford, Ma., contained some information of additional interest. Quotes from the newspaper story are given below.

"Most of the letters on the headstone are quite clear; some are a little worn and weary from waiting so many years. They tell a simple story which looks like this.

Mc mc c+ Mertis

In Memory of

Mrs. Sarah Howfe Relict
 of Lieu Jeremiah Howfe
 who died May 5th 1791

In her 88th Year

N. B. Mr. Jeremiah Howfe was
 kill'd by the Indians May 1747

Aged 45 year

The inscription, strangely, appears to have been done by three different hands. The top line (Mc mc c+ Mertis) was obviously made by an amateur; the print is slanted, uneven and scratch looking. The letters must stand for the Latin 'Momentia Mortis', Memento of death.

The next five lines were neatly carved by an artisan in straight and attractive letters. The word 'Relict' is Latin for 'Widow' and was commonly used as such in the long ago--although it might possibly mean survivor. 'Lieu' is undoubtedly short for Lieutenant.

The last three lines are again slanted but cut in script. The first two letters here 'N.B.' could represent 'Nota Bene' Latin for 'Note Well.' The remnants of an M precede the small r before the name Jeremiah. An old English S looks exactly like a present day 'F', therefore 'Howfe' is actually Howse.

The marker itself, is almost oblong in shape. It was made from a large rock of the common variety, split, smoothed and engraved in front; rough and natural in the back. Time has stained it's surface with muted shades of green and gray. A few chips and cracks, like broken veins, distort the printing. The very top of the headstone is pyramid-shaped."

Another interesting point the article brings out is the belief of the writer, after extensive research and discussions with folklore authorities regarding Indian battles, that most likely Jeremiah was killed in the so called King George's War at the French garrison at Louisburg on Cape Breton Island, a "stone's throw from English held Nova Scotia." King George's War was fought from 1743-48.

Also found in the Historical files, is a letter written in 1989 by Lillian E. (Mellor) Bettencourt. She describes how, as a young girl living about two miles from the burial plot during the years 1904-1911, she and her brother would visit the grave sight. Walking through the woods, they would care for and decorate the graves with flowers. She wrote that there were five graves, a mother, father and three children.

No other information has been uncovered.

The Perry Family Cemetery is situated approximately 200 feet down an overgrown path that branches off the west side of Perry Lane in a heavily wooded area. Mary's Pond stands to the northeast and a cranberry bog is located to the east past a clearing, both on the east side of Perry Lane. The grounds are bordered by a stone perimeter wall, lightly coated in cement. A gate made of pipe marks the main entrance of the cemetery. This private cemetery contains 1 headstone and 9 foot stones, several of which are broken and in poor condition. Eleven members of the Perry family are buried here, the focal point of the cemetery being a large, gray, granite stone adorned with a leaf motif, the family name at the bottom, and the letter "P" at the top. Six family members lie in a line near the east end of the grounds while five line the west end, all engraved with the family name and respective dates. The graves are marked by 9 granite foot stones containing the first names of the Perry family members. One grave is unmarked and two children share a common stone. The stones are in generally good condition and have no chipping or discoloration. Vegetation consists generally of moss, seven or eight large trees, and myrtle.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (continued)

Perry Lane, which runs northeast to southwest near Mary's Pond in East Rochester, was once a main stage route from Dartmouth to Cape Cod and Plymouth. The Perry family was one of the most notable in Rochester history, settling here in the early 17th century with Thomas and Ruth Perry being original members of Rochester's first meeting-house in 1709 (Committee of the Town of Mattapoisett 1907:74).

The earliest stone at the Perry Family Cemetery dates from October 13, 1854 while the newest dates from 1920. The 1854, 1856, and 1879 maps of Rochester show several members of the Perry Family including J. E. Perry, G. Payne, and J. Perry living along Perry Lane, although the cemetery does not appear on any of these maps (1969b map; Walling 1856; 1879 map). Jonathan Perry, a farmer and cranberry grower, and James E. Perry, a farmer, continued to reside on Perry Lane to at least 1926, probably benefitting from its location to open fields, Mary's Pond, and the cranberry bog to the east (Foss 1903-4:38). Another James Perry ran a soap making shop in town (Rochester Historical Commission). Members of the Perry family continued to reside in East Rochester into the early 20th century, occupying residences along Perry Lane and High Street. By 1933 several members of the Perry family had dispersed throughout Rochester, along Ryder Road, Grove Street, and Mattapoisett Road (Foss 1933-34:184-185).

There are 11 members of one family buried here. In the center of the cemetery is one large gray granite stone with the letter P at the top & a single leaf like pattern on each side of family name which is engraved at the bottom. The stone is approx. 57 in. tall and 49 in. wide plus base. Six family members lie in a line near the front wall and five along the back wall. Their names and dates are engraved on their respective sides of the headstone. The graves are marked by 9 matching 1 1/2 ft. rectangular flat granite footstones giving first names. One grave is unmarked and two children share a common grave. The graves are in very good condition, no chips, no lichen, moss or discoloration. The cemetery was cleaned some years ago by workers from the Hiller bogs.

Historical - Mary's or Merry's Pond, as once known, was used as a place to " rot" flax to be used for manufacture. John Haskell owned all the land in this area in 1698. His home, built about 1699, is shown on maps as far back as 1704 and was used as a tavern and stage stop on the route from Dartmouth to Plymouth. The Haskell home was later owned by G. Payne (1854 map) & later still by the Vose family. It is one of only three homes on Perry Lane today.

Little is known of the Perry Family and there are no known descendants left in the area. On maps for 1854 & 1856 a home marked J. Perry (Jonathon?) is located farther south on the lane from the Haskell home. A foundation is still visible in the area. Another home marked J.E. Perry (James E.?) is located to the north of the Haskell home. This is probably the home, a red brick, still standing and part of the Perry campground. The cemetery would be on part of J. Perry's property though it does not show on any local maps.

According to L.C.Humphrey - James Perry of Mary's Pond ran a soap making shop along with Pike Hammond of Acushnet. Wood ashes were collected as well as all kinds of household grease. Lye was then made by leaching the ashes. They made both hard and soft soap. Quite often the soap was given in return for new materials.

These two gravestones are alike in design and inscription and appear to be a smooth material, possibly sandstone. They lie within a stonewall enclosure approximately 20' x 20'. Unfortunately both stones are damaged. The husband's having a corner broken off and the wife's is in two large pieces. The wall needs a great deal of repair and there is a great deal of overgrowth. These graves are on the private property of Joaquim A. Jr. & Irene Faustino. Having recently retired, Mr. Faustino has expressed intentions of cleaning out this lot and repairing the stones.

Explain religious affiliations, major period of use, and evaluate historical association of this burial ground with the community.

This small plot contains the graves of Ebenezer and Priscilla Ellis. Information taken from the Vital Records tell us Priscilla died of smallpox and was buried in a family plot rather than a regular burial ground. When her husband died five years later he was also laid to rest here. It is felt that the smallpox had a bearing on the burials as about 1 1/2 miles away is the ELLIS CEMETERY on Wolf Island Rd. in Mattapoissett (then part of Rochester). Several of the couples eleven children are buried there. It is interesting that in the birth records her name is given as Prisscilly. The children were born between 1791 and 1818.

While very little has been found for either Ebenezer or Priscilla it is believed they were Protestant as a list of Baptisms from the Records of the Second Church in Rochester, Mattapoissett Precinct show the following: ELLIS, Ebenezer & Thankful, the children of Joel by his wife Elizabeth, at their own House, Aug. 27, 1756.

The Braley Family Cemetery is located on the west side of Featherbed Lane in a wooded area behind the residence at 135 Featherbed Lane. It is obscured by brush and trees and bordered by an orchard at its south end. The 50' by 50' area is surrounded by a stone wall with an opening for a gate. The stones are still legible as evident by the stone rubbings done by the Rochester Historical Commission in 1996. There are several unmarked stones. HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (continued)

The Braley Family Cemetery contains the stones of early members of the Braley Family. The earliest stone is that of Lydia Braley (1817-1838), daughter of James and Anna Braley (1793-1876) who are also buried here alongside six of their children. Vital Statistics show a total of ten children born to James Braley and Anna Ashley Braley who were married July 26, 1811. The unmarked stones may be the three other Braley children who died of the croup within a period of 3 months (December 1844-February 1845).

Ezekiel Braley (1754-1841), who once owned most of the lots in the immediate area and was a leader in the local friends church group, is buried here. Ezekiel's daughter, Rebecca (b. 1830), is also buried here. The most recent stone is that of Charity Braley (1831-1914), wife of Salmon Braley (1819-1896).

The Pierce Family Cemetery on North Avenue is located behind the Old Colony Regional Vocational Technical High School at 476 North Avenue. A wide, clear path approximately 300 ft. long curves into a heavily wooded area, known as Oak Woods, that leads to the rectangularly shaped cemetery. A more direct route was purposely avoided to keep the site secluded. The high school maintenance staff erected a new, wrought iron fence that borders the grounds and stands approximately 4½ ft. high and includes a small entrance at its northwest corner. The grounds have been regularly maintained and brush, fallen branches, and poison ivy have all been removed. The maintenance staff have also proposed the possibility of removing 7 large pine trees that would allow the entire site to be seeded, mowed, and more carefully maintained.

The stones are marked by headstones as well as footstones and are not set in defined rows. One stone lies on the ground and another is broken. Six stones are of slate and one is marble. Lichen and moss are visible on most stones and all appear weathered and illegible. All stones have arched tops and 5 stones have epitaphs, 4 have urn motifs, and 1 has a weeping willow motif. Mounds are scattered throughout the grounds and do not line up with the stones.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (*continued*)

North Avenue has served as North Rochester's major thoroughfare since the 17th century. Running east to west it connects the northern part of town with Rochester Center as well as with the neighboring towns of Freetown, Lakeville, and Middleboro.

The Pierce Family Cemetery appears on a 1854 map on the east side of a long path that stems off of North Avenue. Three members of the Pierce family are buried here, including Caleb Pierce (1787-1812), son of Josuah Pierce and Polly Pierce, and Joseph Pierce (1722-1797) and his wife Phebe Pierce (1726-1808). The local historical society has concluded that those buried here were relatives of B. Gerrish who lived nearby on North Avenue. Two members of the Gerrish family resided on North Avenue from the mid-19th century through the mid-20th century. B. Gerrish is shown as having a residence on the south side of North Avenue just to the northwest of this path (1969b map). Members of the Gerrish family remained there into the mid-20th century and also had a residence across the street on the north side of North Avenue.

Those buried at the Pierce Family Cemetery are thought to be of Protestant denomination and attended the Third Precinct or North Rochester parish, which later became the North Rochester Congregational Church (MHC 24, 1841). The old meetinghouse of the congregation (not extant) stood 2 miles from the cemetery on North Avenue and was replaced with the current building in 1841. Members of the Gerrish family were active members in the church.
