William Pitz, of the County of Bexar, Comal, said State, for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand and one hundred dollars, to me in hand paid by Peter Wallerath of the County of Bexar State aforesaid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, granted and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the (his) said Peter Wallerath his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, all the right, title and interest in and to the following described property, lying and being in the County of Bexar, said State being portions of a league and labor tract, originally granted by the Mexican Government to Ezequiel Gortari, and numbered on the plat of the division of said league and labor, as

made by Joseph A. Tivey with the numbers two and numbers three containing six hundred and fifty five acres and a half, bounded as follows: Beginning at an Elm on the bank of the Cibolo for the East corner of this Survey, and of division No 3, this Elm being marked A from which a Pecan tree about South $34^{\circ} 8' 35''$ noras distance South $60^{\circ} 7' 40''$ West 640 noras to a stake for the S corner of this Survey from which a Mesquit 5 m diam bears N $82^{\circ} 45' 17''$ noras, and another Mesquit 5 m diam bears N $40^{\circ} 1' 40''$ W 640 noras.
