HONOLULU, March 14—A "Bomber for Bataan" drive has been started among the more than 700 Filipino employes of Pearl Harbor Navy Yard, it was announced today by Rear Admiral William R. Furlong, commandant of the yard.

A special defense bond account has been established where all Filipino employes will make their bond purchases to raise funds equal to the cost of a bomber for Filipino and American forces in the Philippines.

"In presenting their plan," Admiral Furlong said, "the Filipino representatives said that they had a great desire to help their hard-pressed and undaunted countrymen now fighting in the Philippines. They wished to give greater and better aid to their reople and the Americans who are fighting there, in addition to their work in the navy yard."
