#### **Purpose**

Hartman Reserve Nature Center is dedicated to the management and protection of a unique natural area and the promotion of a better understanding of our environment through education, recreation, and community involvement.

#### History

In 1938, John C. Hartman of the Waterloo Daily Courier helped the local YMCA purchase 56 acres of forested land. Camp Hartman Reserve was used for residential camping and other programs until the early 1970s. In 1976, the Black Hawk County Conservation Board purchased the land in order to establish an environmental education center.

#### A Wooded Isle

Hartman Reserve Nature Center is a wooded isle located in the heart of metropolitan Black Hawk County. This 288.5 acre natural area extends from an upland bluff, overlooking the Cedar River Valley, down to the banks of the river. Within the forest are a series of ponds, vernal depressions, a small remnant prairie, an open meadow, and the largest tract of upland forest in the county. This unusually high quality woodland shelters a wide diversity of unique plants and animals.



Hartman Reserve Nature Center is one of 77 sites in Iowa designated as a watchable wildlife site. Deer, turkeys, pileated woodpeckers, red

shouldered hawks, fox, vulutures, and bald eagles are some of the wildlife you might see from the Joe Cropper Deck or the Mary Kay Eakin Bridge. In 1998, otters and osprey were released in the North Unit

#### **Interpretive Center**

The Hartman Interpretive Center is perched on a bluff above the Cedar River. It houses displays and exhibits to help explain the local environment. The interpretive center is connected to the forest by 5 miles of trails.

#### **Cedar Valley Lakes**

The South Riverside Trail can be accessed from the North Hackett Road parking lot and from Hartman Station. This asphalt trail links Hartman Reserve Nature Center to George Wyth State Park and the extensive trail network of the Cedar Valley Lakes Recreation Area.

#### Friends

Hartman Reserve Nature Center is supported by the **Friends of Hartman Reserve** who serve as a link to the community, provide volunteers, and help with fundraising. 
Hartman Interpretive Center West Wing


#### Trail Tram

Using a 1938 Clark Airplane Tug to pull open air trailers, the Trail Tram can transport 16 to 24 people down the trails of the Cedar Valley Lakes Recreation Area. Guided tours will interpret the natural and cultural history of the Cedar River Valley.
