The fire of Friendship blazed upward as these Waterloo folk placed faggots on the flames during a service dedicating the Friendship Circle on the John C. Hartman Reserve near Cedar Heights Sunday afternoon. In the picture above is a group of people gathered around the circle. Standing on the platform in the background are E. A. Bohgan, general secretary of the Y. M. C. A. (left) and Rev. Frank A. Court, pastor of Grace Methodist church, who gave the dedicatory address. At the right of the platform are Martin Tathell, membership secretary of the "Y," Mrs. John C. Hartman and John C. Hartman. The Friendship Circle, located in one corner of the tract of virgin forest, will be used as a meeting place by various groups. The reserve is the property of the Y. M. C. A. The inscription over the platform is "There is he who hath no friends."
