Y. M. C. A. Plans to Preserve Wooded Tract in Natural Beauty

PUBLIC FORUM



It is a pleasure to announce that the Board of Trustees of the Waterloo Y.M.C.A. has completed the purchase of a 56 acre tract lying on the north edge of Cedar Heights to be used by the Y.M.C.A. and other groups.---The final steps of the deal were completed last week.---The Board of Trustees were encouraged to take this step through the initial subscription to a fund for that purpose by John C. Hartman, publisher of the Waterloo Daily Courier. Prominent in the negotiations for this tract of virgin timber for the Y.M.C.A. was the Camp Committee headed by Don M. Graham as chairman.---The picture below inadequately shows some of the beauty spots, and the type of timber prevailing throughout the 56 acres.---Agreement has been entered into with Mr. Hartman, the first donor, to keep the land in its original wild state, insofar as possible, the next twenty-five years.

The Public Affairs Committee on Wednesday evening, February 23, presents Rainsch Schickele of the Iowa State College in the last of the forums to be held this season. The meeting will open promptly at 8 o'clock and will close promptly at 9:30. An invitation is issued to the general public to attend.

This forum will deal with the agricultural problems, and Dr. Schickele will discuss some of the most important and fundamental problems in land planning and land policies giving particular attention to four points.

- 1-Adjustments in land use.
- 2-Agricultural prices and production control problems.
- 3-Problems of soil conservation.
- 4-Adjustments of land tenure systems.

Dr. Schickele received his academic training in Germany, securing his Ph.D. in Berlin in 1931. He has served with the Brookings Institute, and in 1934 carried on research at Iowa State College for the A.A.A. He joined the staff of the latter institution in 1935. Last summer Dr. Schickele was appointed by the Governor to serve on the Iowa Farm Tenancy Committee and the Iowa State Planning Committee of the State Planning Board.
