## THE SUMMER SCHOOL

The Summer School is simply an accelerated version of the regular fall and spring semesters compacted into two six-weeks sessions and one evening session of nine weeks. Most of the same courses are offered and the same academic standards are maintained. Individuals who satisfactorily complete these courses are granted full college credit which transfers to other insitutions.

## POLICIES

Summer School Classes ordinarily meet five days a week for one and one-half hours a meeting. Some classes will meet for longer periods each day. The evening classes will meet 2 1/2 hours a session, two days a week.

The maximum course load for Summer School is seven semester hours for six weeks and fourteen semester hours for twelve weeks.

All policies in the College catalogue apply to students in Summer School. Transfer students, planning to enroll at McLennan Community College for the Summer School only and then returning to their parent institution, will be required to present only a letter of good standing from their institution for entrance.

Special laboratory fees may be charged for individual courses in the areas listed above, or for other courses, in accordance with the cost of materials and services provided by the College.

*BUILDING USE FEE*—A building use fee of \$1.00 per semester hour, or the equivalent thereof (18 clock hours), will be charged for all courses conducted on the campus. For non-credit clock hour courses, the fee will be charged on a pro-rata basis.

*STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARD*—A fee of \$1.00 will be charged all summer students and those enrolled in seven or less semester hours during a long semester.

*PARKING AND DECAL FEE*—A fee of \$1.00 per course is charged for an automobile identification decal and parking permit.

*LATE REGISTRATION FEE*—A fee of \$1.00 per semester hour will be charged for late registration, with a minimum charge of \$5.00.

*BOOKS*—McLennan Community College operates a Bookstore where students may purchase books and supplies at reasonable prices.
