CLOTHING PROSCRIPTIONS FOR WOMEN IN DIFFERENT RELIGIONS

JUDAISM



In Judaism, there are many different clothing proscriptions for women due to there being many different kinds of Jews. The most common types of Judaism are Reform, Conservative and Orthodox, and in each of them, women are expected to dress differently.

Reform Jewish women dress very modernly. It is hard to tell the difference between a Reform Jewish women compared to a women who isn't even Jewish due to there being very little restrictions in the way women dress. These women are not expected to cover their heads. Many Reform women dress in casual clothing such as shorts, t-shirts and even tank tops.

Conservative Jewish women are a step up from Reform.

Many of them go by what their Rabbi's teach them to do, so this can differ between many different Conservative women. Conservative women may not dress conservatively on a daily basis, but when it is Shabbat or any other important Jewish holiday, they may dress with by covering their shoulders, for example. Sometimes they even cover their heads to show respect, but not on a daily basis.

Orthodox Jewish women are constantly dressing with respect to their religion. They do not do this on certain times of the week; they dress the same way everyday. These women are expected to cover their bodies from head to toe. They cover their heads with headpieces and you can barely see any skin on their body. They wear long skirts and shirts that completely cover their shoulders and sometimes their entire arms, too.

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CHRISTIANITY



In Christianity, Women are expected to follow Biblical principles on how they should dress at certain times. The way a women's beauty is shown is a symbol of the spiritual beauty of the church. This means that when a woman looks nice, so does the church and they both represent each other.

ISLAM

The three kinds of Islamic ways Islamic women dress to cover themselves are burqa, niqab, and hijab. Burqa is when a woman is dressed with her face fully hooded. Niqab is when a woman dresses almost completely covering her face, but not as conservatively. Hijab is slightly less conservative than Niqab, with her face actually showing. Niqab is when a woman has her ears and hair covered, which is the way most people prefer women to dress. They believe this is the most appropriate way women should be dressed in public. There is also an on-going debate in many Muslim countries that a hijab is better for women to dress in public because it covers their entire face besides their eyes. In several

countries, people agree that women do not have to cover their hair, it just depends which Islamic country you are in since some are more conservative than others.

Although there was many surveys conducted on the way women should dress publicly, these women have spoken up and believe it is their preference on the way they should dress for the public. BUDDHISM



Buddhism is a very unique religion and culture. Many people do not even realize that Buddhism is a religion; many believe it is a belief. The way women are expected to dress in Buddhism is just like any other religion.

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HINDUISM

Many Hindu women dress in saris. In India, many women dress this way more than any other Hindu country. In the 70's, was when women started dressing in their traditional costumes. Western fashion has become increasingly popular for Hindu women, but many still wear a Sari.

When women visit the mandir, where they worship, they will normally wear a Sari to show that they are being conservative and respectful. Many wear exotic sick Sari's. Some women also wear Salwarkamees. This is a tunic covering loose pants. Sometimes they wear a Chunni, or a shawl, to cover their shoulders. The way Hindu women dress is almost similar to Sikh women.
