
BENJAMIN STONE, MASON, 1857

SUMMARY

The land on which the house was built apparently remained a vacant let from the time of its subdivision from the Williams' estate in 1797 through four subsequent sales.

A "house" or "dwelling" or "building" is never mentioned for this piece of land until a sale in 1868. It was only through Salem's tax records that the "built in 1857" date was figured. Evidence there clearly shows that Benjamin Stone, mason, who incidentally purchased the land in 1842, was not taxed for it until 1853. From 1853 to 1856, he was assessed only for a "section of land on Williams Street". But in 1857 he was taxed for a "house and land on Williams Street" and his valuation jumped from \$300 to \$1800.

DOCUMENTATION

"Know all men by these presents, that we, Elmer W. Liebsch, Jr. and Marjorie Liebsch, husband and wife, both of Salem, for consideration paid, grant to Phillip G. Bonin, being unmarried, of lynn, Essex County, Massachusetts with quitclaim covenants the land in said Salem, together with the buildings thereon, bounded and described as follows:

Easterly: by Williams Street, twenty-five (25.0)feet, thence Southerly: by land formerly of Cross, now or late of Ramen, Eighty-nine (89.0) feet, thence.

Westerly: by land formerly of Trask, new or late of Cotter, twenty-six feet and nine inches (26 and 9/12) thence

Northerly: by land formerly of Manning, now or late of Farnham, eighty-three (83.0) feet, to the point of beginning.

Lavery...land and buildings bounded as fellows: " (same description as for June 22, 1967 deed)

"Knew all men by these presents that I, Hannah E. Bascem of Chelsea...Guardian of Carrie Batchelder of Salem... a miner child of George W. and Caroline M. Batchelder by an order of the Court of Probate, Held at Salem on May 5, 1868 was licensed and empowered to sell and pass deeds to convey certain real estate of the said miner;...did on the 28th day of May, 1868 pursuant on the order...sell by public auction the real estate of said miner... to Mary Elizabeth Cloutman for the sum of \$428.05 she being the highest bidder. Now, therefore, know we, that I as guardian...grant to Mary Elizabeth Cloutman!.

**Possibly the Williams Street School which, according to the old Salem Directories, remained there until 1873-74.

(Since the above deeds did not contain a past reference book, I checked the Grantee Book in the REgistry of Deeds covering the years 1855-1879 Inclusive. Recorded January 1, 1868 was Benjamin Stone from Sarah Gardner et al, Book 748, page 145.)

"We, the widew and heirs of Benjamin Gardner late of Salem repemaker deceased for \$150 to us paid by Benjamin Stone of Salem, Mason, do grant, and convey to him a parcel of land situate in Salem in Williams Street, which William Gray conveyed to said Gardner by deed dated April 17, 1804 recorded Book 175 leaf 85. To have and to held the same to said Stone, his heirs and assigns to their use forever. Dated October 1, 1842."

(As read, the above deed did not make reference to boundaries or buildings. As further proof that it was the same let, I submit the following documentation.)

"...I, William Gray jr. of Salem,,,merchant, in consideration of \$200 paid by Benjamin Gardner of Salem...repemaker... de hereby grant...a piece of land situate in Williams Street in Salem and bounded as follows, Westerly by land of Stephen Webb, Southerly by land of Widew Ress, Easterly by Williams Street there measuring about twenty five feet, Northerly by my land running in a strait line from Williams Street to land of said Webb being part of the land conveyed to me by Brackley Rese by deed date January 19, 1803 and recorded in the Registry of Deeds for the County of Essex Book 172 leaf 59."

paid me by William Gray, jr. of Salem, merchant, do hereby grant, sell and convey...a piece of land in Salem Containing 31 poles and 7/10 of a pole be the same more or less and is bounded as follows, Easterly on Williams Street there measuring 110 feet, Southerly on land formerly belonging to Second there measuring ----, Westerly on land formerly belonging to Simon Forrester but now unto the said Wm. Gray, jr. there measuring 110 feet 3 inches, and Northerly on land of Meses Waldace, there measuring 75 feet with the dwelling house and buildings thereon and all the privileges thereto belonging,

being the same piece of land which Thomas Reaves conveyed to me by deed dated March 30, 1798 and Henry Williams by deed Dated April 16, 1798 and recorded in Book 163 leaf 84 and 96.4"

"I, Henry Williams of Salem, Mariner, inconsideration of one hundred and minety dollars paid by Brackley Rose of Salem, sugarbaker...do hereby grant...a piece of land containing about 19 poles be the same more or less situate in Salem and is bounded as follows to wit; Easterly on Williams Street there measuring 60 feet, Westerly on land of Jonathan Haraden there measuring 60 feet, 3 inches, Southerly on land formerly Seccombs now improved by Mrs. Rosss and Northerly on land of said Brackley Rose with the privileges thereto belonging... and Abigail Williams wife of said Henry Williams for the consideration aforesaid and one dollar more paid her by the said Rose...do hereby release and quit claim to all her right of dower in said granted premises."

*I, Thomas Reaves of Salem, baker, in consideration of \$110 paid me by Brackley Rose of Salem, sugarbaker...de grant... a piece of land situate in Salem containing 12 poles and 7/10 and bounded as follows, Easterly on Williams' Street there measuring 50 feet, Southerly on land new or lately belonging to Capt. Henry Williams there measuring 75Feet, Westerly on land of Simon Forrester there measuring 50 feet and Northerly on land of Joseph Gardner and there measuring 75 feet and to the same belonging."

Book 125 page 196 shows that John Williams sold all the land of his estate to Capt. Henry Williams. Dated March 4, 1769.
