

Book 174 page 174 July 24, 1804 \$220


Gideon Woodbury, cooper, and Margaret his wife, formerly Margaret Bell widow of Samuel Bell, sold a lot of land to John Watson. This was a portion of the estate of the late Samuel Bell.



Book 216 page 24 Dec. 29, 1817 The heirs of John Watson transferred the title to this lot of <u>land</u> to William B. and Abigail Parker, in her own right.

Book 441 page 204 Feb. 26, 1851 \$1,600 Abigail Parker, widow, sold the lot of land "with a dwelling house" to Henry Mellus of Salem, merchant.

Book 465 page 193 August 6, 1852 \$695 Henry and Annita F. Mellus sold a portion of the land conveyed by Mrs. Parker to Timothy Coughlin, tailor. This land was sold with the building thereon.



Book 2335 page 416 July 6, 1916 \$1,850

Andrew J. Byrne of Beverly, administrator of the Estate of Elizabeth J. Byrne sold the land and building to Dora Shafer wife of Julius Shafer. "The same estate conveyed to Timothy Coughlin by Henry Mellus on Aug. 6, 1852." (Elizabeth J. Byrne was the daughter of Timothy Coughlin. Mr. Coughlin died on April 20, 1891.)

Book 3137 page 591 March 5, 1938

Dora Shafer, of Malden, mortgaged the property to the Roger Conant Bank.

Book 3209 page 427 Feb. 21, 1940

Dora Shafer defaulted on the mortgage. The Roger Conant Bank then took possession.

Book 3290 page 481 April 9, 1942

Roger Conant Oo-op Bank sold the land and building to Mary L. Sadoski. The same parcel conveyed to the Roger Conant Bank by foreclosure deed of Dora Shafer Feb. 21, 1940.


Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All mpas in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.

DATE DOCUMENTATION

3 Parker Court

The Salem Historic Commission Report describes 3 Parker Ct. as:
"This simple two-story plus a pitch roof, wooden house has a
three-bay facade directly on the street. The house is close to
the ground and has a shallow lean-to roof addition in the rear.
The window sash and brackets which trim the entrance are both
later than the house."

Parker Court was laid out over land of William Parker on Jan. 1, 1819:

Since Parker Court was laid out in 1819, it seems plausible that a house or houses were on the court prior to 1831. Unfortunately, the first documented proof of a house on this land does not appear until 1831 when Mr. Parker is taxed for 3 houses on the court.
