Background to House History 160 Federal Street

Updated: 6-28-23

During the administration of Mayor Stanley Usovicz (1998-2005), the owner of 160 Boston Street, Michael Shea, received recognition for his preservation and restoration of this house with an HSI house plaque.

The plaque read:

Built for John Burbeck 1869 Second Empire Style

No full house history was created. Following is some basic history about the first owner of this house John Chamberlain Burbeck, who was a "soap boiler and tallow chandler" with a manufacturing facility in Peabody. He married to Clarissa McIntyre of Westford, Massachusetts.


