I could find out very little about William Brown that I could be sure of. There are so many Browns! He married Rebecca Upton (Wright) in 1825 and a son William was born in 1829.

SUMMARY

This attractive Gothic Revival house was built on a lot unchanged in size since William Brown purchased the land from the Pickerines; one large parcel in March of 1847 and a smaller piece in June of the same year. In 1865, his widow who had moved to Boston sold the land with the house on it to the Bartlets. Tax records show that Mr. Brown, a printer, must have begun his house right after Acquiring the land, as a "new cottage" is noted in 1847 although no tax was listed until the following year.
