Katharine A. Pond and Martha T. Pond, both unmarried, of Salem grant to Mary B. Tisbury who grants in turn back to Katharine A. Pond and Martha T. Pond the land and buildings at 19 Broad St. corner Winthrop (same as above) Being same premises conveyed to Kate B. Pond, Katharine A. Pond, Mary H. Pond, and Martha T. Pond by Deed 2413 page 580. Kate B. Pond and Mary H. Pond being deceased.

William L. Brown of Boston for \$1, and Sarah Ellen Brown in her own right and husband Nehemiah Brown for \$1 release to Rebecca Upton Brown their rights and title to (same property).

379 264 March 1, 1847

Mary O. Pickering, John Pickering both of Salem and Henry W. Pickering of Boston for \$575 paid us by William Brown, printer of Salem, convey to him the following lot of land: beginning at the N.W. bound, running E. by Broad St. 50': thence running S. 73'-5" by a private way called Winthrop St.; Thence W. 50' by other land of ours; thence N. 66'-7" by land of Orne to point begun at.

383 219 June 1, 1847

Mary O. Pickering, John Pickering both of Salem, and Henry W. Pickering of Boston for \$187.50 sell to William Brown printer of Salem a piece of land bounded E. on a private way called Winthrop St. 35' N. by other land of Brown 50'

I could find out very little about William Brown that I could be sure of. There are so many Browns! He married Rebecca Upton (Wright) in 1825 and a son William was born in 1829.


SUMMARY

This attractive Gothic Revival house was built on a lot unchanged in size since William Brown purchased the land from the Pickering's; one large parcel in March of 1847 and a smaller piece in June of the same year. In 1865, his widow who had moved to Boston sold the land with the house on it to the Bartlets. Tax records show that Mr. Brown, a printer, must have begun his house right after acquiring the land, as a "new cottage" is noted in 1847 although no tax was listed until the following year.
