Thinking that perhaps the last entry was the "key" by that I mean the mortgage to build the house I sent the above information to Mrs. Rice. Subsequently, she said the house was a much earlier period according to Mr. Edwin Small (circa 1750). So, I went back to the Registry of Deeds in Salem and could find no entry of a house on that particular site previous to the above mentioned time.

I then went to the Essex Institute and poured through books and papers there; i.e. Bentley's Diary etc. - came up with nothing.

Mr. David Proper suggested that I return to the Registry of Deeds and look for a HOUSE that perhaps had been purchased by Mr. Benjamin Carpenter and the following is what I uncovered.

2/14/1800 - Francis Bowden Dennis sold to Benjamin Carpenter his MANSION HOUSE AND BARN with land under and adjoining in Northfields so-called bounding easterly on highway leading down to great bridge so called and there measures 46' 4 1/2", southerly on land late of Joseph Pickering 70' 8", westerly on meadow land formerly of Nathaniel Ropes, Esq. deceased 42' 1/2" and northerly ..... the premises being the same which I purchased of Joseph Felt September 3, 1778

"I, Francis B. Dennis, to secure the payment of my promisory note hereinafter mentioned and in consideration of \$5.00 paid to me by Benjamin Carpenter of Salem, aforesaid merchant, the receipt of which I do hereby acknowledge and to hereby give(there followed description of property) recorded in book #136 page 102) together with all my right in law or Equity to redeem the 1/3 part of the premises by payment of \$400 and interest to Elias Grant or his assigns according to my mtge. thereof to said Elias 8/18/1797 recorded in book #162, page 220, and together with all my right in law or equity to redeem 2/3 part of premises by payment of \$794 and interest to Cornelius Thompson 8/18/1797 recorded in book #162 page 220."

As previously stated Mr. Carpenter purchased the land in 1801, and that in 1802 he owed Margaret Crowinshield Murphy \$1500.00 as a mtge. of land and dwelling house on Federal Street. The mtge. was fully paid on Sept. 7, 1810 as acknowledged by Margaret Murphy Mansfield and William Mansfield. (Her husband, John Murphy having deceased in 1800. She re-married in 1809.)



I have read with much interest Joan Bailey's excellent research on your title. When all is said and done, I am very much afraid that you are going to have to rely upon stylistic analysis alone. There really can be no assurance in connection with moved houses unless we have some specific reference to the moving. Surely there was no house on your lot before 1801, and if Ed Small says the house is earlier, then you can be sure it is. There are a number of little details about old houses, as you well know, which, if present, allow us to pinpoint the date with some accuracy, and when I am next in Salem, perhaps you will let me go over the house from top to bottom in an effort to see if we can't give you a more or less specific date.

Essex County Registry of Deeds, Vital Records: eldest son, James Wood Could married Mary Watts, April 17, 1782.

City Hall, Salem, Mass. Tax Records for year 1786 (several previous years are missing) shows James Gould paying taxes in Ward 4 for part of a house and he is listed as son of Nathanial. I also checked several years thereafter, at intervals, he, James, was still paying for the same.

Note also the account of Adm. o/e/o Nathaniel Could 7/20/1807: Rents: Mrs. Ralf Emerson and I discussed the cost of rentals in those times. According to her research. a house might well be rented for \$100 per year. A room would perhaps be rented for \$15 per year. In the building m of a house, a widow would certainly set aside room/rcoms with separate egress for rentors to help support her children, several of whom were minors. Mrs. Emerson is of the opinion that this accounts for perhaps 8 years' rental of a room in the house.

## Conclusion:

I believe that Rebecca, after the death of Nathaniel, her husband, went ahead with the plans utilizing the help of her son, James who was 21 years of age. James married in the spring after his father died. James and his bride lived in the house with Mother Gould, brothers and sister - the house being divided 3/7ths to James, 4/7ths to his mother, the widow Rebecca.

When Rebecca died (1804) her 4/7ths went to James, the eldest son who had cared for the whole family, and his wife Mary Watts Gould. Sometime before 1807 James died, and his son John (who had in turn inherited 3/7ths of this house from his father's estate) conveyed his inherited portion to his son, Robert Watts Gould in 1807, grantmother, Mary Watts Gould releasing her rights for 10 cents to Robert at that time. Mary remained in house till she died (see page 2). Robert was married at the time, his wife's name was Betsy.
