

The land was then mortgaged to John Fairfield Jr. Mr. Fairfield found himself in financial difficulty and assigned the mortgage to Dr. Oliver Hubbard on June 21, 1811 (book 194 page 141). Since the mortgage remained unpaid Dr. Hubbard filed suit. He recovered judgement and possession by November 1816.



MOTES:

The first mention of this house appears in deed book 177 page 52:

April 28, 1805 - Thomas R. Williams sold <u>a dwelling house</u> to Joseph W. Williams. This dwelling house was "standing on land of Captain Henry Williams in Williams street." The house was described as a wooden building 18' X 24' and "in the occupation of Thomas R. Williams grantor."

When the land under the house was sold, on June 2, 1809 (see deed research), no mention was made that there was a house on the property. One explanation could be that the house was the personal property of Joseph W. Williams and could not be sold with the land since it did not belong to the Henry Williams estate. Thomas R. Williams, then living in the house, intended to purchase the land and did so in the June 2nd transaction (book 186 page 113). How the house was sold back to Thomas R. Williams is not recorded. The dwelling house is definitely on this lot when the creditors of Thomas R. Williams took possession and sold it to Abraham True (book 212 page 152).

Since the house is larger than the original 18' X 24' (which the current owner says are the measurements of the portion now fronting Barton St.), the remainder of the house may have been added by Abraham True after 1816.

Thomas R. Williams

Thomas Russell Williams, the son of Henry and Abigail Williams, was born on March 30, 1783. He married Ruth Abbott on June 22, 1806.

The Youthful Recollections of Salem by Benjamin F. Browne as published in the Essex Institute Historic Collections says that there was (on Washington Sq.) "Thomas R. Williams's cabinet warehouse and manufactory; then his father, Capt. Williams's house which is now owned and occupied by William C. Barton. Thomas R. Williams and Benjamin Adams had a stable in Williams street. T.R. Williams removed to Boston and kept a boarding house. Capt. Henry Williams was a descendant from a family that in the early settlement of the town owned much of the land in that neighborhood.

Abraham True

Abraham True died on November 21, 1851. His obituary reads:

Abraham True Esq. aged 63 - Mr. True was born in Chichester, New Hampshire but came to Salem in his youth, and has been long and generally known amongst us as a most respectable and useful citizen. He was an ardent but honest politican, first as a member of the old Republican party, and subsequently of the Whig; and from the administration of General Harrison he received the commission of Naval Officer for this port. Mr. True deserved all the consideration he enjoyed, for he was a man of good sense and varied information; a man of an active conscience; a man of great kindness of heart and readiness to serve every good cause; a man who loved the praise of good men much, but the praise which cometh from God infinitely more.
