181 - 58 Feb. 25, 1807

Nathaniel Weston of Salem for \$560 sells to Benjamin Whittier and Nathan Blood a piece of land, corner of Derby and Becket Sts. bounded S on Derby St. 38'; E. on land of Jonathan Becket, 30' N. on land of heirs of Eleanor Nutting.

185 - 118 Sept. 2, 1808

Nathan Blood sells to Moses Little, physician, of Lynn for \$2,000: corner of Derby and Beckett Sts. bounded S. on Derby St. 38'; E. on land of Jonathan Becket 30'; N. on land of Nutting deceased 34'-8"; W. on Becket St. 24' to bounds of store standing thereon.

213 - 295 Property conveyed to Stephen White by will of Moses Little

241 - 31 December 29, 1825

Stephen White sells to Nathan Blood a brick store for \$2,400

240 - 165 April 13, 1826

Nathan Blood of Salem for \$2,400 sells to Chandler Flagg - "brick store conveyed to me by Stephen White."

William Goodhue from Chandler Flagg for \$2000  
a parcel of land with brick house at the corner  
of Derby and Becket Sts. bounded: S. on Derby St.  
38'; E. on land now or late of Becket 30'; N.  
on land formerly of Stephen White, now of Weston 34'-8"  
W. on Becket St. 24'

Salem Five Cents Savings Bank to J. Ganey;  
same property received from Wm. Goodhue,  
March 13, 1874 recorded Book <sup>900</sup> 100 (?) page 123:  
shop at #44 Derby St. bounded S. on Derby St. 38'  
E. on land of J. Becket 30'; N. on a private way;  
W. on Becket St.

2112 - 54 Oct. 28 1911

John Ganey sells for \$4000 to F. Rybicki  
(a brick store and #78 Derby St.) bounded on  
S. by Derby St. 64'; ② on E. by land of Connors  
24'-4" and 22'-7", and on N. by Becket Av.;  
on the W. by Becket St.
