

12 Pearl Street, otherwise known as the John A Hay House, was built between 1857 and 1858. It can be considered to have been built in the Greek Revival style, with wood shingles exterior and twin fireplaces to keep the home warm. It is situated near the north river, and its position is described in the property records as being at Easterly on Pearl Street, about 40 feet Southerly on land now or late of Francis, about 80 feet Westerly on land formerly of Salem Lead Company, about 40 feet Northernly on land formerly of Salem Lead Company, about 80 feet. It is considered a part of the Bridge Street neighborhood.

The Bridge Street Historic District, or Bridge Street Neck, is currently considered to be mostly residential. It encompasses most of a peninsula of land northeast of downtown Salem, on the route connecting Salem to Beverly, which has been the scene of residential, commercial, and industrial development since the early settlement of Salem in the 1630s. Much of Bridge Street was once called Merry Street. In its earliest days it was simply rural territory which supported Salem's first English settlement in and after 1626.





The Industrial Revolution was in full swing in the United States when the John A. Hay house was built. For better or for worse, this caused America to change. Factories offered a higher paying alternative to agricultural work, so a migration to the cities began. This caused pollution and over crowding as most cities were ill equipped to handle the influx of people. Technology, however, made huge leaps ahead during this time, and inventions such as the telephone, the steam engine, the sewing machine, the X-ray, the light bulb, and the combustible engine were created during this period.

Salem was also swept along in these changes, and the city was the backdrop to some important events. A railway, the Eastern Railroad line, was opened between Boston and Salem in 1838. Nathaniel Hawthorne, who is considered to be America's first great romantic novelist, wrote several books while staying in Salem, such as *The Scarlet Letter* and *The House of Seven Gables*. Salem was kept on the cutting edge of innovation as it was a part of the first long distance telephone call in 1877, between Yceum Hall on Church Street and Cambridge in Boston.

A closer technological achievement happened very close to the John A. Hays home on Pearl Street. A few years after Mr. Hays finished building his house, his neighbor Moses Farmer lit up his 11 Pearl Street home and became one of the first homes anywhere to be powered by electricity. Mr. Farmer was the person to invent Edison's filament light bulb, and he powered his home with batteries he installed in his basement. One can imagine the spectacle this would have caused on Pearl Street as people would come first to view the home at night. It makes one wonder how the Pearl Street neighbors thought of the nearby inventor. What we do know is that Mr. Farmer boarded with the Hays for a year in 1864, and moved in at the very next door lot.

Salem, Massachusetts, has played an important part in the development of America, from the days when proud sailing ships cleared this port in world commerce, to the present day of modern industry. But Salem has more than a background of history to make it famous throughout the world. Salem has been the birthplace of many of the world's greatest devices for the comfort and service of mankind.

Here Alexander Graham Bell developed the telephone, and the first telephone communication line was run between Salem and Boston.

Here Moses Gerrish Farmer, with a wet cell battery and a crude lamp, made one step in releasing civilization from smoky lamps and flickering tapers — gave the world a spark that led to Edison's first incandescent bulb, and thence to modern lighting as we know it today.

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John Alexander Hay was born in Ireland in 1817. He immigrated to the United States of America in 1843 and arrived in Boston, Massachusetts on July 18. He would make several trips back and forth during his lifetime but called Salem his home. The census records indicate that he worked as a shoemaker and shoe repairman. It is likely that he worked in the Bridge Street Neck District. He purchased the plot of land for 12 Pearl Street on March 31, 1857, and quickly worked on building a home for his growing family.

He and Caroline Ford married on August 2, 1849. They had four children—Mary, Joseph Howard, Ann, and Charles. Caroline remained listed as a homemaker throughout her life.

John A. Hays died sometime around 1870, and Caroline passed on the 13th of December in 1895. The home went to John's son, Joseph Howard Hays, on July 8, 1896, for \$1 and other valuable considerations—after initially going to all the children. It seems they all kept reasonably close, as the home was shared to many. Joseph worked as a painter for most of his life. One of the places he worked at was B. & M. Car Shop, which might have meant the B & M Railways boxcar shop. A handful of his relatives are also listed as working as painters there, according to directory data.

Joseph married Martha on September 8th, 1874. By the 1900 census, it listed Martha as having 7 children, but only 6 surviving. Martha was mostly a homemaker, but sometimes took up jobs as a clerk.

Joseph Howard Hays passed sometime in 1933, while Martha passed earlier, on April 14, 1910. At this point it passed out of the family and was sold to two brothers, Jacob Galper and Abraham Galper, on October 10th, 1933, for \$1,600.00. The brothers were both born in Russia but became naturalized citizens of the United States. Their father, Sidore Galper, came to the United States first in 1910, and called for the rest of the family to come later. Both brothers came in 1913, and naturalizing in 1919. As the family is listed at JewishGen Online Worldwide Burial Registry, one can assume they were escaping the horrible conditions the Jewish community was facing in Russia at that time.

Jacob Galper was drafted for both World War 1 and World War 2. It appears that he lied about his age on the first draft in order to join, as he listed his birthday as March 24, 1896, on that card, but in other places it lists his date of birth as 1907. When he wasn't enlisted he worked as a clothier at North Shore Gown Company, where he was listed as the proprietor. His shop received damage from a fire that broke out next door in March of 1932. He did not appear to have married, and passed away January 26, 1973.

Abraham Sidney Galper was born on the 21st of February 1909. He then went on to graduate from Salem State University in 1930. Abraham married Madeline Sheper around 1937, and was also drafted into World War 2 like his brother. He became a teacher at the Vocational High School once he returned, later at Salem High School, and was the head of the Business Department. He passed away August 19th, 1969. There was a scholarship set up in his name through the Temple Shalom on Lafayette Street in Salem.

The Galpers invested in several properties so never lived in the residence, instead it appears most of the Galper family remained at 100 School Street. On December 27th, 1951, the brothers sold 12 Pearl Street to Daniel Florence Crowley. Mr. Crowley was a lawyer, notary, and Justice of the peace. He was born the 28th of August 1884. He was drafted in both World War 1 and World War 2. He attended Northeastern University Law School and worked as the city of Salem's purchasing agent from 1918 to 1923. He never married.

On 1954 Daniel Crowley added Edna May Stone to the deed. Their relation to each other is unknown, and any mentions list Mr. Crowley as a lodger or boarder. They had lived in the same home together about ten years prior, but other members also listed as boarders remained the same as prior to the 1951 purchase as well. Edna May Stone was born 19th of February 1898. She never married and worked as a clerk or saleswoman. Daniel Florence Crowley passed away September 10th, 1957. Edna May Stone passed on the 25th of June, 1970.

Mecseslaus S. Nicgorski and Eugene J. Nicgorski, brothers, purchased 12 Pearl Street on December 3rd, 1970 for \$15,000.00.

Eugene Nicgorski was born November 5th, in 1906. He graduated from Salem High School in 1923 and immediately attended Boston College. He graduated there with honors in 1927. During that same year he was made secretary to the Unite Polish Organization. After this, Eugene attended Boston Medical University, graduating in 1931 and becoming a doctor. He married Gertrude M. Gardner, who owned a hat shop and was a member of the Business and Professions Club of Salem, on June 3rd, 1934, but filed for divorce due to abandonment on August 22nd, 1994. This was granted in October of that same year. They had no known children together. He passed August 24th, 1985.

Mecseslaus Nicgorski was drafted into WW2 as enlisted. During this time he had poor teeth and was diagnosed with gingivitis. This caused him to be hospitalized and have a tooth removed. His enlistment records indicate he was semiskilled in the production on rubber goods. He remained in the Army until 1946, and afterwards worked as a laborer. Mecseslaus remained unmarried and passed on April 11th, 1974.

Neither of the brothers lived in the home, and once Mecseslaus passed Eugene quickly sold 12 Pearl Street. Donald R. Blais and Nancy E. Blais purchased the home on December 30th, 1974, for \$22,000.00.

It appears that the Wards had been renting the home prior to purchase, as they had resided there since 1970. The couple is still alive as of this writing, so no research is done due to privacy concerns.

The Blais's sold 12 Pearl Street in 1994 to Gloria Ward and Paul Ward for \$126,000.00. The Wards also appear to be living at the time of this writing, so no research will be done due to privacy concerns.

The Wards sold the home in 2006 to David M. Brickner and Claire A. Cloutier for \$330,000.00. Mr. Brickner and Ms. Cloutier appear to be the current owners as of this writing.

Details of the show were cared for by Miss Brennan and the class. This work was done in connection with the Salesmanship course.

Again the class was together in presenting their Easter Chapel Exercises. They showed the common significances of Easter—the coming of Spring with birds and flowers, Easter eggs, bunnies, Spring clothes, and finally the real meaning—the Resurrection.

Another event that is always outstanding in the junior year is the trip to Boston conducted by Mr. Phillips. The class was escorted through Ginn & Company, the Stock Exchange, and the Ford Assembling Plant. As in other things, we found that the actual working strengthens the knowledge gained from the theoretical. Certainly scientific management in business organization was clearly visualized.

Our doings would not be complete without mentioning the textile exhibit which is now under construction by the Salesmanship class. It will, no doubt, soon be completed and be added to the department as a permanent future reference.


