


# 387 Lafayette Street

The land on which this house stands was a small portion of the parcel called the John Pickering lot:



Lafayette or "the new road to Marblehead" was laid out in 1737. The road was occasioned, primarily, by the building of the mill at Forest river two years previously. It was called the new road to Marblehead in 1755; Fayette street in 1840; and Lafayette street since 1849. (Essex Antiquarian, Vol. 12 Pg. 112)

In the early 1870's this was a part of the Pratt Farm. On Aug. 13, 1877 Samuel Pratt sold a lot of land, for the sum of \$360, to Mary J. and Joanna L. Ahern. On Jan. 19, 1878 a triangular piece of land was sold by Mr. Pratt to Mary and Joanna Ahern for the sum of \$33.60:

1896 Nov. 2 - Mrs. Margaret J. B. Ahern, widow of David, age 69 years, 5 months, 6 days, died at her residence 387 Lafayette St., after a brief illness. She was a regular attendant at the Immaculate Conception church. She leaves six daughters and a son to mourn her loss, besides a large circle of friends. She was a native of Lowell. (Salem News)

1897 March 15 - Robert M. Ahern, aged 39 years, died at his home, 387 Lafayette St. on Saturday afternoon. The deceased was born in Salem and was the son of David and the late Margaret J. Ahern, who died last November. The funeral was held from the Immaculate Conception church this morning and was attended by a large number of friends of the deceased. Burial at St. Mary's cemetery. (Salem News)



1910 March 26 - At 387 Lafayette Street, Miss Margaret J. Ahern daughter of the late David and Margaret.

Miss Margaret J. Ahern, a greatly beloved young woman, died at her home, 387 Lafayette street, this morning, of pneumonia, after a four days illness. She was a charter member of the Father Conway Court of Forresters, and formerly a member of the choir of the church of the Immaculate Conception.

She leaves three sisters and a very large circle of friends to mourn her death. (Salem News)

1924 Sept. 2 - Joanna L. Ahern and Anna A.V. Ahern (the only remaining heirs) sold the land and building to Emma S. Almy:





This transaction was subject to the grantor's right to occupy the premises free of rent until Oct. 1, 1924. (book 2611 page 14)

1926 July 1 - Emma S. Almy sold the land and building to Ethel R. Harkins, wife of John C. "The same conveyed by deed of Joanna L. Ahern and Anna A.V. Ahern on Sept. 2, 1924." (book 2685 page 574) The Harkins mortgaged the house to the Salem Savings Bank. This mortgage was foreclosed in Dec. 1936. (book 3094 page 166)

1937 Feb. 3 - The Salem Savings Bank, holder of a mortgage from Ethel R. Harkins to Salem Savings Bank July 1, 1926, sold to Dorothy B. Almy and Alice F. Emmerton the land and building at 387 Lafayette St. (book 3100 page 317)

1957 Sept. 19 - The Merchants National Bank, Clarence A. Bonner and Caroline E. Derby trustees under the will of Alice F. Emmerton sold to Donald S. Emmerton the land and building on the east side of Lafayette St.





"Meaning to convey the same premises conveyed to Dorothy B. Almy and Alice F. Emmerton by deed from the Salem Savings Bank Feb. 3, 1937 book 3100 page 317 and a portion of premises conveyed to Dorothy B. Almy and Alice F. Emmerton by deed of Emma S. Almy Dec. 21, 1921 book 2928 page 271. The interest of said trustees being 1/3 acquired by will of Alice F. Emmerton and 2/3 already vested in grantee through wills of Dorothy B. Almy and Alice F. Emmerton." (book 4404 page 108)

1961 Dec. 28 - Donald S. Emmerton and Ann J. his wife sold the land and building to Robert D. Mahoney the present owner. (book 4864 page 33)

Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.
