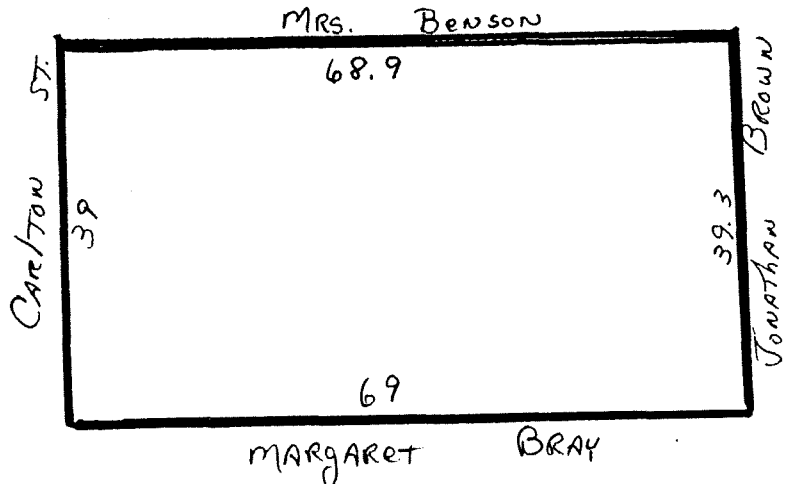

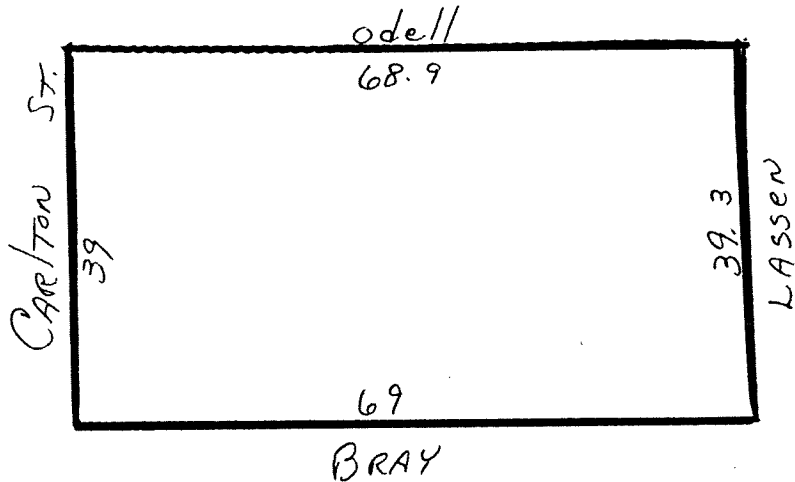

15 CARLTON ST.

PERIOD: FEDERAL (1790-1830)

"The outstanding feature of this two-story plus pitch roof gable-end-to-the street, wooden house is its Federal style entrance in the middle of the five-bay south side of the house. The trim includes a semicircular fanlight, which breaks into the base of an overhead pediment trimmed with fine dentil strips. On either side of the door there is a flat pilaster trimmed with horizontal projecting strips of molding which are level with the top of the door frame. The windows in this house are modern." (Salem Historic District Study Committee Investigation)

The land on which this house stands was once the property of Hannah Crowninshield as her dower in the insolvent estate of her husband Jacob. She was obliged to sell it in 1791 to Elias Hasket Derby, her sister-in-law's husband. He sold it to Jacob Crowninshield's son Benjamin a shipmaster and later collector of the port at Marblehead.

Benjamin Crowninshield, son of Jacob and Hannah (Carlton) Crowninshield, was born on February 16, 1758. He married Mary Lambert on November 9, 1780. As a master mariner during the War of 1812 he commanded several ships including the "AMERICA", "JOHN" and "ALEXANDER". After the war he commanded "CLEOPATRAS BARGE" for George Crowninshield. Capt. Benjamin died on November 2, 1836.

It was during Benjamin's ownership that this house first appears, but this was not until a deed was passed in 1816. Since the month of this transfer was February, it seems safe to assume that the house was completed prior to the winter months and that the date 1815 would be appropriate. Unfortunately, the gap between the mortgage of 1807 (lot of land) and 1816 (land with dwelling house) can not be filled. It is possible that Benjamin Crowninshield had an agreement to allow Joseph Danforth, housewright, to build on the land, but did not give title until 1816 (the other three lots were sold by 1809). Neither man is taxed for a house on the land until 1817 when Danforth is taxed for a p(ar)t h(ouse) and land \$600. The notation for part of a house indicates that a tenant was paying the other portion. Benjamin Crowninshield lived in the Crowninshield-Bentley House (now on the Essex Institute property) until about 1811 when he moved to Danversport. He was not taxed for the land on Carlton St.

I, James Arrington of Salem in the  
County of Essex, Master Mariner, being of  
sound and disposing mind and memory  
but mindful of the uncertainty of life do  
make, publish and declare my last will  
and Testaments in the manner following  
Inprimis. I order my executrix herein  
after named to pay all my just debts and  
funeral charges, as soon as may be after  
my decease.

Item - I give, devise, and bequeath, to my daugh-  
ter, Mary Elizabeth, wife of Edward Peirce, the western  
half of the dwelling house, number sixteen High St.  
Salem, with the cellar thereunto, together with the right  
to use in common with the other half, the doors, entry-  
ways, stairs, and both yards, to have and to  
hold during her life, and at her decease to go to  
her legal representatives; and also the sum of three  
hundred dollars.

Item: I give, devise, and bequeath to my son  
James Arrington, the dwelling house and land, num-  
ber Eight and a half, Julian St. Salem, to have  
and to hold during his life, and at his decease  
to his legal representatives; and also the sum  
of three hundred dollars.

Item. I give, devise, and bequeath, to my son, Benjamin R. Arrington, the eastern half of the dwelling house, number sixteen High St. Salem, with the cellars thereunder, together with the right to use in common with the other half the doors, entry-way, stairs, and both yards, to have and to hold during his life, and at his decease, to go to his legal representatives; and also the sum of three hundred dollars.

Item. If during my life I should dispose of any of the property devised to any of my said three children, then I order my executor, herein after named, to invest the sum of seven hundred dollars, for each of my said children as whose property above devised, I shall dispose of, in a small house and land, and to give the deed thereof to such child or children, in addition to the three hundred dollars above bequeathed, to have and to hold, during his or their lives, and then to their legal representatives.

Item. I give, devise, and bequeath the rest and residue of my property, real and personal, to Capt. Philip A. Pihl, and Mr. Joseph Towne, of said Salem, to have and to hold, for and upon the following purposes; and trusts - I do invest such personal estate

securely - II. To pay to my beloved wife Mary Ann half yearly so much of the income and improvement of my real and personal estate, as shall be amply sufficient to comfortably support her, and to maintain and educate any minor children I may leave during their minority - her support to continue during her life - III. From the accumulation of said income, if any, after satisfying the above trusts, and if not, from the proceeds of a sale of so much of my personal estate as shall be necessary, to pay the sum of one thousand dollars to every one of my minor children, as soon as they respectively arrive at full age; and I hereby express the wish that my said children may invest said sum, or the larger part thereof, in a homestead for themselves, and families - IV. After the decease of my said wife, and when all of my children shall have arrived at the age of twenty one years, and those who are minors be paid, every one a thousand dollars, - to equally divide the remainder of my estate, real and personal, among all my children, and the issue of any deceased child, or children, share and share alike, but such issue to take the portion that would have belonged to its or their parent if living.

Item, I constitute and appoint my
