

Charles Roberts died on July 2, 1862. No obituary notice could be found for Charles Roberts. He was a butcher doing business at 116 Boston street in 1850 and called a porkdealer in 1859.

Mary Roberts died on Nov. 30, 1916. Her obituary appeared in the Salem Evening News:

Died two days after Birthday Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Roberts

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth, widow of Charles Roberts, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Epes Cogswell 31 Flint St., yesterday. She was born in Portsmouth, N.H. November 28, 1824.

She was married at the age of 17 and moved with her husband to Peabody. Theirs was the only house then on Aborn St. Her husband died when she was 34 years of age leaving her with several children. Later, she moved to Flint St., Salem, when she has since made her home.

She was remarkably active during her life and until the last year was active around the house. She was an expert needlewoman and since her 80th birthday she devoted much time to crocheting, making over 100 yards of lace, as well as piecing bed spreads.

Mrs. Roberts was much loved by her friends and by the young people.

She leaves a son Urban Chase Roberts of Peabody, a daughter Mrs. Epes Cogswell of Salem, a grandson Frank Warren and a great grandson Fred Warren Roberts.
