## 6 River Street

"A large square, central chimney dominates this two-story, pitch roof house and lean-to addition. The central front doorway directly on the street is decorated with simple pilasters and entablature. The door itself is modern." (Salem Historic Commission Report)

River Street was called a way in 1739; road 1773; private road 1778; lane 1782; River Street in 1796. (Essex Antiquarian, vol. 7 page 116)

The lot on which this house stands was part of a large tract of land owned by the Beckford family for many years. When the Beckfords sold off this land most buyers bought one lot on the south side of the lane and one across on the north extending to the river. This was the case when on August 3, 1784 John Beckford, yeoman, sold for 41 pounds, 6 shillings to John Chandler, housewright, a lot of land (no buildings) containing 12 3/4 poles:

North - on lane 49'2"

East - on Ebenezer Beckford 68'

South - on John Beckford 50'5"

West - on Asa Killam 70'

Also a lot containing  $10\frac{1}{2}$  poles (no buildings)

(6 River St. lot) North - by a stone wall and flats 49'

East - on Ebenezer Beckford 58'

South - on lane 49'

West - on Asa Killam 59'

John Chandler sold the second lot of land to William Ferguson, taylor, on Oct. 26, 1789, for the sum of 5 pounds, 8 shillings. (book 151 page 159)




Josiah Woodberry, late of Salem now of Boxford, sold the land and dwelling house to Tobias Davis, mariner. "The same which I purchased by two deeds. One from William Ferguson and one from Benjamin Punchard."


Book 808 page 298 Oct. 13, 1870

Tobias Davis, master mariner, sold the land and dwelling house to William Knight, cordwainer. "The same I purchased of Josiah Woodberry on March 22, 1816."

The heirs of William Knight sold the land and buildings at 6 River Street to Benjamin Cutts. "Being a portion of the estate conveyed to William Knight by Tobias Davis on Feb. 2, 1818." The remaining portion (#8) was sold by the Knight heirs to James Moncrieff.



Book 809 page 255 Nov. 7, 1870 \$1,530 Benjamin Cutts sold the land and buildings at 6 River Street to James Moncrief.
"Except a strip  $10\frac{1}{2}$  feet adjoining my land." Mr. Moncrief mortgaged this property to Mr. Cutts on the same day.



Book 1296 page 588 Dec. 1, 1890

James Moncrief defaulted on the mortgage. This mortgage had been assigned by Benjamin Cutts to Samuel Colby on May 24, 1873 and by James Gillis administrator of said Samuel Colby to Emma L. Wilson. "Now Emma L. Wilson by virtue and in execution of the power conveyed in the mortgage for \$1,425 sold the property to James Landers."

Book 2591 page 469 March 31, 1924 Bridget Landers adminstratrix of the estate of James Landers sold the real estate of the deceased to Bridget Landers. One parcel being #6 & #8 River Street.

James Moroney of Lynn, executor of the will of Bridget Landers sold the land and buildings #6, #8 & #10 River Street to Michael J. O'Rourke.

Michael J. O'Rourke sold the land and buildings on River St. to John J. Brennan. "The same estate conveyed by deed of James Moroney on Jan. 27, 1921."

John J. Brennan conveyed the land and buildings to Emma S. Almy and Donald Emmerton. "Being the same premises conveyed by deed of Michael J. O'Rourke on Dec. 1, 1922."

Emma S. Almy and Donald S. Emmerton of Almy Trust sold the land and buildings to Albert Demeule. The same premises conveyed to these grantors by deed of John J. Brennan on August 17, 1923. Mr. Demeule mortgaged the property to The Almy Trust. The mortgage was foreclosed and the title transferred to the Warren Five Cents Savings Bank on June 16, 1941.

Book 3260 page 118 June 20, 1941 The Warren Five Cents Savings Bank sold the land and buildings labeled B, C & D on the plan to Phillip Saraceno.

Book 4497 page 452 Sept. 24, 1958 Phillip Saraceno, widower, sold the land and buildings called B, C & D on the plan to Carmella P. Hall. "For title see deed of Warren 5¢ Savings Bank."

Book 7193 page 77 August 18, 1983 The Carmella P. Hall estate sold the land and buildings at 6 River Street, called lot B on the plan, to Robert C. Bramble trustee.

Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.

## DATE DOCUMENTATION

The first mention of a house on this lot appears in deed book 165 page 95 (1792). Since Mr. Ferguson owned the land by late 1789 and is listed in the tax records as paying an increase in property tax for the year 1790, it seems safe to assign the date of 1790 to this house. This date is also substantiated by the 1790 census where William Ferguson's household (1 white male over 16, 2 white males under 16 and 3 white females) is listed along with Robert Wallis and Stephen Driver, other owners and occupants of property on the north side of River Street. (First Census of the United States, page 94)

A few changes have occurred in the 6 River Street house, one by disaster and at least one by design:

1802 April 16 - Yesterday, about 10 o'clock in the forenoon, another fire broke out, in the house of Mr. Woodbury, housewright in River Street. It was probably kindled by sparks from the chimney, which, falling upon the roof, soon made its way through, to beds and other combustables that were under the roof, and got to a considerable height before it was discovered; but the house being low and small it was soon got under, but not without considerable damage to the building and contents.

1890 a permit was obtained to "raise the roof" on #6 River St.
