

"The main highway, now called Boston street, was the ancient road from Salem to Salem Village and Boston. It was called a road in 1717; the main road or street in 1721; the country road in 1724; Boston road in 1759; great country road leading to Salem in 1795; Boston street in 1795; road leading to Boston in 1797; West street in 1813; road leading from the South meeting-house to Salem in 1814; and since then Boston street."

The land on which this house stands was part of what was known as Trasks Plain. This was undivided common land and was under the control of the Proprietors of the Common Lands. A proprietors meeting was held on the second day of February 1718/9. It was voted that since several petitions had been received, for small parcels of land on Trask Plain, a Grand Committee be appointed to dispose of small house lots fronting on the Plains highway. The lots were sold with the understanding that "whosoeuer shall purchase any of sd House Lotts Shall be obliged to build on them (by) Three years Time from this day."

On January 15, 1719/20 the Grand Committee sold about one quarter of an acre of land, on Trasks Plain, to Samuel Bell a bricklayer.



Under the stated conditions of the sale, Samuel must have had his "mansion house" completed when he took Elizabeth Foster, the daughter of David and Hannah (Buxton) Foster, as his bride, on December 6, 1721. A mortgage, taken by Samuel, in September of 1758 indicates that there was a mansion house, barn, bakehouse and other buildings on the lot at that time. (book 105 page 123).
