

IN ORDER TO FIND THE EXACT LOCATION OF THIS BUILDING ONE ADDITIONAL SOURCE SHOULD BE TRIED - THE SALEM GAZETTE FOR 1869. THE BUILDING MAY HAVE BEEN ADVERTISED FOR SALE. UNFORTUNATELY, THE 1860-1869 ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE ARE AT THE NORTHEAST DOCUMENT CENTER BEING MICRO-FILMED. IT IS NOT KNOWN WHEN THIS PROJECT WILL BE COMPLETED. ADMITTEDLY, THIS IS A LONG SHOT BUT IT SHOULD BE TRIED. WHEN THE NEWSPAPERS ARE RETURNED TO THE ESSEX INSTITUTE A CHECK WILL BE MADE.

School street was a very early highway. It as called ye highway in 1685; the path in 1707; a lane or highway in 1790; lDark lane in 1798; the road leading from Obadiah Groce's corner to Frye's mills in 1801; street from North street to Frye's mills in Danvers in 1806; the road to Frye's mills in 1808; schoolhouse lane in 1833, and School street as early as 1851.

The land on which this house stands was part of a large parcel owned by Thomas and Mary Ann Symonds in the 1860's. The Symonds sold this lot of land to Harriet Wellman, wife of George O., on May 11, 1868 for \$400: (Book 745 Page 167)



George and Harriet Wellman lived next door, at 4 School St. which was owned by Devereaux Dennis. When Mr. Dennis sold the house at 4 School St. to James Grover in the spring of 1869 George Wellman was forced to take action. Since this was a very chaotic year for North Salem (the selectmen had decided to widen North St. the whole length from Federal St., over the old North Bridge and up to School St. This meant moving every building on the south side of North St. back or off of the new line of the street.) Mr. Wellman took advantage of the situation and applied for a permit (Aug. 1869) to move a building from the corner of Mason and North Streets to the corner of School and Buffum Streets.

The house was on the lot by the time the 1870 tax assessments were made:

Harriet Wellman died on June 7, 1916. An inventory of her estate listed a house at 14 School St. valued at \$2,000; land \$500 this was subject to a mortgage of \$1,400.

Mrs. Wellman bequeathed all property to her husband during his natural life and at his deceased to her grandson Arthur W. Eggleston for the term of his natural life; and at his deceased to his children Ethel May, Ruth G. and Melba O. Eggleston in equal shares (probate #124593 - see appendix A)

George O. Wellman died on Dec. 9, 1918. His obituary appeared in the Salem Evening News:

"George Wellman, formerly of Salem, died in Chelsea Soldiers home, last night. He enlisted in G.D. First Mass Heavy Artillery, July 5, 1861, and was discharged from Co. I August 16, 1865. He was a member of Post 34 G.A.R. and John Endecott Lodge A.O.U.W. He was 84 years and 6 months old. The funeral was held at the Dickson Chapel, Greenlawn Cemetery, with the Rev. Davis of the Calvary Baptist Church officiating."


