Although the current owners ran into some difficulties in their investigations of the early deeds of this property, we were able to establish a precise dating of this house by consulting the Salem Street Books, a collection of handwritten tax records organized by ward and street and listing the address of each dwelling, its owner, and other adult male inhabitants, together with their poll, personal and real property liability and their ages.

No. 37 Irving Street is not listed in the 1873 Street Book; it appears as "unfinished" and with a value of \$500 in the 1874 Street Book, while the 1875 Street Book values it at \$1400 and lists occupants George W. Pratt, 44 years old, and George E. Pratt, 21. In both 1874 and 1875, Mrs. Mary Drinan appears as its owner.

Taking this together with the house's depiction in the 1874 <u>Atlas of the City of Salem</u>, we may state with assurance that No. 37 Irving Street was built in 1874 for Mrs. Mary Drinan.

Reference to book and page are deed books located at The Registry of Deeds, Salem, Ma. The Guardian's Bonds were taken from case # 38046 (Drinan, Mary) listed in The Essex County Probate Docket, Volume 22, Page 327. The map in this report is not exact and is used to illustrate said property.

#### 37 IRVING STREET

In 1857, The Salem Directory listed John and Mary Drinan as residing at 76 North Street with John in the charcoal business. The couple moved to a house at the foot of Ives Street in 1859 where they continued to operate a charcoal buisness. At this time, The Drinans had three children; David (b. 2/5/1854), Joanna (b. 5/29/1856) and Ellen (b. 3/14/1858). By 1861, The Drinans had moved to Irving Street. On December 9, 1862, Mary Drinan purchased four lots of land located on Phillips (lots 22 and 23) and Irving Street (lots 34 and 35) from Eben S. Poor of S. Danvers, Ma for \$650 (See Registry of Deeds Book 645, Page 92)

The 1869 Salem Directory listed John Drinan as residing and operating a charcoal business at 10 Irving Street. By 1869, four more children were born to John and Mary Drinan; John (b. 1/29/1860), Catharine (b. 6/19/1863), Mary (b. 11/21/1867) and James (b. 12/21/1869). John Drinan died in 1870 or 1871. Mary Drinan and her children moved to 39 Irving Street in 1872. The 1874 Salem Directory listed Mrs. John Drinan and David Drinan as residing at 39 Irving, where David operated a charcoal business.

The Salem Street books of 1874 listed a house in an unfinished state as of May,1874 located at 37 Irving Street, valued at \$500 and built for Mary Drinan. In 1875, the house at 37 Irving Street was valued at \$1400 and had it's first tenants in George W. Pratt and George E. Pratt.

According to the 1893-94 Salem Directory, Mary Drinan, widow of John, died on July 15, 1892. She had resided at 39 Irving Street with her two sons, John and James, as boarders.

MARY DRINAN : PROFILE

The exact year of Mary Drinan's birth is difficult to determine. According to the 1870 census of the City of Salem (Ward 6, Page 8, July 11, 1870), Mary Drinan was listed as being 37 years old which would make her year of birth, 1833. According to the Death Records, City of Salem 1888 - 1896, Volume 18, Page 69, Mary Drinan was age 52 at the time of her death making her birth year, 1840.

As recorded in the Death Records, located in the City Clerk's office in Salem's City Hall, Mary (McDonald) Drinan was born in Ireland to John McDonald and Johannah Ahearn of Ireland. She died in her home at 39 Irving Street on July 15, 1892. She was listed as widowed and a housewife. The cause of her death was phtlusis pulmonalis. The physician in attendance was A. Kemble and the undertaker was T.F. Little. The place and date of interment was Dorchester, Massachusetts on July 18, 1892.

The 1870 Salem Census listed Mary Drinan's trade or occupation as "keeping house". The value of her real estate was \$3,000 and the value of her personal estate was \$700. The census failed to list her husband, John therefore placing his death sometime prior to July,1870. John Drinan was also born in Ireland. Mary Drinan's children; David (16), Johanna (14), Ellen B. (12), John B. (10), Catharine (8) were listed as "at school" while Minnie (2) and James (6 mos.) were listed as "at home".

The ages of the Drinan children in the 1870 census are consistent with their birth dates, therefore, Mary Drinan was most likely 37 years old in 1870 and born in the year, 1833. She was 59 when she died.

The Saturday, July 16, 1892 edition of The Salem Evening News printed the following on page 4, column 4:

DIED.

Drinan. - In Salem, July 15, Mary, widow of John Drinan. [Funeral from ST. James church, Monday, at 9 A.M. ]
