



1893 June 20 - John H. Bickford was granted a permit to build a new house at 34 Buffum St. 36' X 50' (Salem Evening News June 21, 1893)

1894 September 21 - John H. Bickford, electrical engineer is soon to erect a modern dwelling house on Buffum St. (Salem Evening News)

1894 October - The old Smith house was removed (this house had been in the Smith family since 1836). A permit was issued to move the building from 34 Buffum to Myrtle St. (now Tremont) the size was 44' X 15' X 21' (Salem Evening News Oct. 17, 1894).

1895/6 John H. Bickford was living at 32 Buffum St., while 34 Buffum is listed as being vacant. (Salem <u>Directory</u>)

1897/8 Mr. Bickford was living in his new house 34 Buffum St. (Salem Directories).

Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.

JOHN H. BICKFORD

"John H. Bickford has achieved an enviable reputation as a consulting electrical engineer, and is a native of Alton, N.H., where he was born in 1860. Coming to Salem at an early age, he attended the public schools. He later studied electrical engineering for which he possessed a natural aptitude and finally secured a postion as inspector of the Salem division of the Boston and Northern Telephone company. His skill in his profession speedily became apparent, and he was afterwards offered and accepted the position of constructing engineer for the Sprague Electric Railway and Motor company, New York, which position he acceptably filled for three years, spending some time in the south and west. Subsequently he accepted the position of chief engineer of the Naumkeag Street Railway. years ago he opened his present office in the Naumkeag building. Among the most important works designed and constructed by Mr. Bickford may be mentioned the Lynn and Boston street railway plant, the entire plant of the Scranton (Pa.) Traction company, the Reading (Pa.) and Manchester (N.H.) street railway plants. Mr. Bickford also designed and carried out the plans of the very extensive plant of the New York and Queens County railway company, covering the entire area of Queens county and erected at a cost of over \$3,000,000. lighting plant of the Electric Illuminating and Power company of Long Island City and many other works of equal importance were carried out by him. Within the past six months (1897) he has added to his regular business an architectural branch and has associated with him H. P. Graves, a very clever and most promising young architect. Mr. Bickford also maintains an office at 29 Broadway, New York." (Illustrated History of Salem and Environs compiled by C. B. Gillespie)
