


Henry W. Balcomb sold a portion of the lot called #67 to Lucinda Nichols, wife of Samuel B. Nichols. This transaction included a building on the property.



-Book 872 page 223 Jan. 8, 1873 \$750

Land Court #7697 Jan. 2, 1929 Samuel B. and Lucinda Nichols sold the land and building to Henry Libby. The same land described in book 754 page 203.

By petition of Bessie M. Dorman, #13095, the title was transferred to Bessie M. Dorman, wife of Arthur W. Dorman. The boundaries being changed to: #7697 (cont.)



Land Court #15355 Sept. 13, 1944 The title was transferred to Esther M. Murphy of Lynn. The same property as described in certificate #7697.

Land Court #15356 Sept. 13, 1944 The title was placed in the names of both Arthur W. and Bessie M. Dorman. The same described in certificate #15355.

Land Court #46522 Dec. 14, 1976 Mark F. Lovely and Evelyn L. Lovely, his wife, were certified as the owners of 4 Phillips St.

Land Court #51174 Nov. 13, 1981 \$49,900 Mark F. and Evelyn L. Lovely sold the land and buildings at 4 Phillips St. to Lawrence D. and Susan M. Ash. "Being the same premises to us conveyed by Certificate of Title No. 46522 registered on December 14, 1976 in the Land Court Department of the Essex South District Registry of Deeds. (Document No. 159752)"

## DATE DOCUMENTATION

The first mention of a building on this land appears in the 1860 tax records: "shop - Henry Balcomb". A change occured in 1868: "shop on land, Henry W. Balcomb. Sold and altered to a dwelling house."

Henry W. Balcomb was born in Clementsport, Nova Scotia. He began a contracting business in Salem in 1851 and was instrumental in building many houses in this city. He was joined in the business by several brothers and nephews. Mr. Balcomb was in business until 1884, when ill health compelled him to retire.

Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.
