

James Smith, as stated above, was born in England in 1810. He married Sarah, the daughter of Jacob and Hannah Hiltz, in Salem on September 4, 1843. Captain Smith died, in Somerville, on February 23, 1853 at the age of 43. An inventory of his estate (probate #53552) follows:

Mrs. Sarah N. Smith - The funeral of Mrs. Sarah Noble Smith was held at her late home 15 Barr street, yesterday afternoon, Rev. Harry J. Newton of the Crombie Street Church officiated many friends attended and Mrs Quimby sang. There were beautiful floral tributes. The burial was in Harmony Grove cemetery, Rev. Mr. Newton conducting the committal services.

Sarah E. Smith died on December 3, 1914. In her will, written on August 15, 1912, after a bequest of \$500 to the Crombie St. Church, she left all her estate to her mother Sarah N. Smith. If her mother be deceased then all to Doris Alden Brien and Denaes Gray Brien the children of William C. and Abbie Brien of Dorcester, MA. Her personal estate totaled \$6,858.68 including money, furniture and coal in the cellar. The house was valued at \$1,000 and the land \$600.

Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.

The lot on which this house stands was in the part of Salem called North Fields. There was very little development, in North Fields, until about 1806 and in 1808, Dr. Bentley records in his diary: "walked over in Northfields. The new roads and improved cultivation has made a great change and had Capt. Jonathan Mason lived, he would have accelerated their progress. Now several square, three-storied houses are built and Northfields are rising in competition with any part of the town. Only one road (North street) was formerly passable leading to Waters' bridge (Danversport), now (1808) Orne and School streets are open and good, and the lower road upon North river (Mason street) is very good."

"Almost all of the section east of Tremont and north of School streets, excepting half a dozen houses right on the street, was Barr's pasture, containing nut trees and oaks, and pasturing for cows, and is now covered with houses." (Northfields by Charles Symonds)
