





Reference to book and page are deed books at the Registry of Deeds. Probate numbers are cases at Probate Court. Both offices are located in the same building on Federal St. All maps in this report are not meant to be exact, just for illustration purposes.

NOTES:

"This is a small simple, two-story plus pitch roof, wooden house with little architectural detail. One wonders why the western, second-story window is lower than the others. The small roof and supporting brackets over the front door appear to be a later addition." (Salem Historic District Study Committee Investigation)

Mr. Bancroft apparently commenced building this house immediately after his purchase of the land in 1806. The tax records show a slight increase in his 1807 valuation. He was taxed \$300 per year from 1800 to 1806. In 1807 this was raised to \$400. The important change being that the 1807 rate was for a part of a house indicating that a tenant was paying the remaning tax on a house worth more than Mr. Bancroft's \$400 assessment.

Daniel Bancroft Jr., the son of Daniel and Hannah (Symonds) Bancroft, was born around 1772. He married Sally Cloutman on August 5, 1794. Daniel Bancroft Jr. died on September 9, 1844 at the age of 72.

Daniel Jr. is mentioned in Felt's History of Salem:

Architecture - A genius for this was exhibited in some of our earliest buildings. A few who have exercised it and are now recollected, are as follow. The McIntires, Daniel Bancroft, who designed the noted Derby Mansion and other edifices, was of the number. So was his son Daniel.
