


East 75' by City of Salem South 139.6' by Webb's land West 75' by Devereux







John H. Parsons and Joseph M. Parsons sold the land and buildings to James O. Safford, John Kilborn and Emery K. Benson all of Salem, Trustees of the Fund for the Purchase or Leasing of a Rectory for the use of the Rector of St. Peter's Church. The same land and building described in book 921 page 48. The declaration of trust was recorded in book 1195 page 213 (appendix A).

Book 1034 page 270 April 12, 1880 (side #4) A straw deed was drawn by which Charles and Sarah A. Bates conveyed the property to George A. Curwin who in turn conveyed it back to Sarah A. Bates.



Book 2380 page 395 Oct. 26, 1917 \$4,200 (side #2) William P. McMullan, William O. Safford, and George Taylor the trustees under a declaration of trust dated November 3, 1877 conveyed the land and buildings, the same as described in book 921 page 48, to Statira V. Hulbert. (The trustees were changed many time over the years as recorded in book 1409 page 53, book 1474 page 162, book 1590 page 488 and book 2122 page 538.)

Book 2741 page 380 Sept. 29, 1927 (side #2) Statira V. Hulbert conveyed the land and buildings to Harry T. Hadley. The same premises conveyed by the deed of the Trustees of the St. Peter's Parish recorded in book 2380 page 395.

Book 3197 page 407 Oct. 11, 1939 (side #4)


Book 3264 page 20 July 23, 1941 (side #2) Harry T. Hadley sold the land and buildings, the same as described in book 2741 page 380, to Allan W. Hamilton and Annie C. Hamilton.

Paul M. Hubbard, Trustee appointed by the Probate Court, on the petition of Trustees of Donations to the Protestant Episcopal Church, under the will of Sarah A. Bates, sold the land and buildings "situate and now numbered 4 on Forrester Street", to Statira V. Hulbert. The same premises conveyed to Sarah A. Bates by George R. Curven recorded in book 1034 page 270. and also the same premises conveyed to Charles H. Bates, husband of said Sarah A. Bates, by the following two deeds; one from Emery K. Benson recorded in book 857 page 221 and the other from John H. Parsons and another recorded in book 936 page 269.

Allan W. and Evelyn A. Harrison sold the land and buildings, as described in book 2941 page 87, to Althea Winslow. Althea Winslow, a straw, convyed the property to Evelyn A. Harrison. Book 3853 page 252 Oct. 19, 1951 (side #2)

Book 4483 page 147 August 7, 1958 (side #4) Evelyn A. Harrison conveyed the land and buildings, the same as described in book 3264 page 21, to Nicholas and Elizabeth M. Nestor.

Russell D. Hurlbert, executor under the will of Statira V. Hulbert, sold the land and buildings:



to Nicholas and Elizabeth M. Nestor. "For title see book 3197 page 407."

In checking the Salem City Directories for the Victoria Hospital at 4 Forrester St. I found the following information:

Miss Statira V. Hulbert was nurse to Mrs. Charles H. (Sarah A) Bates at 37 Forrester St. (1893-94), 2 Church St. (1897-1908) and 4 Forrester St. (1985-96 and 1909-1913). Mrs. Bates died May 11, 1913.

Miss Sanni Hagan is listed as living at and operating a medical gymnasium at #4 from 1909-1915. The 1916 directory lists her at 82 Essex St. and in 1920 she moved to Beverly where she was listed as a masseuse.

#4 is first listed as a hospital in 1916 - listed as S.V. Hulbert private hospital. In 1917 it is Victoria Hospital and in 1920 it is Victoria General Hospital. The last listing for the hospital is 1926.

Statira V. Hulbert continued to be listed at 4 Forrester until 1944. St

I couldn't find any other material on Victoria Hospital. Library of the Essex Institute has something more on it. Perhaps
