## 7 River Street

This pitched-roof, gable-end-to-street house was built by John Chandler, housewright by 1788 on what is now known as River Street.

River Street was called a way in 1739; road 1773; private road 1778; lane 1782; River Street in 1796. (Essex Antiquarian, volume 7 page 116)

The lot on which this house stands was part of a large tract of land owned by the Beckford family for many years. When the Beckfords sold off this land, most buyers bought one lot on the south side of the lane and one across on the north extending to the river. This was the case when on 3 Aug 1784 John Beckford, yeoman, sold for 41 pounds 6 shillings to John Chandler, housewright; a lot of land (no buildings) containing 12 3/4 poles:

North - on lane 49'2"
East = on Ebenezer Beckford 68'
South - on John Beckford 50'5"
West - on Asa Killam 70'

Also a lot containing 10 1/2 poles (no buildings)

North - by stone wall and flats 49'

East - on Ebenezer Beckford 58'

South - on lane 49'

West - on Asa Killam 59'

This deed for two lots was not recorded until 6 Apr 1790 when John Chandler and wife Sarah sold the second lot to William Ferginson, taylor. (no buildings) (Registry of Deeds, book 151 page 159)

The Salem tax records for the year 1788 show John Chandler taxed for a house and land, this is the first mention of a house. In 1790 a Federal census was taken, John Chandler was the head of the family containing 1 free white male of 16 years and upward (including head of families), 3 free white males under 16 years and 2 white females. (next to the family of Asa Killam)

John (b. 25 Mar 1752) had been an officer in the Revolution and he and his family attended the North Church. (records of the North Church 1772-1872) John married Sarah Dodge (b. 7 Jul 1753) but apparently not in Salem. The Chandlers had three sons: John Jr., Benjamin and Joseph D. also one daughter Sarah.

On 5 Jun 1804 John made his will: after all debts and charges of his funeral were paid he gives "unto my two sons John Jr. and Benjamin one dollar to be divided between them", to beloved wife Sarah 1/3 of the estate and for the term of her natural life all real estate to support her and minor son Joseph D. but if she remarries or at her death the estate to go to children Joseph D. and Sarah or the survivor. (Probate #4942) John died 4 Mar 1821 of the palsy, leaving the house in the hands of Sarah, the executrix.

11 Sept 1835 Sarah (Dodge) Chandler died at the age of 82, the property was then shared equally by Joseph D. and his sister Sarah. (information on John and Sarah (Dodge) Chandler is sparse I have not been able to determine origin. Many men named John Chandler served in the Revolution)

Joseph Dodge Chandler (b. 14 Mar 1789) married Mary Mc Donald on 12 Jun 1827 in Salem. Three children were born to the couple: Joseph (died young), Joseph and John.

Sarah lived in this house with her brother Joseph and his family until her death in 1851. In her will written 24 Jul 1839 she left all her estate to her two nephews Joseph and John or the survivor, the children of my brother Joseph D. Her real estate consisted of 1/2 a dwelling house and out buildings on River St. "the same estate now occupied and improved by my brother and myself" (Probate #34889)

(The Chandlers must have taken in a boarder after the death of Sarah)

Ten years after the death of his sister (Sarah), Joseph passed away 17 May 1861. His estate went to his wife Mary and son John(Probate #34883) (Their son Joseph must have died between the time of the 1860 census and the death of his father, he is never mentioned again)

In the clippings of Charles Archer, written for the newspaper in 1922, (Essex Institute Library) in his memory "Joseph D. Chandler was a very old man when I (Charles) came on the stage". He was the head of the establishment of an old fashion grocery store on Federal St. Joseph was succeeded by his energetic and bustling son John who years later built a modern grocery across the street at 107 Federal St. The store did a flourishing business.

John continued the family business and had married Caroline F. Edwards the daughter of Benjamin and Abigail R. (Peele) Edwards. The couple lived in the old homestead until 1874 when he built a new store and house at 107 Federal St. Mary lived in the house on River St. until her death 6 Sep 1875. The last of the Chandlers in residence since it was built almost one hundred years before.

After the death of his mother (Mary), John was the sole heir to the property. On 13 Jun 1878 John Chandler, whose residence was now the corner of Federal and Beckford Sts. applied for and received a permit to build a wooden barn at 7 River St. 5' x 10' (Fermit book volume 1, now stored at the Essex Institute)

In the census of 1880 we find tenants John W. Brown age 57 an engineer born in N.H., wife Rachael age 63 born in Maine and Neta age 27 daughter born in Mass., living in the house.

John and Caroline did not have children. At the time of John's death 29 Jan 1903 we find the estate collecting rent of Jeremiah Mc Grath 7 River St:

In his will John left to Caroline all furniture except my old-fashion tall clock, she is to use for her lifetime, then to pass to Wallace Chisholm, my executor and to my cousin Caroline \$1,000. The rest to Wallace A. Chisholm to hold and invest to pay income to wife Caroline, but not to sell the estate on corner of Federal and Beckford which I now occupy as my homestead and store, in the lifetime of my wife without her consent.

After the death of his wife a few bequestSwere made then the rest was to be divided in equal shares between the Association for the Relief of the Aged and Destitute Women in Salem and The Salem Seaman's Orphan and Childrens Friends Soc.

Total personal property \$12,825.01 and real estate \$16,000. (Probate #91677)



Salem News 30 Jan 1903 - The death of a well known grocer, John Chandler, for years kept a store on the corner of Federal and Beckford Sts. Died at his home 107 Federal St. He was a graduate of the Hacker School. Leaves a widow.

29 Feb 1912 the Salem Seaman's Orphan Soc. and Association for Relief of Aged and Destitute Women of Salem sell for \$1 and other valuable consideration to Jeremiah McGrath the land and buildings:

North - by River St. 49'2"
East - by Benjamin Cutts 68'

Margaret E.Maguire aquired the whole estate by deed 18 Dec 1963 and Probate #150393. She then sold to David H. Warner. (book 5233 page 479)

David Warner sold to Joseph F. and Joanna L. Schappa on 12 Mar 1965 (book 5251 page 334)

30 Oct 1972 Joanna L. Schappa by power #315813 heirs sold to Robert Ledoux.

16 May 1973 Robert Ledoux sold to John H. and Carol P. Carr Jr.

(II) John Chandler, son of John Chandler, was born about 1745. He was a carpenter or housewright by trade, and lived in Salem, Massachusetts. There was a John Chandler in the revolution, in Captain Mills' company, Colonel Joseph Vose's regiment, 1777, aged twenty-five, complexion fresh, hair sandy, born in Ireland. If this is our John Chandler it determines the ancestry of the family, for this soldier was undobtedly Scotch-Irish. John Chandler bought land in Salem August 3, 1784, of John Bickford, part of which land adjoined land of Asa Killam and Ebenezer Bickford. He and Loammi Baldwin, both housewrights of Salem, bought of Samuel Symonds land at Northfields, Salem, on the road from the north bridge to New Mills in Danvers, May 24, 1797. He died in 1804, and his will was dated June 5, 1804, bequeathing to wife Sarah and children John, Jr., Benjamin, Joseph Dodge and Sarah. Joseph Dodge was a minor. John, Jr., is called Stockbridge by Dr. Thomas H. Chandler. Children: John, Jr., Benjamin, Joseph Dodge, Sarah (Sally).

(III) Joseph Dodge Chandler, son of John Chandler, was born about 1800. He was educated in the public schools of Salem, and engaged in business there as a retail grocer, following that calling with success during all his active life. He was a Unitarian in religion, a well-known and useful citizen. He married, June 12, 1827, Mary MacDonald, at Salem. Children: 1. Joseph, born about 1830.

2. John, mentioned below.

(IV) John Chandler, son of Joseph Dodge Chandler, was born in Salem, in 1834, and died there January 31, 1903. He attended the common schools of Salem, and at an early age began to work as clerk in his father's grocery

store. He was ambitious to do business on his own account, and in 1861 embarked on an enterprise of his own, establishing a grocery store at the corner of Beckford and Federal streets. He was fortunate in his business. He had the necessary experience, knowledge and foresight, the sound judgment and sterling character that brought him substantial rewards for his industry and activity in business. He had an attractive personality, winning friends readily by his kindly and democratic manner and sympathetic nature. He belonged to no clubs or fraternal organizations; he divided his time between his business and his home. He was active in the North Unitarian Church and a generous supporter of its work. He married, October 26, 1865. Caroline F. Edwards, born at Salem, April 26, 1840, daughter of Benjamin and Abigail R. (Peele) Edwards (see Edwards). They had no children.
