This property was a small portion of land owned by Dudley Woodbridge in the late 1700's. When Mr. Woodbridge died, the Bridge street land was described as being 41 acres with a barn. The land was divided into lots and sold by the heirs.

Thomas March Woodbridge purchased part of his father's land and built the house now \#48 Bridge Street. The land where Rice street was put through was part of this estate.

The land became the property of Archelaus and Maria Rea (the daughter of Thomas M. Woodbridge) by the l840's. Archelaus Rea was born on February l2, 1778. He married, as his second wife, Maria Woodbridge on April 7, 1814. The couple had four children: Thomas, Edward, Maria and Frances.

Maria E. Dexter and Frances E. Rea, both of Boston, divided the land into lots and began developing the property around 1872. The 1872 plan (enclosed) indicates that only one house was on their land at that time. When the sisters sold lot \#l4 (now 16 Rice St.) to Moses Pray, on April l, l874, a building was included in the sale. Thus circa 1873 was chosen as the construction date.

Little information has been found regarding Moses Pray. He was a carpenter and lived at 28 Bridge St. prior to moving to 16 Rice St. The last directory listing for Mr. Pray is in the 1886/7 edition where he is listed at the almshouse.

In 1896 Mrs. Whalen, then the owner of the property, moved a building from 6 Pearl st. to the rear of this lot. The tax records indicate the value of her real estate as:

House 16 Rice, $\$ 500$; house unfinished (Rear 16), \$200; Land $3798 \mathrm{ft} ., \$ 300$

Mrs. Whalen never lived on Rice street, she made her home at 46 Bridge St. Her son, Lawrence lived in the house at l6 Rice St.

Enclosed is a copy of our deed. We purchased 16 Rice St. in March 1964.

The Mullarkey's whom we purchased it from had been married less then a year. He worked for GE in Lynn and was transfered to Schenectady. They purchase it from Jean R. L'Italien who only had it long enough to do some repairs.

Cassidy had owned it for some time. He owned both 16 and $16 \frac{1}{2}$ Rice Street. He divided the lot in 1947 and sold the back house $16 \frac{1}{2}$ to his daughter and son-in-law the McKinnons. They has a large family and soon lived in both houses. Mr. Cassidy built the back room on 16 Rice for himself. The McKinnons took all their children and moved to Alaska.

We understand the owner before Cassidy was a cabinet maker and did a lot of woodwork in the house as well as putting in a bathroom.

Attached are other notes I have from when I researched the property. I am missing the rest of them - between Collier and Cassidy.

I know Rice Street was part of the Woodbridge estate and was laid out as a street in the early 1860.

You did the history of $16 \frac{1}{2}$ Rice Street last spring for Joyce Edgert.
