





DATE DOCUMENTATION

11 - 13 OLIVER STREET

"This three-story plus hip roof, wooden house with its narrow end on the street has a Federal-period entrance in the yard at the south side of the house. The doorway is in the middle of the balanced five-bay facade and is trimmed with reeded pilasters and a pediment in which there is a semicircular fanlight, a favorite detail of the early 1800's. The heavy molded wooden cornice is also a Federal feature. Off the north side of the house there is a small two-story plus pitch roof ell. A brick sidewalk leads into the yard of this house; there is a cinder block garage beyond the house in the yard."

(Salem Historic District Study Committee Investigation)

Lacking a document with an exact date, circa 1810 has been assigned to this house. Since Mr. Searle purchased <u>land</u> in 1809 and sold <u>land</u> with a <u>dwelling house</u> in 1811, this seems most plausible. The tax records, which usually supply date documentation, are of no help in this case:

Miles Searle, the son of Samuel and Mehitable (Burpe) Searle, was born, in Ipswich, on April 22, 1782. Mr. Searle was married to Sarah Stanley on June 4, 1808. He was involved in several real estate transactions - in Rowley for his parents' property and in Salem on Andrew, Northey and Oliver streets. The Searle family lived in the Northey St. house and subsequently moved to Newburgh, N.Y.
