

TAX VALUATION RECORDS

1844- Samuel Kemp is not taxed for any real estate; his address is 5 Northey Street.


Joseph Beadle is taxed for one house (presumably his residence at 102 Bridge Street, now 126-8 Bridge Street), value \$2,000.

1845- Samuel Kemp is not taxed for any real estate; his address is 4 Northey Street.

1846- Samuel Kemp is taxed for a house, value \$1,600; his address is $4\ 1/2$ Northey Street.

SUMMARY

Joseph Beadle owned a tract of land on Bridge and Northey Streets including one dwelling house, now 126-128 Bridge Street. Beadle sold the lot upon which 12 Northey Street now stands to Samuel Kemp in 1845, with mention of no house. The Milletts are listed as residents of Northey Street in the 1846 Salem directory; in 1849 they bought the house from Kemp. Therefore, the house was probably standing in 1846, and apparently was not in 1845. Samuel Kemp is first taxed for a house in 1846; the value of the house for which Kemp is taxed was \$1,600. Kemp's address at the time was 4 1/2 Northey Street, possibly this house.

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

The sidehall Greek Revival house with gable end to the street was common in Salem in the 1840s and 1850s; 12 Northey Street is a well-preserved and handsomely-detailed example of this house type. The facade is sheathed in flush boards, while all other elevations are clapboarded. The entry is at the westernmost bay of the facade, and consists of a panelled door framed by sidelights and a transom, and sheltered by a shallow portico with fluted Tuscan columns. Above the entry is a second-story panelled bay. Window frames at the facade have corner blocks, with the exception of the segmental arched window in the pedimented gable end. A deep entablature encircles the house. Other features include a granite foundation and sill and corner boards.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Northey Street was laid out between Bridge Street and the North River in 1807 by Moses Hale and Abijah and Ezra Northey through land owned by the Northey family for many years. 12 Northey Street is representative of the numerous mid-sized Greek Revival houses of the mid-19th century. It is first listed in the Salem Directory of 1846, when it was occupied by Joseph H. Millett, captain, and Edward A Millett, clerk at Webb's Wharf. In 1851 the house was owned by C.H. Millet, and in 1874, Mrs. E. Dole owned it.
