

8 FORRESTER STREET
BUILT IN 1888 BY
DANIEL B. LORD, CARPENTER
FOR EDMUND YASINSKI, TOBACCONIST

The house that is presently located as 8 Forrester Street was built in 1888 by Salem carpenter Daniel B. Lord and Jorgen H. Krogh, for Edmund Yasinski, a Salem tobacconist. From 1890 till 1895 Mr. Krogh and Mr. Lord lived at 8 Forrester Street. During those same years, Mr. Yasinski's address is listed as being at 35 Forrester Street.¹ It is not until 1895 that the directory lists Mr. Yasinski's address as being at 8 Forrester.

Joseph Parsons, who lived at 35 Forrester, sold mason's supplies and manufactured cement pipes at his business at 105 Essex Street, (see advertisement that follows.) Mr. Parsons owned the lot of land on which 8 Forrester Street was build in 1888².

In 1880, Mr. Parsons sold his lot at 8 Forrester to Edmund Yasinski for 800 dollars. The said lot "began at the north-westerly corner thereof on Forrester Street about thirty-four and one half feet to land of the city of Salem, then turning and running easterly about seventy-five feet to land of Webb, turning running southerly about thirty-five feet to land of Charles Bates then turning and running westerly about seventy-five feet to Forrester Street to the point begun at."³ At the time, Mr. Yasinski was living at 35 Forrester and was employed as a tobacconist at 16 Central Street.

In May of 1904, Mr. Yasinski sold the property at 8 Forrester to John and Maggie Seale for \$3000.⁴ Mr. Yasinski had lived at 8 Forrester from 1895 till 1904. Mr. Seale was a graduate of McGill

University in Montreal and was a practicing veterinarian, (see advertisement that follows.)

Mr. Seale sold the property to David E. and Mary E. Cahill, "in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations...the said premises were to be sold subject to a mortgage for twenty-seven hundred dollars, to the Parish in St. Peters Church of Salem, Mass."⁵

In 1925, Mary Cahill, wife of David, sold the property to Ida H. Moseley, wife of Harry O. Moseley for "considerations paid."⁶ The Moseleys conveyed the property to Stanley and Stella Markowicz twenty years later.⁷

The Markowiczs sold the house to Walter and Bernice Twarog for "considerations paid."⁸ In January of 1991, Mr. Twarog died of lung cancer.
