





NOTES

This obituary notice was published in the 1878 Salem Register:

DIED - June 5 Mr. James Stone age 88 years, 8 months, 1 day June 10 - James Stone, the well known mason, died on Wednesday, at the age of four score and eight years and eight months. Mr. Stone worked as an apprentice on the brick block in Warren street, now or formerly known as the "Tontine Building", and his last day's work was done on the gas reservoir on North street. This embraces a period of sixty four years of steady labor at his trade as a mason. He was the contractor for putting up some of our best buildings in town; notably the mansion of the late Pickering Dodge, Esq. on Chestnut street, the North Church on Essex street, and others. By his intelligence fidelity, and strict integrity, he won and ever retained the confidence and respect of his employers; and his whole life was marked by great simplicity and openess of feeling and kindness of heart. In his relations as son, husband and father, he was most faithful and affectionate. the last few months he suffered much from a lingering and painful illness which he bore with much patience and sweetness of disposition and died in the firm faith of a joyful resurrection.

His funeral was attended at the Central Baptist Church on Saturday afternoon.
