Lynde street was laid out in 1751. The lot on which this house stands was sold, by Judge Benjamin Lynde, to Nathaniel Foster on May 20, 1753. Mr. Foster built a house on this lot soon after its purchase.

Nathaniel Foster sold the land and building to Jacob Rust in 1798. Mr. Rust transferred title to John Gavett, fisherman, in December of 1798.

The estate remained in the Gavett family until 1851 when it was sold to Philip Chase:



Philip Chase removed the old house from the site within the month:

FOR SALE Building on Lynde street - On Tuesday next at 3 1/2 o'clock, P.M. will be sold on the premises. The dwelling house with all the materials above the underpinning - to be removed within one week from the day of sale. (Salem Gazette)

The house, now known as 32 Lynde St., was built immediately after the lot was cleared. This is confirmed by the list of buildings erected, in Salem, between 1851 and 1852 (Essex Institute - Salem Street Books):





PHILIP CHASE

Philip Chase, the son of Abner and Rebecca Chase, was born in Salem on November 13, 1767. He was married to Lydia Hacker in May of 1795. She died on August 22, 1799. Mr. Chase married Alice Brown, of Dover, N.H. on March 6, 1806.

Philip Chase began his career as a painter and glazier. He later became a leading merchant in Salem. Mr. Chase was a member of the Society of Friends and very active in the Abolitionist movement.

Philip Chase died in Salem, on September 25, 1857, at the age of 89 years 10 months. At the time of his death he owned two houses on Federal St., a large brick block on Washington St., a dwelling house on Cambridge St., land on Bridge St., interest in a warehouse and wharf on Franklin St. and property in Lynn. The total value of his estate being \$135,813.17.

The Philip Chase family made their home at 83 Federal St. The 1850 census shows them as:

Lydia H. Mage 52, born Mass.

George H. " age 24 merchant, born Mass.

Mary O'Brien servant, born Ire.

Bridget Dazen age 17 servant, born Ire.







