



This house is described in the <u>Salem Historic District Study</u> Committee Investigation report as:

#18 Carlton Street

This is a small, simple two-story plus pitch roof, wooden (siding) house. It is gable end to the street and similar to many other such houses of this period in Salem. The simple entrance in the yard south of the house has had a modern canopy added to it, and the original chimneys have been replaced.

PERIOD: FEDERAL

Both Perley and Bentley discussed the early history of Carlton Street. Perley wrote that it was laid out in or before 1801 and that the area around the northern end was called "Job's Field" in 1671. Bentley recorded in 1809 that "Carleton Street lately was a field upon the Cromwell estate... It was known above half a Century ago before the Derby street crossed it, as the Bakehouse field, from the Bakehouse standing on Essex street, and it had many Divisions before it was bought by Captain Carlton.." The street was widened in 1852.

As shown in the chain of title, James Carroll a mariner, purchased the <u>lot of land</u> on April 7, 1801. Records indicate that the first time James "Carrel" is tax for a house is in the year 1803. Prior to that date he just paid a poll tax.

The East Parish List of Deaths by Rev. William Bentley shows that the Carroll family was definitely living on Carlton St. by 1803.

Nov. 29, 1803 Nancy, of James and Hannah Carroll. Quincy, 6 years... Six daughters left. Carlton Street.

July 13, 1804 James Carroll. Consumption, 55 years old.


Married at 23 years, and 22 years married life. He was born in Berwick, Maine. Married Hannah, dau. of John Webb. He lived till lately on the River, bottom of Daniels Street. Died in Carlton Street.


Dec. 30, 1804 Mary, dau. of James and H. Carroll. Atrophy, 7 years. She was a Webb. The father died in July last. Five dau. left. Carlton Street.


James Carroll, mariner, by a will written on July 3, 1804, bequeathed \$200 to Mary, his youngest daughter, and the rest to his wife Hannah for her natural life. After her decease the estate was to be divided by his daughters Hannah, Abigail, Judith, Elizabeth, Priscilla and Mary. (The only son, John, died at sea in 1800 at the age of 19.)

Probate #4749

As by his wishes, the property remained Hannah's until her death on October 9, 1841 at the age of 88. After Hannah's death, the surviving daughters Nabby (Abigail) Hammond, Judith Hammond, Elizabeth Rice and Priscilla Masury sold the property to Samuel Becket, the husband of their sister Hannah.
