



DATE DOCUMENTATION

183 FEDERAL STREET

A wheelwright shop occupied a portion of the lot, now called 183 Federal St., during the 1830's. This lot was at first called 103 Federal Street, being renumbered in 1853.

The 1837 directory lists "Ross, David wheelwright 103 Federal, h(ouse) 100 Federal and it was "wheelwright" Andrew Lund that sold the property to Ezra Lummus in November of 1840.

The first mention of a house on this lot appears in the street department book for the years 1841/2. On October 30, 1841, the street was being altered for better drainage "nearly opposite Ezra Lummus's new dwelling house". A drain was filled under the sidewalk and over the land of Thomas Lord, now 182 Federal.

In 1842 the house was occupied by Ezra Lummus, blacksmith and John Fairfield, teacher at the West school for girls.

This house was put up for sale in 1850, but since the next deed on record was not until 1854 it is apparent that no buyer was found at that time. The Lummus family had already moved from Salem by 1850 leaving the tenant, Thomas Nichols, in charge.

A dwelling house #103 Federal Street, containing 22 finished rooms nearly new and well calculated for two families - with land under and adjoining, will be sold on application to Mr. Thomas Nichols on the premises, or Mr. J. F. Carlton or I. D. Shepard No. 34 Lawrence Place.
