

Mr. Goss built this dwelling house and a bakehouse, during the second half of 1851, on the lot purchased from Samuel Randall. A barn was added in 1852 (Street Dept. books at the Essex Institute).

A little knowledge of North Salem's history is needed to understand how a house built in 1851 could be on land that was not purchased until 1869.

North Street was one of the most used thoroughfares in the city, but it was extremely narrow in several places. This was changed, in 1869, when the selectmen decided to widen the street the whole length from Federal St., over the old North Bridge and up to School St. This meant moving every building on the south side out of the way.

With all the buildings on his lot, Mr. Goss did not have room to move his house back. The city solved this problem by purchasing the adjoining lot and then selling it to Mr. Goss. So instead of being moved back, this house was moved over to its present location.

Mr. Goss died on October 2, 1890. This notice appeared in the local papers:

"Mr. Richard G. Goss, an esteemed and worthy citizen of the city for many years died at his home in North Salem last Thursday evening, at the age of nearly 85 years. Mr. Goss was a native of Marblehead and learned his trade (that of a baker) in that town. He came to Salem about fity years ago, and in company with the late Volvey C. Stowe, carried on business under the firm name of Goss and Stowe. Their specialty was the fitting out of vessels with bakers' supplies. On the decline of the shipping business Mr. Goss (in 1851) removed to his late home in North Salem, at the corner of North and Randall streets, and built his house and bakery. He joined the Essex Lodge of Odd Fellows April 13, 1844, five months after it was formed, so that although not a charter member he was among the first to join. Three sons - Ezra, Samuel and George - and one daughter survive him. Mr. Goss' funeral took place from his late residence on Sunday afternoon. Rev. Arthur Rogers, pastor of the Universalist church, officiated. Essex Lodge of Odd Fellows attended."




