John Sanderson, carpenter, died on November 12, 1896 at the age of 66 years, 3 months and 15 days. He was the son of John and Abigail (Haskell) Sanderson. By will (Probate #80079), all his real estate was bequeathed to his wife Jennie. "It is my wish and desire however that my said wife shoul permit and allow my sister, Mary E. Sanderson, to live and have a home with her free of any expense, so long as she, the said Mary, may desire."

Mr. Sanderson never lived in the house at 6 Smith St., but built it as an investment. Ordinarily a building would be constructed after the passing of the deeds, but in this case Sanderson built the house on the property then his partner, James A. Smith, gave him title to the land. The house shows on the tax rolls in 1859 as a "new house unf(inished)" owned by John Sanderson and valued at \$500.

The first tenant on record is found in the 1860 census:
