This house is described by the <u>Salem Historic District Study</u> Committee Investigation:

"This two-story plus gambrel roof, wooden (siding) house is gable end to the street and back to Bridge Street, which didn't exist when this house was built. The house has had a columned porch, flat-roofed ell and two-story entrance tower added to it (prior to 1874 Atlas), and yet its basic form and style can still be seen. The house belonged to the Pitman family for many years."

The Rev. William Bentley wrote in 1800 that "Oliver has opened a Street from the Common to Needham's Lane and to North River." The field where the street was laid out had belonged to the Lynde family for many years. Mary Oliver, the daughter of Benjamin Lynde, owned the greater part of the west side of this street and after her death, in 1807, it became the property of her son Peter Oliver.





NOTES:

The first mention of a house on this land appears in the deed, of June 4, 1828, when Daniel Millet sells a lot of land with the dwelling house and other buildings thereon. Since Mr. Millet purchased the lot of land late 1825, it seems safe to assume that he had the dwelling house built soon after and it was completed circa 1826.

There is a tradition that this house was moved to this site. Unfortunately, documentation to that effect has not been found. Many houses, in Salem, were moved prior to the invention of electricity. The hassle of electrical wires, and later telephone lines, slowed the house moving business to a near halt. Records of house movings were not systematically kept and a great deal of time and research is required to prove such movings. Until the tradition is substantiated, we must rely on the 1826 documention.

DANIEL MILLET, tailor

Daniel Millet, the son of Joseph and Elisabeth Millet, was born on May 15, 1785. He married Elizabeth Caldwell on March 25, 1807. She died on February 11, 1837. He married Mary (Fuller) Haskell on October 11, 1839.

He is listed on November 8, 1823 in "NAMES and PLACES of BUSINESS of the SUBSCRIBERS to THE OBSERVER in SALEM" Merchant Tailors

Millet & Ward, Essex (street) opp. Liberty (street) (This address would be 144 Essex St.)

Daniel Millet was a member of the Anti-Slavery Soc. in the 1830's. He was also a member of the Enterprise Fire Club, serving as clerk from 1811 to 1817 and moderator in 1824 & 1825. Mr. Millet died on July 26, 1853, at the age of 68 years.
