## Twenty Three Warren Street

This house was built by Henry Lamson Reed, Salem housewright, in 1838.

On 18 Jan 1838 Joseph Wallis, a Salem cabinet-maker, for \$145 granted to Henry Lamson Reed, Salem carpenter, a lot of land fronting 35' on Green Street (the original name of Warren Street) and running back in depth about 100' (304:44). Mr Reed, then 24 years of age and a bachelor, proceeded to build this house on the land purchased from Mr Wallis, probably in the summer of 1838.

Henry L Reed added to the houselot on 17 Jan 1839, when he purchased of Mr Wallis, for \$38, a piece at the rear of the lot, adjoining it on the south (310:179). On 1 Feb 1839 Mr Reed for \$300 mortgaged to John Howard Jr, Salem sailmaker, the pieces of land that he had bought from Joseph Wallis, "together with the new dwelling house and all other buildings now standing thereon, or about to be erected thereon" (310:259); this mortgage was discharged on 18 Jan 1870.

In the fall of 1840 Henry L Reed married Mary D Southwick; her family was one that had long followed Quaker lights, although she herself was not necessarily a member of that sect. The Reeds lived here, perhaps alone for awhile; by 1844, however, the house was shared by Mr & Mrs Reed and Samuel Reed, aged 22 years, probably Henry's brother. At that time the house was valued at \$800.

Henry L Reed owned this homestead for nearly 40 years; on 27 June 1877, by which time he and his wife were living in Cambridge, Mass., for \$2305 he sold the house and land to Susan B Cabot of Salem (979:106). She owned the premises nearly twenty years, granting the same on 29 June 1896 to Patrick McElroy of Salem (1483:538).

On 9 Jan 1901 Mr McElroy granted the homestead to his wife Catherine, via straw Mary E Mooney of Salem (1631:517,517). Mrs McElroy died possessed of the estate on 26 July 1920, at which time it was valued at \$2900 (#137105). On 14 June 1922 the premises were sold, for the benefit of Mrs McElroy's three daughters and three sons, for \$4300 to Mr & Mrs Thomas T Skeffington of Salem, as joint tenants (2516:589).

Mr Skeffington outlived his wife Jane, and died possessed of the house, garage, and land at 23 Warren Street, valued at \$3850, on 2 July 1934 (#179615). On 29 Oct 1934 the other four Skeffington heirs granted their rights in the place to their brother Harry W Skeffington and his wife Ann D (3014:510).

Mr Skeffington outlived his wife, and married, secondly, Ruby E. On 13 June 1955 he granted the homestead to himself and to his wife Ruby Evelyn Skeffington (4180:465). She survived Mr Skeffington and married Stanley Czternastek of Salem. On 14 Jan 1964 she granted the premises, via straw Paul Resnick of Beverly, to herself and her husband Stanley (5144:508,509).

On 30 July 1976, for \$44,000, Mr & Mrs Czternastek granted to Stephen M and his wife Leslie P Limon the land and house built in 1838 by Henry Lamson Reed (6264:511).

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## Notes:

A figure such as (123:45) refers to Southern Essex County Registry of Deeds, book 123, page or leaf 45; a figure such as (#12345) refers to So. Essex County Probate docket #12345.

Ordinarily, more could be discovered about Henry and Mary Reed had they died in Essex County, and not moved away to Cambridge late in life.

The Salem valuation books fail to record HL Reed's presence on Green Street before 1840, unless he is the "Thomas Reed" mentioned beginning in 1838; this is not unusual, for the assessors were frequently several years late in recording the presence of a house. The mortgage deed of February 1839 clearly establishes the presence of this house by that time, and implies its having been built the year before, since the month of January is the least likely of construction times.

And do covenant with the said heirs and assigns, that heirs and assigns, that heirs and assigns, that he lawfully seised in fee of the afore-granted premises; that hey are free of all incumbrances; that have good right to sell and convey the same to the said here?

And that will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Rood.
