at approximately 2:00 p.m., Hovember 22, 1963, I was working Aquad #223 in Oak Chiri. I was cruising in the cross of Tenth Street and Modiley / venue looking for the killer of afficer J. D. Tipple. The Disputcher put out a feall stating that the suspect was in the Texas Theater on Jefferson Blvd. I preceded to the rear of the Monter and parked by squad car in the diley. I entered the rear door with Officers N. N. Descaped and Y. J. Matson. Officer McDonald and I walked across the stage and jumped done to the main meeting area. Officer Mutson welked down the stairs saut to the door to had entered. I started welking up the North aidle toward two rem who were observed pitting in the middle of the show.

Officer beloneld was welking up the bouth wiels also seward the two men. Officer Moderald and I woulded up to these two man and convoled them. While convening those two men the arrested person this choosed slitting farther back in the shoe on the third seat from the roar of the show. I walked each to the North siels and back to the row there the support was sitting. Officer Medocald hed walled and to the res mices the suspect was. Officer intron had entered the row behind the suspect, waiting ahead of me, toward the suspect.

I observed officer McDonald as he wanted up to the so post and sold scandiding to him. The suspect stook up and freed difficer relembled. At that thes I was approaching the suspect from his back. Officer hattoned manched dames if to search the suspect and so he did the suspect his him in the force. Officer Helbachd started grappling with the suspect and Officer button and I ran toward them. Officer Mericon remedied over from the sout behind the appeals and probled him around the nock. I reacted and probbed the puspest's last and. I do not mad where difficor May Hambian come from, but he was to my left in ront of the suspect, also attempting to hold him. I could see Officer Perionald and the suspect graphling over the gun. The suspect had this right hand on it and so did officer Melion id. The gun , was being waved around approximately maint high. I need a click of the revolver an it cauged, but I do not know wast direction the revolver was pointing when it enapped. Cifficer Hadding told no to bring the suspect's anaeround o listle so he could get the hardculfs on. I did this and started bringing the suspect out the wishe I had embered. I took hold of the compact's right arm when we got to the Morth cirls. Detective Paul Bentley took his left and and we took the cur, at out the from deer of the Thoster. We put the suspect in the rear of a plain a just car and brought the suspect to the dity Hall.

There were three pladmolothes Officers in the front seat of the car that the suspect the brought down in. Sgt. Jorry Hill was one of the Officers and I do not intow the menos of the others.

Subject: Arrest of Lee Harvey Oswald

Sir:

At approximately 2:00 pm, November 22, 1963, I was working Squad #223 in Oak Cliff. I was cruising in the area of Tenth Street and Beckley Avenue looking for the killer of Officer J. D. Tippit. The Dispatcher put out a call stating that the suspect was in the Texas Theater on Jefferson Blvd.

I proceeded to the rear of the Theater and parked my squad car in the alley.

I entered the rear door with Officers M. N. McDonald and T. A. Hutson. Officer McDonald and I walked across the stage and jum ed down to the main seating area.

Officer Hutson walked down the stairs next to the door we had entered. I started walking up the north aisle toward two men who were observed sitting in the middle of the show.

Officer "cDonald was walking up the South aisle also toward the two
men. Officer McDonald and I waked up to these two men and searched them.
While searching these two men the arrested person was observed sitting farther
back in the show on the third seat from the rear of the show. I walked back
to the North aisle and back to the row where the suspect was sitting.
Officer "cDonald had walked back to the row where the suspect was. Officer
Hutson had entered the row behind the suspect, walking ahead of me, toward the
suspect.

I observed Officer McDonald as he walked up to the suspect and said something to him. The suspect stood up and faced Officer McDonald. At that time I was approaching the suspect from his back. Officer McDonald reached down as if to search the suspect and as he did the suspect hit him

in the face. Officer McDonald started grappling with the suspect and Officer Mutson and I ran toward them. Officer Mutson reached over from the seat behind the suspect and grabbed him around the neck. I reached and grabbed the suspect's left arm. I do not know where Officer Ray Hawkins came from, but he was to my left in front of the suspect, also attempting to hold I could see Officer McDonald and the suspect grappling over the gun. nim. The suspect had his right hand on it and so did Officer McDonald. The gun was being waved around approximately waist high. I heard a click of the revolver as it snapped, but I do not know what direction the revolver was pointing when it snapped. Officer Havkins told me to bring the suspect's arm around a little so he could get the handcuffs on. I did this and started bringing the suspect out the aisle I had entered. I took hold of the suspect's right arm when we got to the North aisle. Detective Paul Bentley took his left arm and we took the suspect out the front door of the Theater. We put the suspect in the rear of a plain squad car and brought the suspect to the City Hall.

There were three plainclothes Officers in the front seat of the car that the suspect was brought down in. Sgt. Jerry Hill was one of the Officers and I do not know the names of the others.
