

A dark to dawn curfew was imposed on the University of South Carolina campus in Columbia, where National Guardsmen used tear gas early Tuesday to put down a ramped day to put down a ramped in which a university office was vandalized by a student mob.

Students of Eastern Michigan University threw rocks, set fire at barricades, and overturned a truck. At least 76 persons were arrested.

At Illinois Wesleyan University at Bloomington arsonists allegedly caused an estimated \$100,000 damage to a music building.

Flames were quickly quelched after a firebomb crashed through a window of Loyola University's ROTC building in Chicago.

Mail service was virtually cut off for about six hours in New York's capital city as more than 1,000 student demonstrators blocked the entrances to the fed-eral building.

U.S. and Swiss relations

A \$150,000 fire destroyed a portable classroom building Monday at Trenton (N.J.) State College.

For the third time in five days, construction workers in steel helmets, joined by long-shoremen, marched into the Wall Street area in New York in a counter-demonstration to show support for Nixon's foreign policy in Southeast Asia.

A private home serving as a protest center for the University of Nevada, student dissenters in Reno was bombed early Tuesday as an apparent retailation for last week's peace demonstrations and firebombings of a campus ROTC building.




