many fingers were polnted in accusation of guilt. But, when the sesslon was over, most, if not sympathetic with the other's polnt of view, had an understanding of how the other felt.
The Negro mulltant, who tad had violent head-to-head arguments with the porky white cop, had the guts to say to milm, "Look, would feel safe with yo trouble where my life was in danger, I was made with such unfaked sincering me." that the cop, fully reallzing his inteanion, was deeply moved and he also had dhe guts to admilt moved to tears. These actions were captured as they happeneed was getting the real stuff.
