Pastor's Letter.

Park Avenue M. E. Church Parsonage,
106 East 86th St., New York City, May 1, 1899.

To the Members of the Church and Congregation.

DEAR FRIENDS:

In putting forth this, the third yearly number of our CHURCH DIRECTORY, we have used all possible care to have it correct. It has been examined by several of our official members, and the proof sheets carefully corrected. We have left out of this Directory a number of names of those who have moved, whose present residence we do not know. Their names are still on our Church Records, but not on this list of our present attending, supporting members. If we have left off any such names from the above list, it has been unintentional.

We regret to lose from the list a few names of those who have removed from this part of the city, or have died. We are fortunate in retaining the active sympathy of so many who come from long distances to attend the church services, and who give so nobly to its support. No church ever had more loyal and devoted friends than Park Avenue M. E. Church. Its present Official Board keeps up its traditions and insists upon having a genuine Christian Church, in which the worship shall be carried on without sensational methods, and where a proper respect shall be shown to the house of God.

For this reason we have in our present membership any who have come to us from other denominations,

who find here a congenial atmosphere for worship and work. The Church is catholic in both membership and spirit, and welcomes all those who seek a Church home, with a worship simple and sincere, hearty and responsive, in a house most beautiful and attractive, with the Gospel of Christ preached as Glad Tidings to the men and women of to-day, in the language and methods of our own times.

CHURCH SUPPORT.

While our House of Worship is as beautiful as the best, its seats are all free. But we believe in the family in the Church, and encourage as far as possible families sitting together and in the same place Sabbath after Sabbath. The ushers try to suit the preferences of all. We raise our current expenses by means of envelopes and plate collections. Each member is furnished with a card on which they enter the amount they are willing to give weekly, and they are furnished envelopes into which they are to place the offering, dropping it into a box at the entrance of the Church.

OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL.

Our School, like our Church, is kept open every Sunday of the year, an arrangement being made among our officers and teachers so that all the children are cared for by good teachers. The classes are combined so that a regular teacher is at the head of each group.

The School meets from 2.30 to 4 P. M. every Sunday of the year except during the months of July and August, when the sessions are at 10 to 11 A. M., the children being invited to remain to the regular services from 11 A. M. to 12 M. We welcome the children from other Sunday Schools that are closed during the Summer months.

OUR PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

The Primary Department of our Sunday School is one of the best in the city. It has been in charge of Miss S. M. Riggs for many years, aided by 25 or 30 assistants and teachers. The children of many of the best families in this part of New York are sent to this Department because of its efficiency.

OUR ADULT BIBLE CLASS.

We have a large Adult Class, meeting in a separate room at the same hour with the School, to which adults are invited. Mr. S. H. Vandewater keeps his room crowded every Sunday, because he knows how to teach the Bible, and to deal with great and difficult questions.

WORK FOR THE YOUNG.

In the Junior Epworth League we have about 100 members. The aim is to develop religious ideas and habits, and also the confidence to lead in prayer, and speak before each other in a simple, "child-like" way. When they are fifteen years of age we recommend them to the Guild.

The St. John's Guild has about thirty-five members from fifteen to seventeen years of age, and they are trying to carry out a similar aim with other methods adapted to their age. After two years, and over, of work, the Guild is stronger than ever. It will graduate its members to

The Epworth Junior, embracing the children between ten and fifteen years of age, meets every Friday afternoon at 3.30 P. M. with the Pastor, in the Church parlor, for a religious meeting for instruction and help in the Christian life.

The Epworth Junior will be open to children under ten who may join the Church on probation, and who intend to lead a real Christian life, and will attend regularly.

Young Woman's Mission Circle. For many years this has been one of the most useful and efficient of our Church organizations, dividing the money collected equally between the Foreign and Home Missionary Society.

King's Daughters. There are a number of these associations, each working for some special object. Their names and officers will be found in our Directory, as far as we have been able to secure them.



The managers have monthly meetings on the first Tuesday afternoon of the month. The annual meeting is held on the first Tuesday of February, when the officers for the year are elected. We understand that the ladies propose to have quiet, pleasant Socials at their monthly meetings, where they will be happy to receive all ladies who are strangers coming into the Church or congregation. Every lady of the Church may become a member by paying one dollar a year.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY SOCIETIES.

We have a Woman's Foreign and a Woman's Home Missionary Society, that work together in perfect harmony, but have separate organizations. The "Woman's Home Society" sends away many barrels and boxes of clothing and supplies to our needy preachers and their families in the West and South, especially about Thanksgiving time. It can use good second-hand clothing to good advantage. The "Woman's Foreign Society" collects money. Its monthly meetings are held on the second Monday afternoon of each month, and are made interesting and profitable by readings, etc.

OUR PARK AVENUE HERALD.

This monthly paper is the organ of the Epworth League, but its pages are at the service of all the various Societies and organizations of the Church. HISTORIC FACTS AND DATES.

Our Sunday School. Our first Methodist Sunday School in this vicinity was opened with three scholars in the early summer of 1836, in a hired room, corner of Third Avenue and 85th Street, where our people worshipped for some months.

Our Sunday School took possession of the present Chapel on June 3d, 1892. So that June Sunday is an appropriate time for our Sunday School Anniversary.

Park Avenue Church. The corner-stone of our present Church was laid on the 13th of November, 1882, and the second Sunday of November will be the date of celebrating this great forward step in our Methodism.


Our Methodist Society. Our Yorkville Methodist Society or Church was organized March 6th, 1837, in the house of Gilbert Bates, corner of Third Avenue and 85th Street. There were five persons in the first congregation and only twenty members at the time of the dedication of the Church in August, 1837.

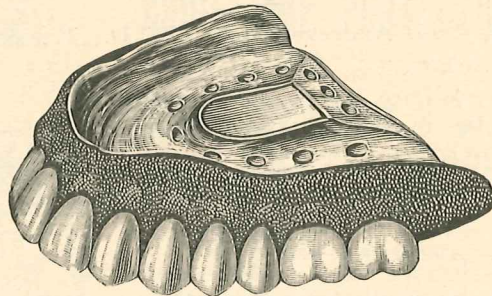

East Side Branch

Young Men's Christian Association

158-162 East
87th Street



HIS Branch of the Young Men's Christian Association, in which the people of the East Side are particularly interested, was organized in 1884 as the Yorkville Branch in the old Parepa Hall, at the corner of Third Avenue and 86th Street. Several years later the quarters were removed to the frame building, 153-155 East 86th Street, where the Branch did a most excellent work until the building was destroyed by fire in the fall of 1895. In September, 1897, the present building was completed, and although planned for the carrying on of a boys' department of the Association, the work done in it has clearly demonstrated that, with the erection of the proposed larger building for men on the site of that which was destroyed by fire, the East Side Branch will be one of the strongest in the entire city, where at fourteen other points work of a similar character is done.

The usual lines of work are carried on. The physical department is one of the most complete in the city, containing a well equipped gymnasium, with running track, bowling alleys, baths, etc. Evening educational classes are conducted six months in the year in practical studies; there is an excellent circulating library; camera club, with dark room; wheel room; social rooms; Bible classes and men's gospel meetings; and this summer there will be carried on athletic work on the Association grounds in the rear of the building, and general summer headquarters, with camping, boating, swimming, sports, etc., at Barretto Point.

There is also a work carried on for boys under sixteen.

Membership Fees are:
Regular, \$5.00 a year;
Gymnasium, \$5.00 additional;
Boys, \$3.00 a year.

The building is open from
9 a. m. to 10 p. m. every
week-day, and from 2.30
to 6 p. m. on Sunday.

Membership is open to all self-respecting men, without respect to class or creed.
